Corporate Information

Name of Company: St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority (SVGPA) is responsible for the operation and administration of the Kingstown Deep Water Harbour, the nearby Campden Park Container Port (CPCP) and the Kingstown Cruise and Ferry Terminals.

Port Kingstown first began operations in September 1964 and is located in the capital city, Kingstown. The main quay is 900ft with additional 121ft of catwalk with a water dept alongside of 30ft. The Port handles both containerized and general cargo. The port also facilitates inter-island ferries and cruise ship services.

Campden Park Container Port is located just outside capital Kingstown, constructed in March 1993 at the Campden Park Industrial Estate. The Port is operated by the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority to Specifically handle containers.

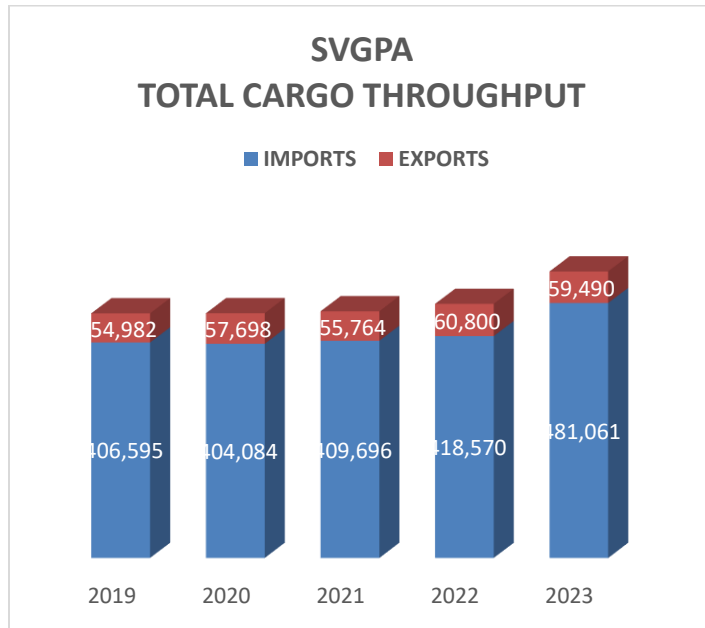

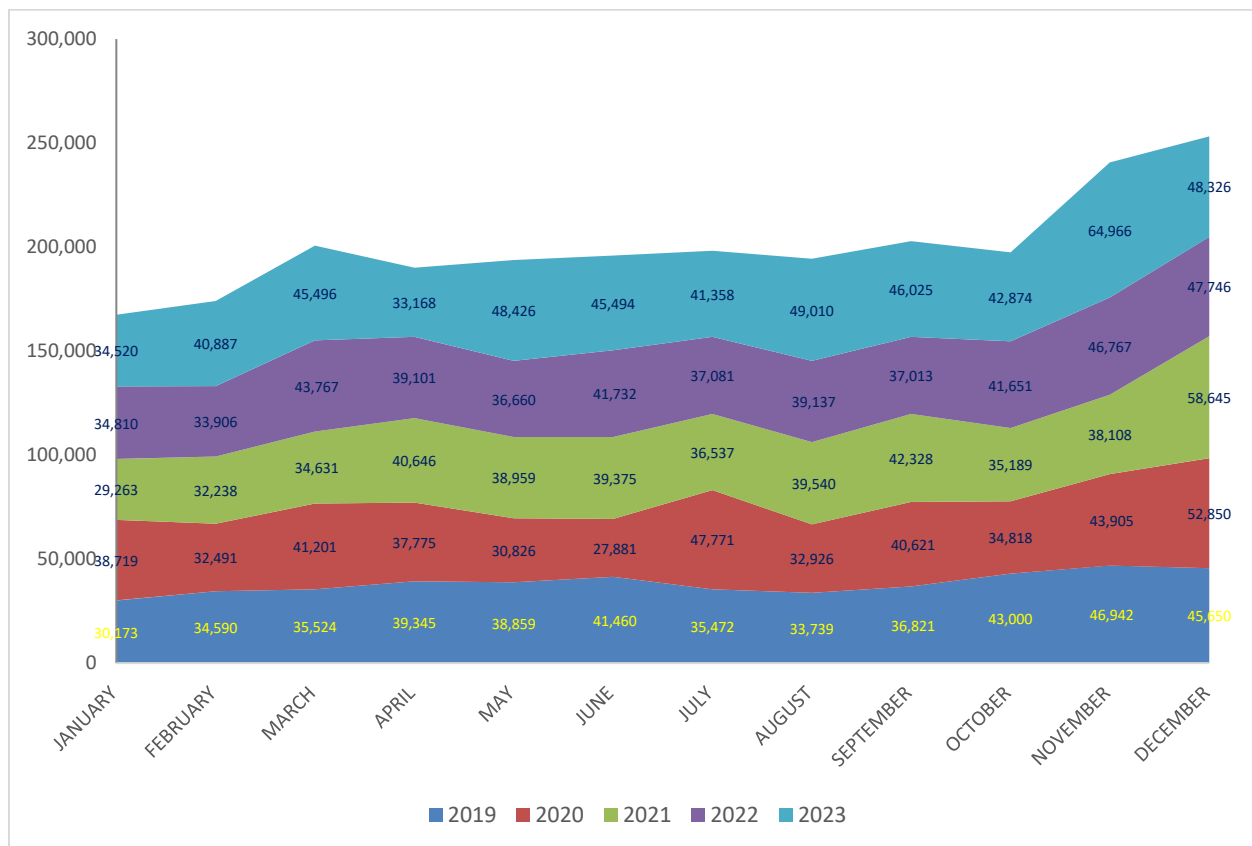
SVGPA TOTAL CARGO STATISTIC



TOTAL CARGO FLOW for 2023 amounted to 540,5510 tons; an increase of 12.8% or 61,1180 tons when compared to the 2022 data which amounted to 479,370 tons.

Marked gains were seen in imports which tallied to 481,061 tons. There was however a slight decrease in imports which recorded 59,490 tons. (Pages 1 to 5 Refer)

