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Corporate Information

Name of Company: St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority (SVGPA) is responsible for the operation and administration of the Kingstown Deep Water Harbour, the nearby Campden Park Container Port (CPCP) and the Kingstown Cruise and Ferry Terminals.

Port Kingstown first began operations in September 1964 and is located in the capital city, Kingstown. The main quay is 900ft with additional 121ft of catwalk with a water depth alongside of 30ft. The Port handles both containerized and general cargo. The port also facilitates inter-island ferries and cruise ship services.

Campden Park Container Port is located just outside capital Kingstown, constructed in March 1993 at the Campden Park Industrial Estate. The Port is operated by the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority to specifically handle containers.

FOREWORD

The Annual Statistical Publication of the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Port Authority presents comprehensive data on cargo operations at the nation's key maritime hubs - Kingstown and Campden Park. It also includes detailed insights into cruise vessel activity across the country. As a result of the damages sustained by Hurricane Beryl, as of July 2024, all local container traffic has been redirected and is now handled exclusively at the Campden Park facility. Meanwhile, bulk cargo operations continue to be primarily managed through the Kingstown Cargo Port, with additional support from the Kingstown Cruise Terminal.

Cruise activity has continued its trend of year-on-year growth, marked by an increase in vessel calls. The implementation of the Authority's Strategic Plan, launched in 2022, remains on track and has been instrumental in driving positive transformations in port operations and financial performance. The Port has also seen strengthened staff relations, expanded its corporate social responsibility efforts, and deepened engagement with key stakeholders.

Ongoing investments in staff training and professional development are delivering measurable benefits. Concurrently, the construction of the new port facility continues at a steady pace. This critical infrastructure project is expected to significantly improve operational efficiency, enhance safety standards, increase revenue capture, and support the country's broader sustainable development objectives.

This publication provides stakeholders with a detailed statistical summary of the Port's activities and an overview of key initiatives undertaken throughout 2024.

