MERA 2025 Re-Cap

After taking the Next Gen System live in October 2024, MERA continued to bring agencies onto the network and complete installation of Mobile radios and Consolettes for members. By January of 2025 we had declared beneficial use of the Next Gen System. In April we completed the implementation of IP connectivity for each fire station to allow for Fire Station Alerting to take place over the internet, reducing processing time and providing for more consistent ring downs from the ECC. In May the Next Gen System went through the first software upgrade as a part of System Upgrade Agreement (SUA). During the spring and summer, we focused on road repairs for Coyote Peak and OTA, post construction and our first winter along with the decommissioning of the Gen One Network, and sites that were not re-used in Next Gen took place resulting in over 74,000 lbs of materials being recycled or repurposed and adding \$8332.71 to the MERA Replacement Fund.

MERA, working with the Marin County Radio Shop, is now focused on updating programming of radios to fine tune user experience, coordinating Mutual Aid users and programming and working on overdue site maintenance to include weed abatement and shelter painting.