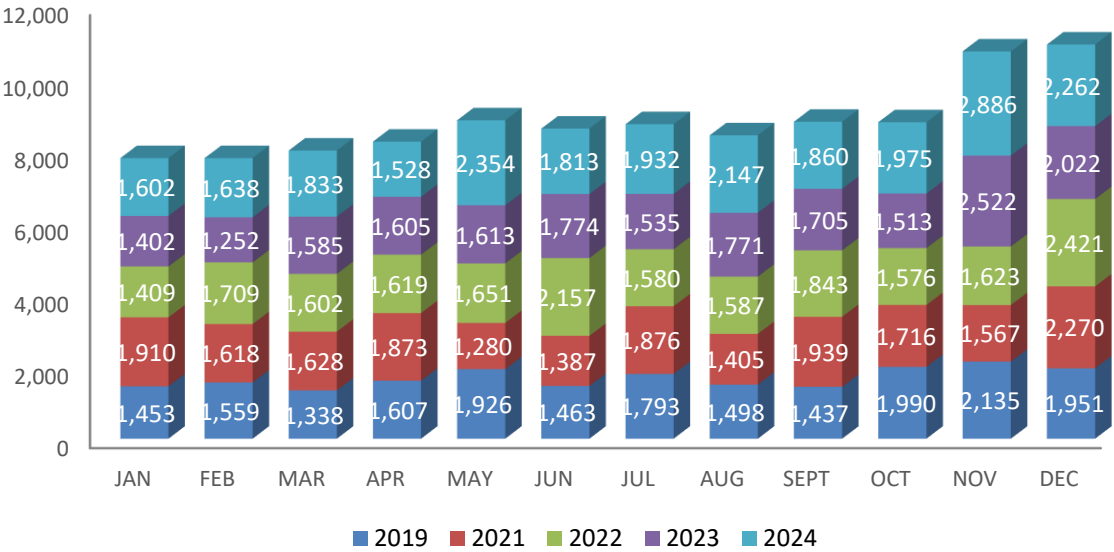

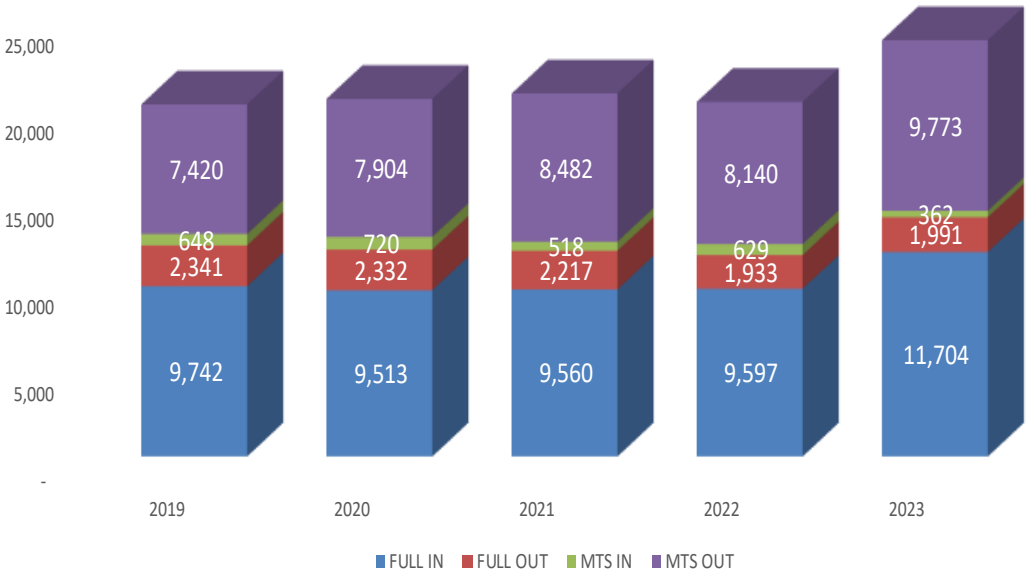

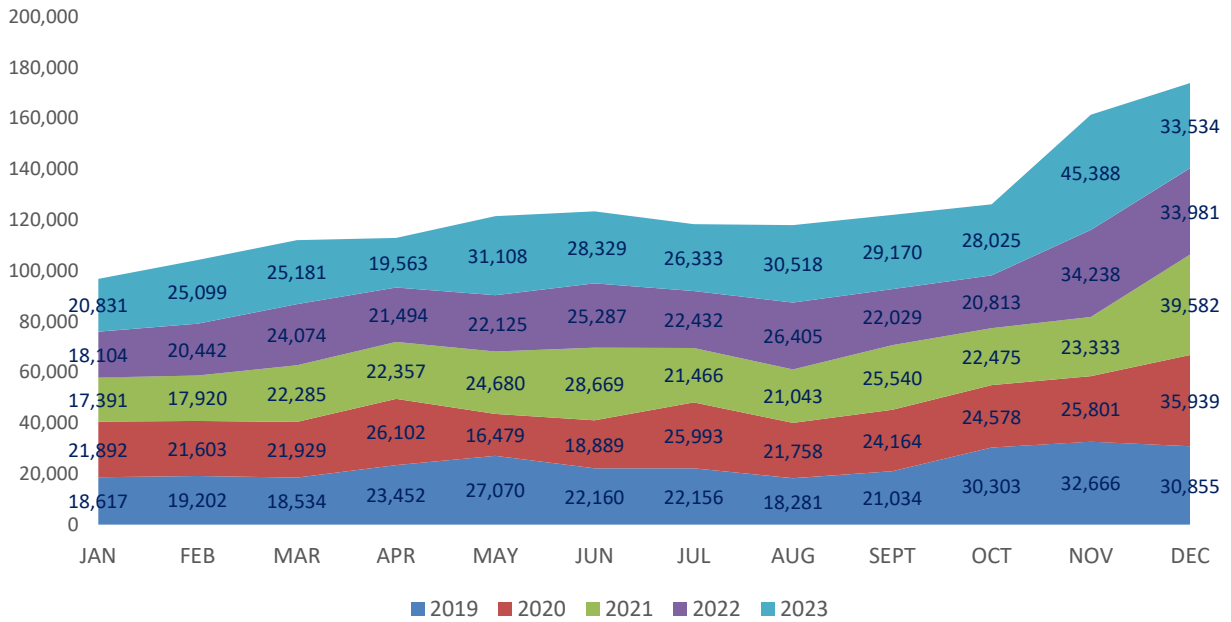