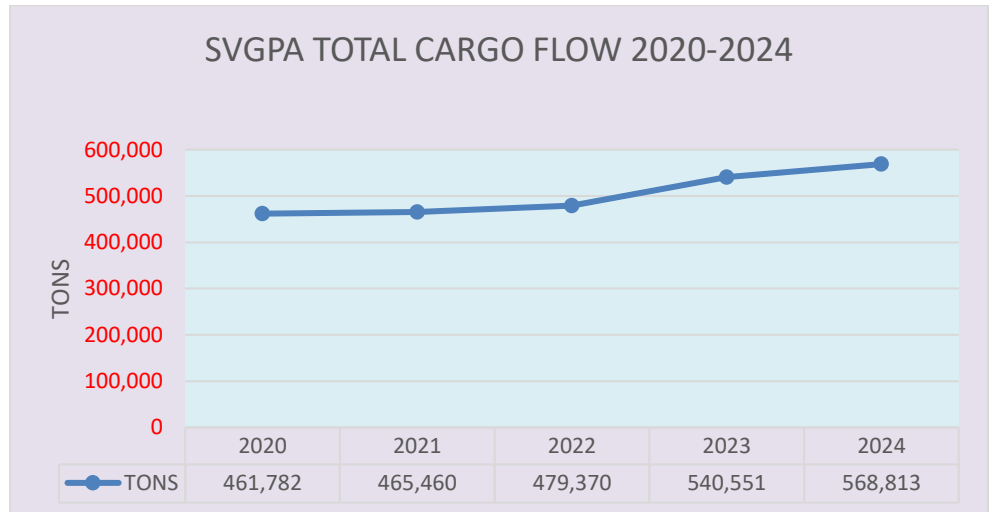

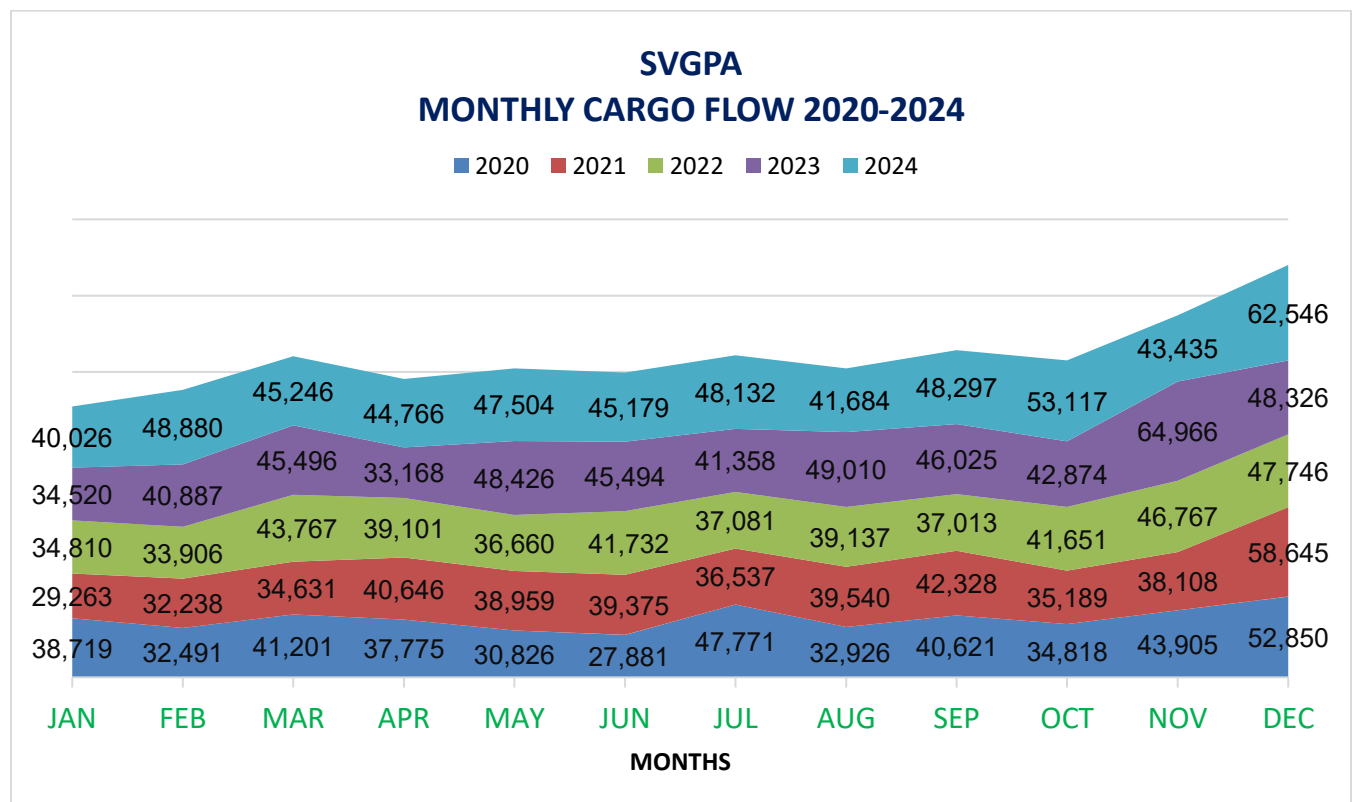

Regional Cargo flow amounted to 33,183 tons, an increase of 2,508 tons or 7.6% when compared to the 32,648 tons tallied in 2023.

