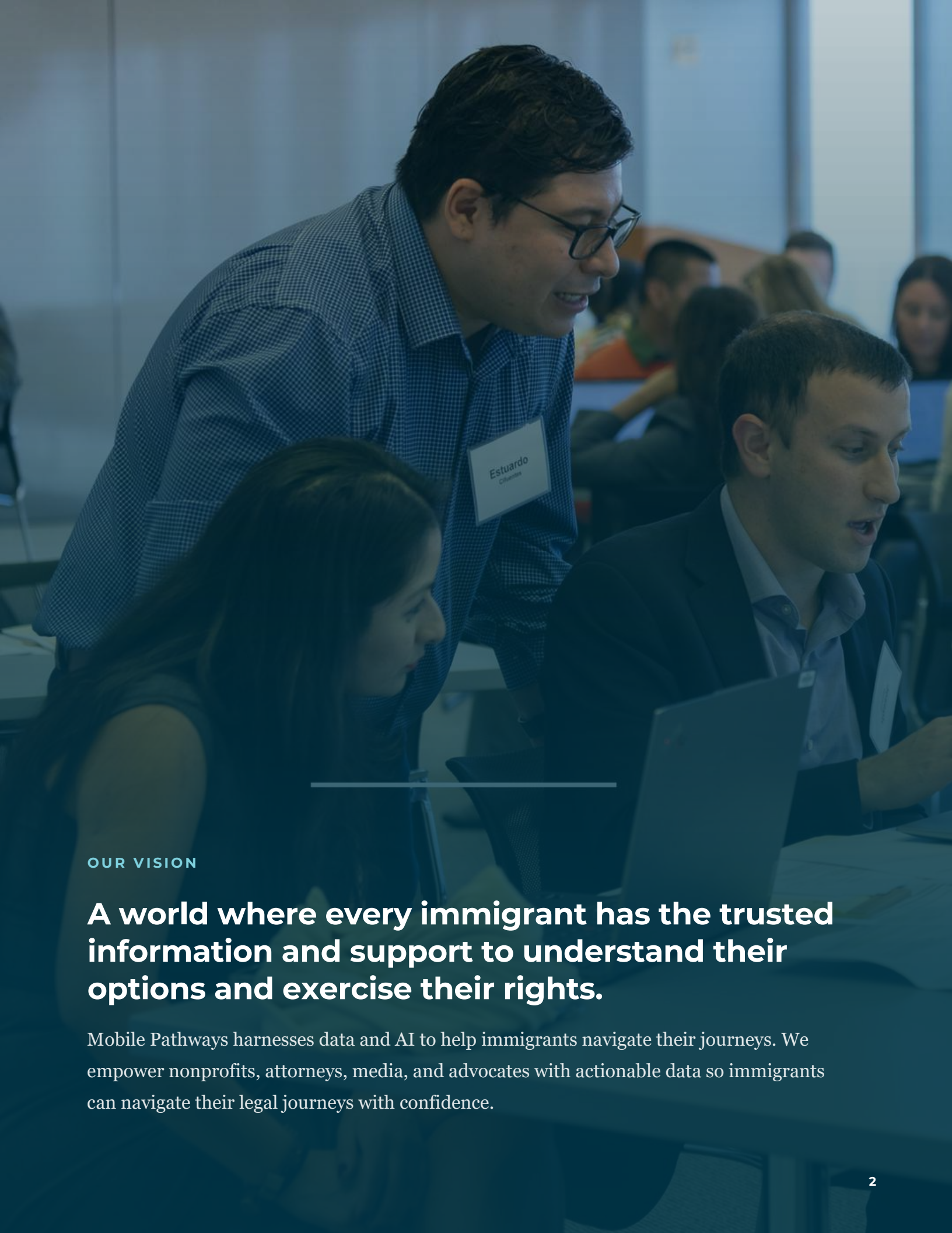

Pathfinder Goes Viral

Pathfinder quadrupled adoption in 2025, earning the trust of over 300 legal aid organizations nationwide while our data reached millions via mass media.

A Closer Look



Pathfinder uses the government-issued ID number assigned to every immigrant to give hundreds of attorneys and nonprofits instant access to case histories and court alerts. Its evergreen public dashboards keep legal aid workers, advocacy groups, media, and immigrants informed on what's happening in immigration law.