SVGPA MONTLY TEUS 2019-2023



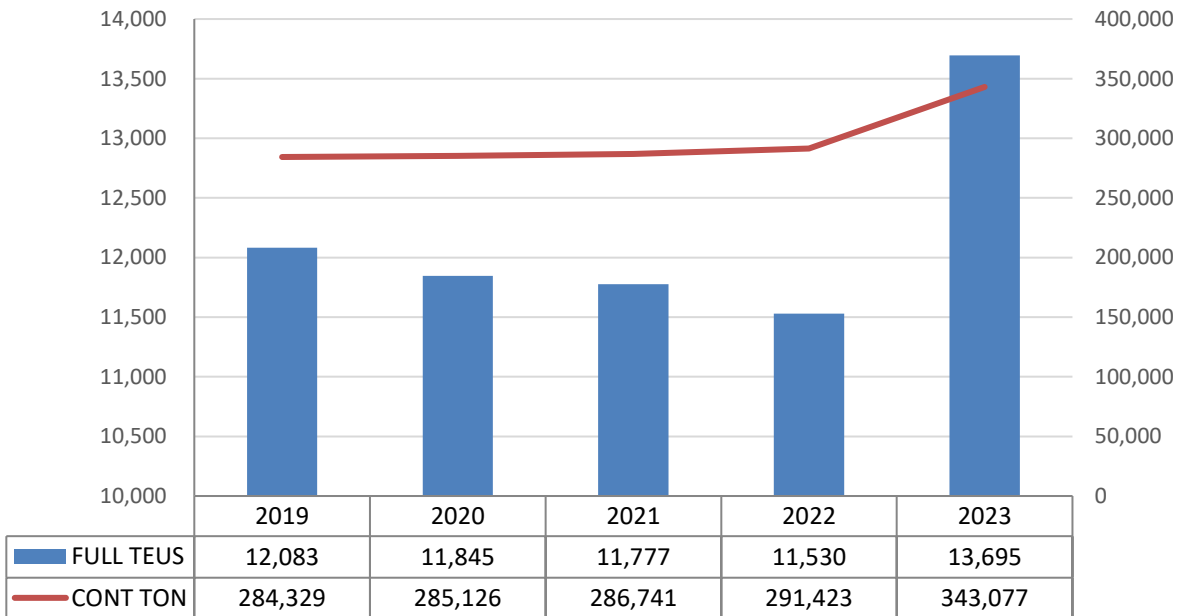
SVGPA TOTAL TEUS 2019-2023