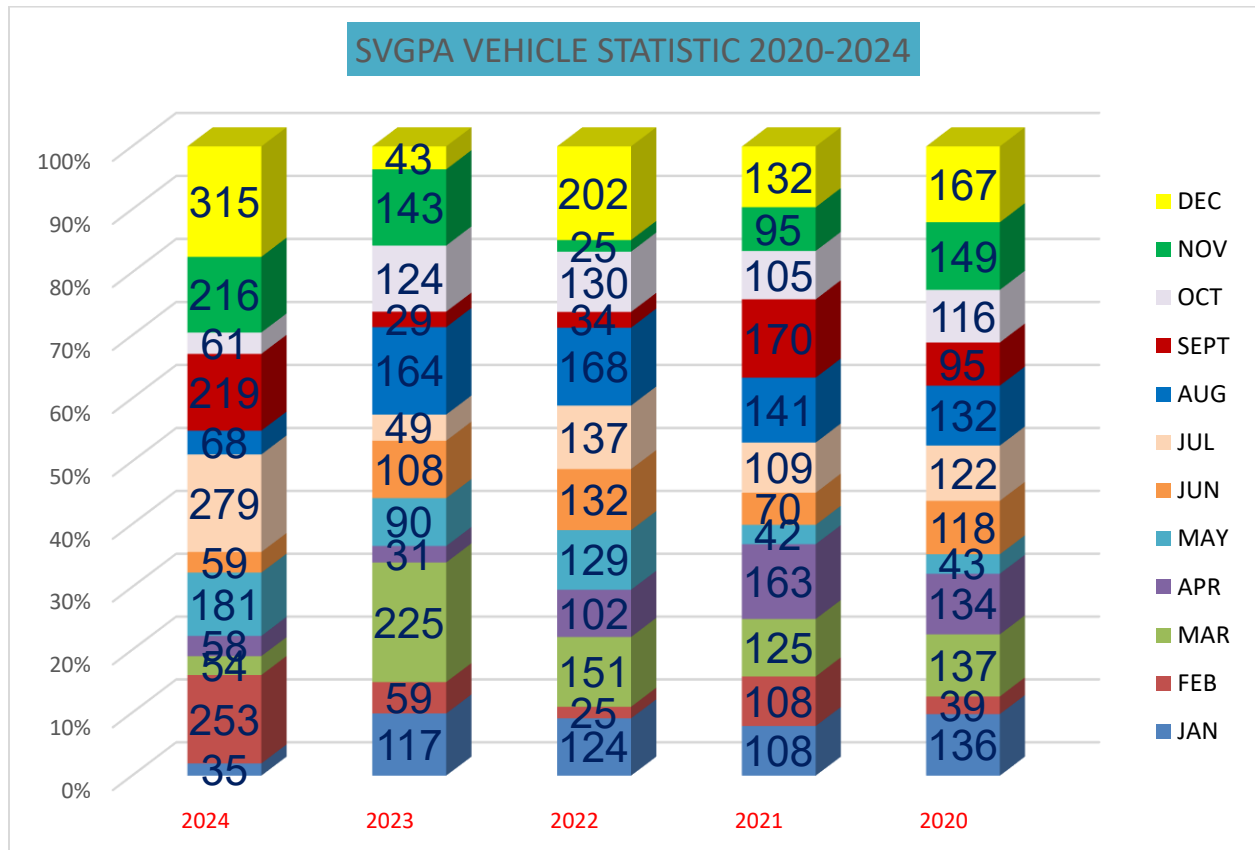

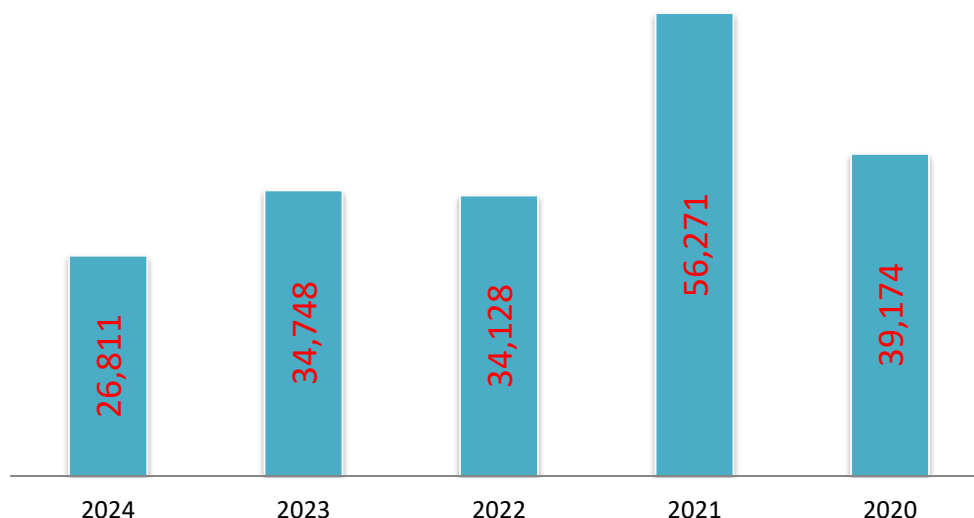

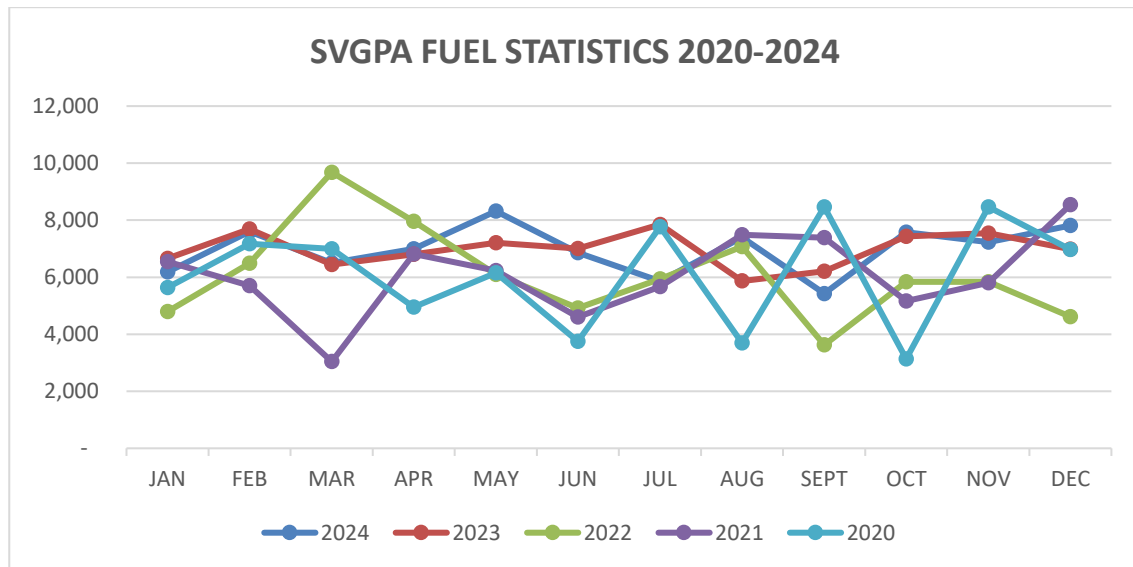
**SVG PORT AUTHORITY

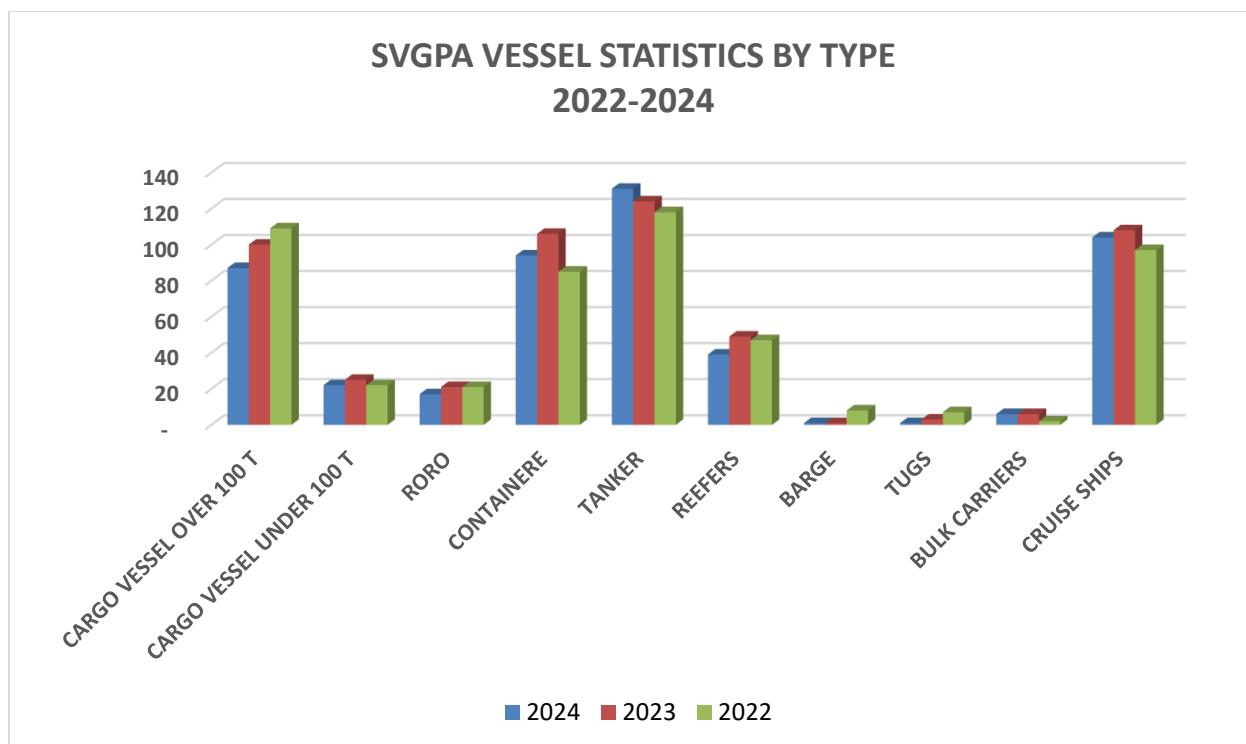