Pathfinder Growth



Demand is surging, with new organizations signing up weekly; many new to the complexities of immigration law and all needing the instant information that is vital and essential in today's turbulent immigration climate.

Delivering Results

When legal aid workers pair representation with Pathfinder, outcomes improve. Among represented immigrants whose advocates use the platform, missed hearings, removals, and denied asylum claims all fall below national averages.

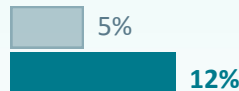
Case Outcomes Comparison

Educators Forging Immigrant Pathways



Issue: There are 339,723 active removal cases in the state of Texas; nearly 50% lack legal representation.

Solution: Legal clinics play a critical role in expanding access to justice by providing pro bono legal guidance, case support, and advocacy to immigrants who might otherwise face the immigration system without representation.

The Jim and Leah Finley Immigration Law Clinic at Texas Tech University School of Law gives students hands-on experience representing immigrants, under the supervision of Professor Daniel Caudillo, a former U.S. Immigration Judge. The clinic has partnered with Mobile Pathways to integrate Pathfinder into its practice, helping students and supervising attorneys quickly access case histories, track developments, and prepare more effectively for hearings.

As Mobile Pathways develops Pathfinder AIDE (Actionable Immigration Data for Everyone), a fully agentic AI platform for immigration research, the clinic will help demonstrate how technology can strengthen legal education and expand access to justice.



Survey Results

Listen To Those We Serve

Executive Summary

In March and April 2026, Mobile Pathways surveyed a pool of over 400 Pathfinder users, practitioners from nonprofits, private law firms, university clinics, and other legal service organizations to understand the platform's impact on immigration legal aid work. Sixty nine responded. We then paired the survey with in-person interviews and platform usage metrics. The survey was reviewed by the [Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab \(J-PAL\)](#). The resulting findings are consistent with our hypothesis that legal aid workers need instant access to case data, and they now guide the Pathfinder AIDE roadmap.

THE PROBLEM

Immigration legal service providers operate at or beyond capacity, facing resource constraints, staffing shortages, and the urgent needs of the individuals and families they serve. As detention increases, in absentia removal orders rise, and more families face separation, these workers need to see the patterns in how cases move through the courts so they can build the strategies that secure fair access to justice.

WHAT USERS REPORT

For legal practitioners, preparation time is everything. Respondents credit Pathfinder with reducing manual searches and administrative burden: 75% report understanding case history faster, 68% report spending less time searching for information, and 49% report saving time in overall case review. Respondents consistently described Pathfinder reports as intuitive and easy to navigate.

IMPACT METHODOLOGY

The metrics in this report combine survey responses, user engagement data, platform analytics, and partner feedback to assess reach and outcomes. We track indicators such as organizations served, cases supported, time saved, user satisfaction, and improvements in case preparation and management. While direct outcomes are not measurable, we use evidence-based assumptions grounded in user-reported experience and established legal service practice to infer broader effects on organizational capacity, representation, and access to justice.

Limitations. Survey findings are self-reported and drawn from active Pathfinder users, so they reflect the experience of adopters rather than the wider field. We do not yet hold baseline time measurements; time-savings figures are treated as reported, not independently verified. Page 8 states the inference each result supports.

Survey results analysis

Each result pairs the metric with what the survey measured and the inference the data supports, including where results fall short and what comes next.

Share of respondents rating 4 or 5 on a five-point scale when asked how likely they are to recommend Pathfinder to a colleague.

Near-universal willingness to recommend indicates strong perceived value among current users. Respondents are drawn from active users, which reflects satisfaction among adopters, not demand across the wider field.

Share of respondents who responded “True” when asked “I am able to understand a case faster” with access to Pathfinder case history reports.

Faster case comprehension is Pathfinder’s most consistently reported benefit. This finding aligns with the case history report being the most-used feature.

Share who selected “I spend less time searching for case information,” when compared to researching using government websites alone.

Two in three respondents report a lighter search burden. Among the rest, open-ended feedback points to a data gap: Pathfinder does not yet cover the full range of immigration legal situations. **Expanding data coverage is critical for success.**

Share who selected “I tend to save time when reviewing cases,” meaning end-to-end review, not just information gathering.

Reported time savings are concentrated at the consultation stage, when practitioners first gather and make sense of a case. **However, full case review depends on details of an immigrant’s legal situation that Pathfinder does not yet collect.** Time savings are emerging, not yet established.