SVGPA MONTHLY CONTAINER TONNAGE 2019-2023



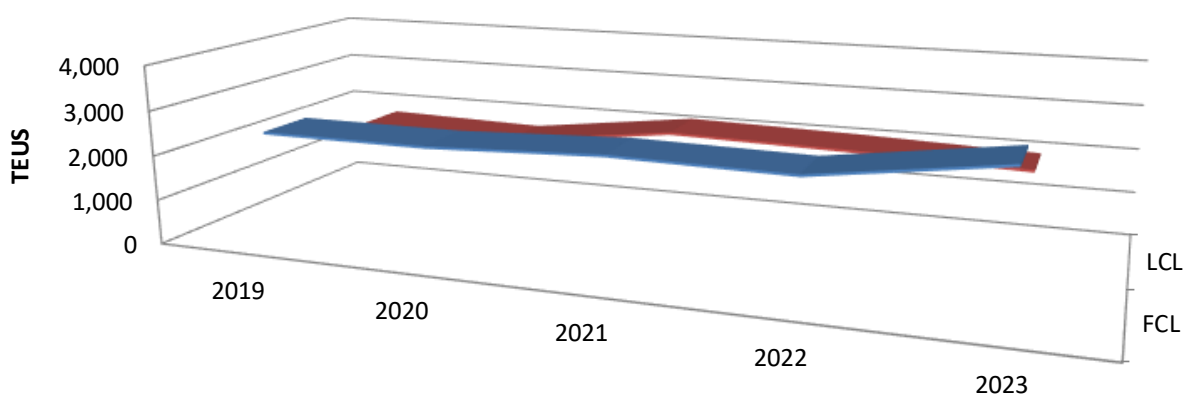
SVGPA FULL TEUS & CONTAINER TONNAGE 2019-2023