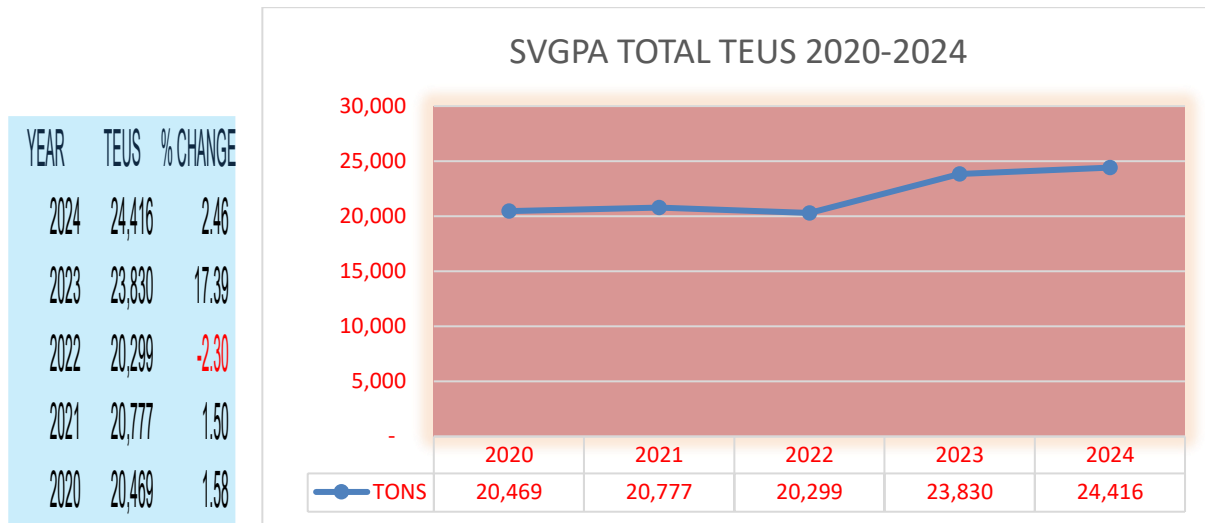

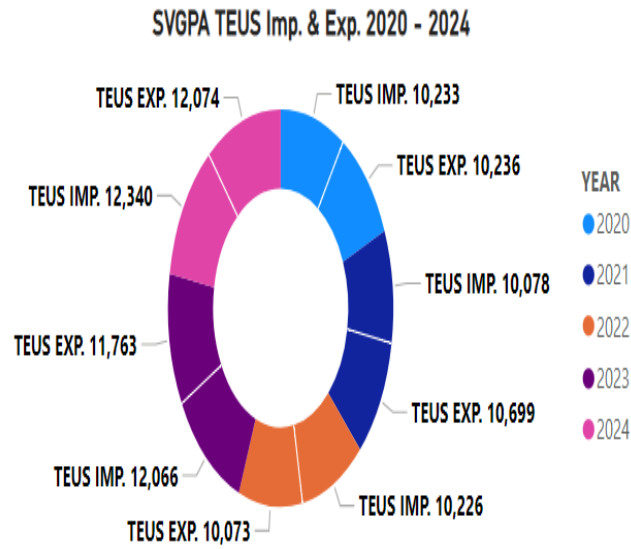

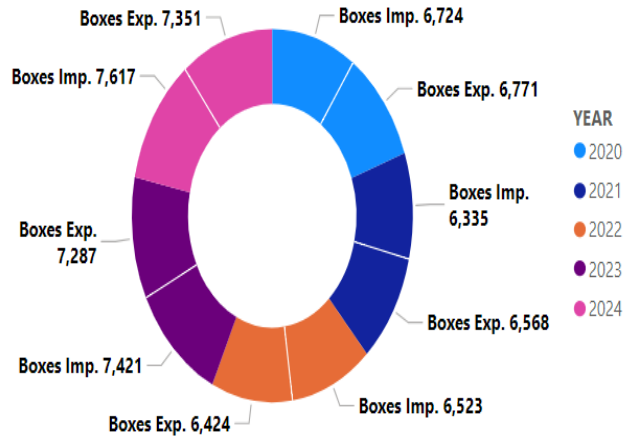

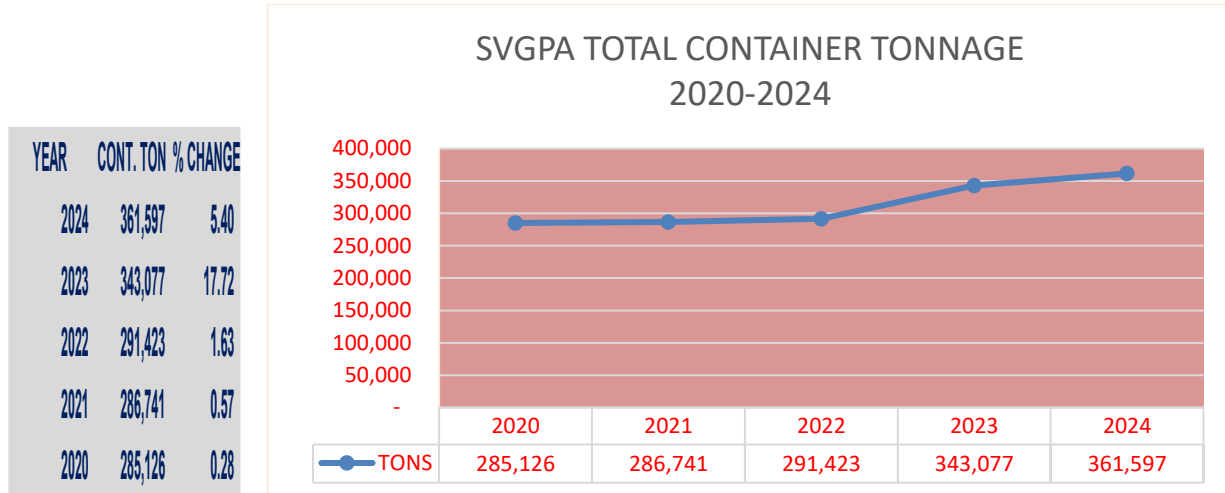

