

# Step-by-step plan compression bandaging



## You have oedema and receive an indication for compression bandaging.

The General Practitioner explains what will happen after the bandaging treatment: you may return for a follow-up appointment, wait and see how your leg develops, or you may receive compression stockings.

## In consultation, the type of bandage and the frequency and duration of the bandaging are determined.

 By a Community Nurse



## You receive a Velcro compression wrap that you can adjust yourself.

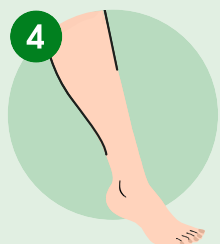
The community nurse will visit you to provide explanation and instructions.

## You receive a compression bandage.

The community nurse will visit periodically to replace the bandage.

 By a Community Nurse



## The oedema has resolved and your leg has reduced in size.



## Return for a follow-up appointment.

## Oedema is gone

If there are any changes, contact your GP.

 By a General Practitioner

## You receive compression stockings

Through a referral from your GP or community nurse.

 By a Compression Therapist