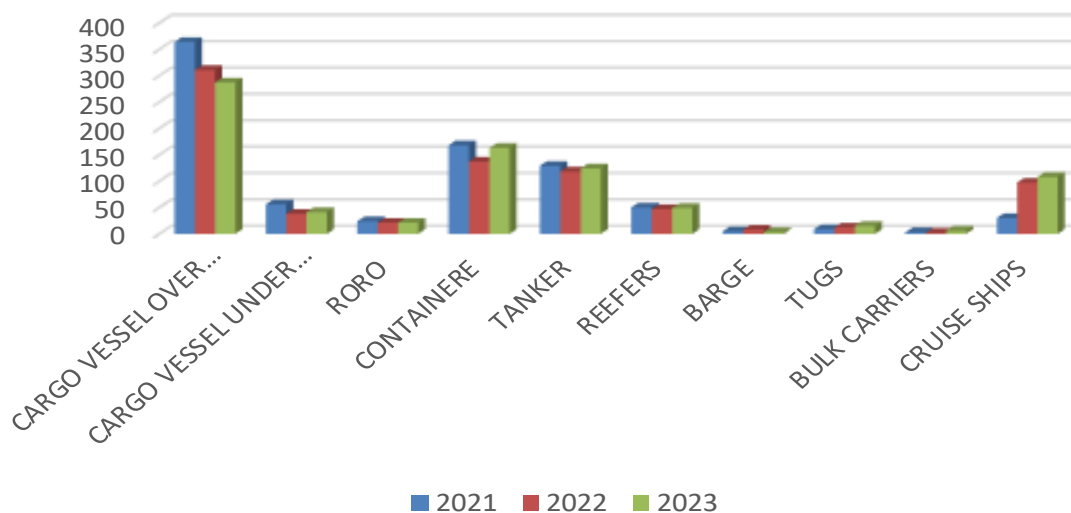

SVGPA VESSEL STATISTICS BY TYPE 2021-2023



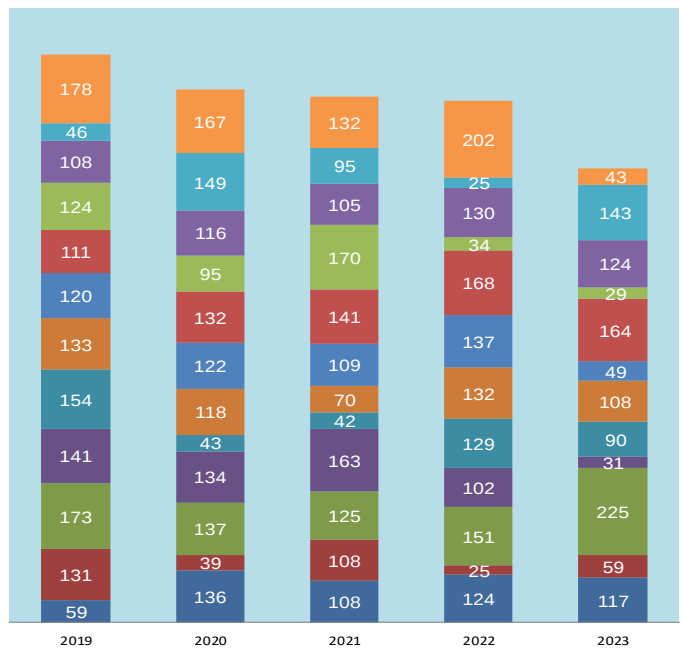

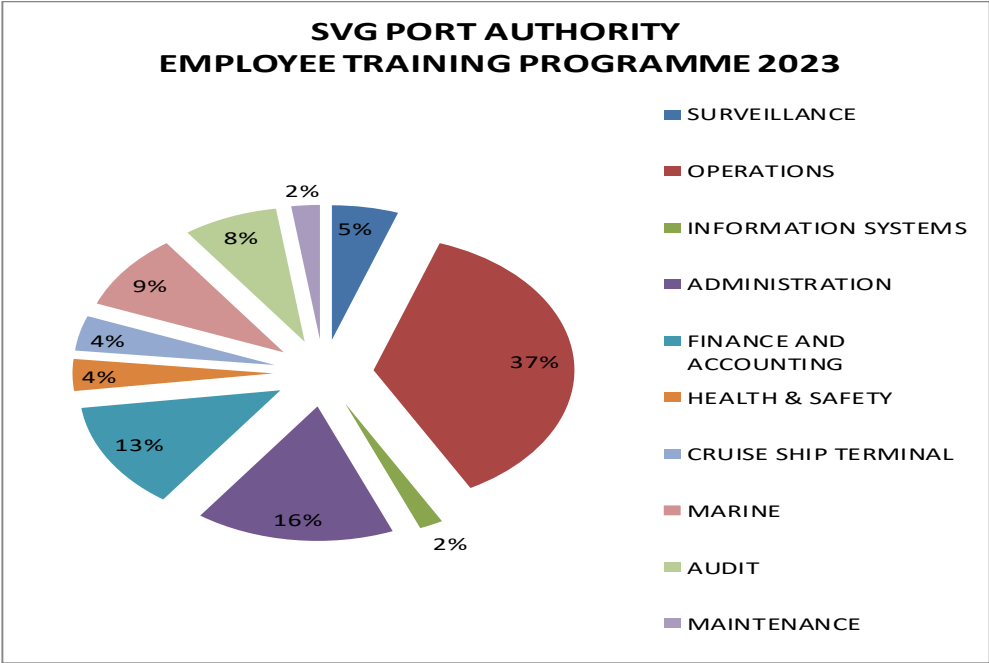

SVGPA BRINGS CHRISTMAS CHEER TO ORANGE HILL

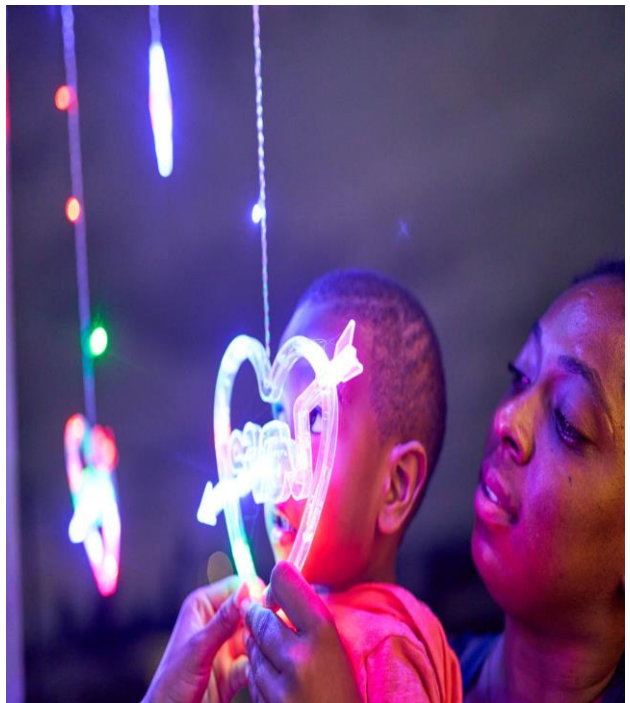
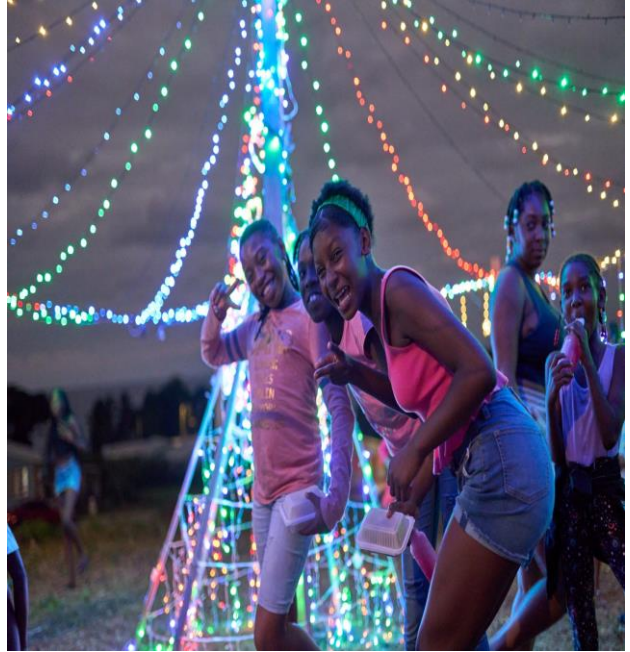