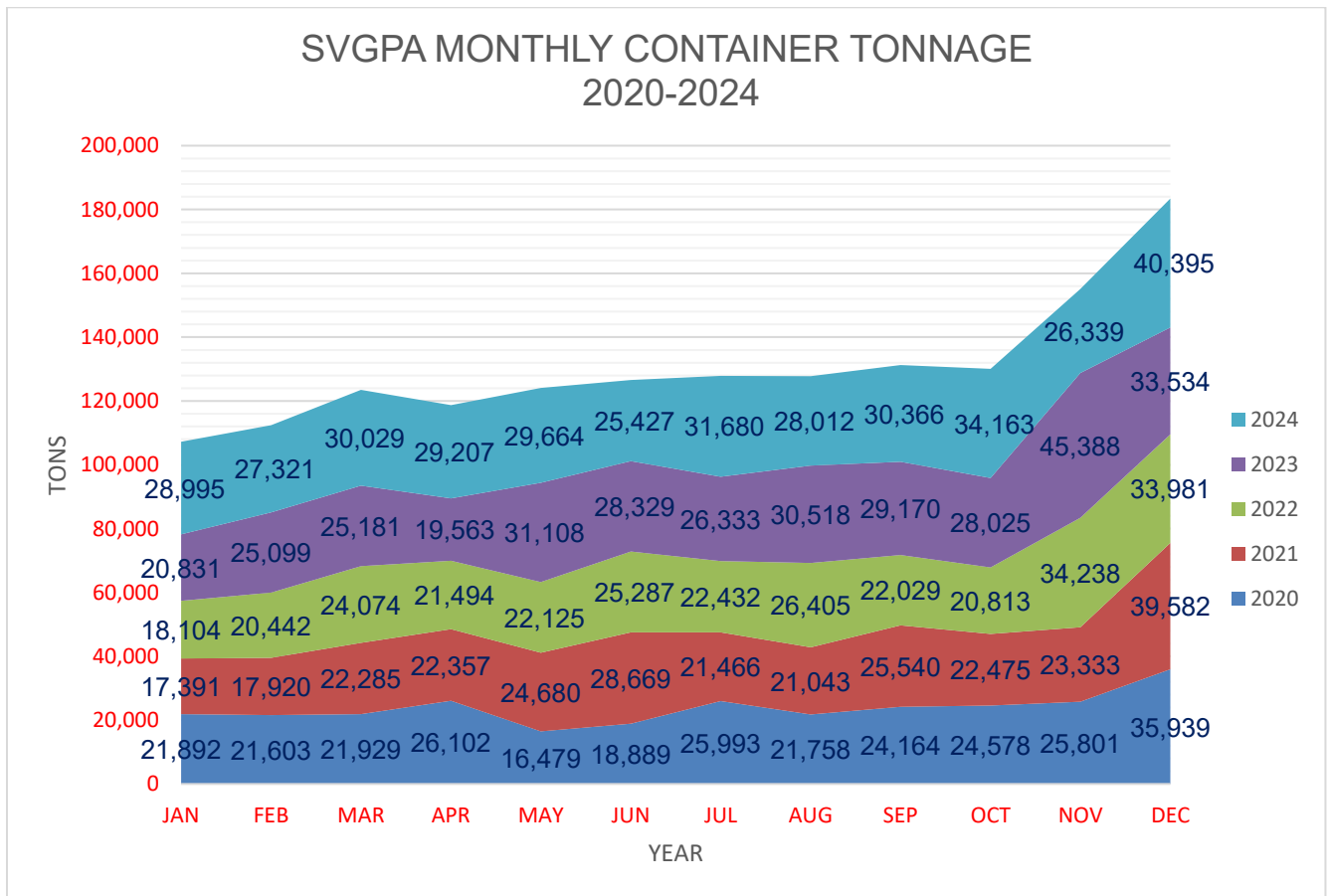

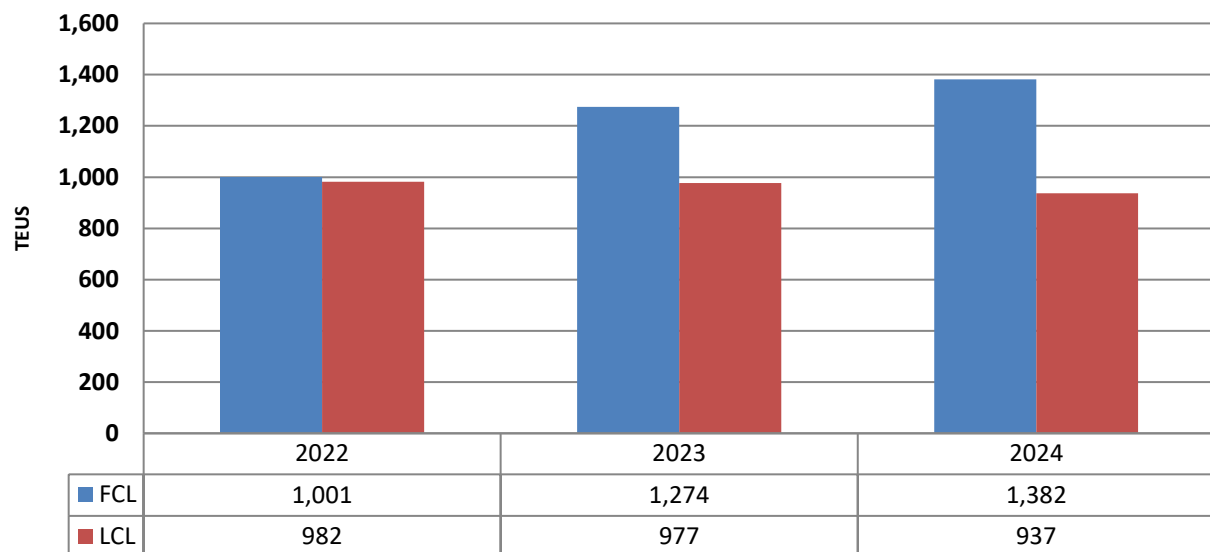
CONTAINER STATISTICS TONNAGE

The 2023-2024 Cruise Ship season recorded a total of 228,817 passengers from 233 cruise calls. A total of 93 calls and 194,255 passengers called at Kingstown while a total of 140 calls and 34,562 passengers made visits to the Grenadines Islands. There was an overall increase of cruise calls by 10% but a decline in passengers of 5%; when compared to the 2022-2023 Cruise Ship Season.

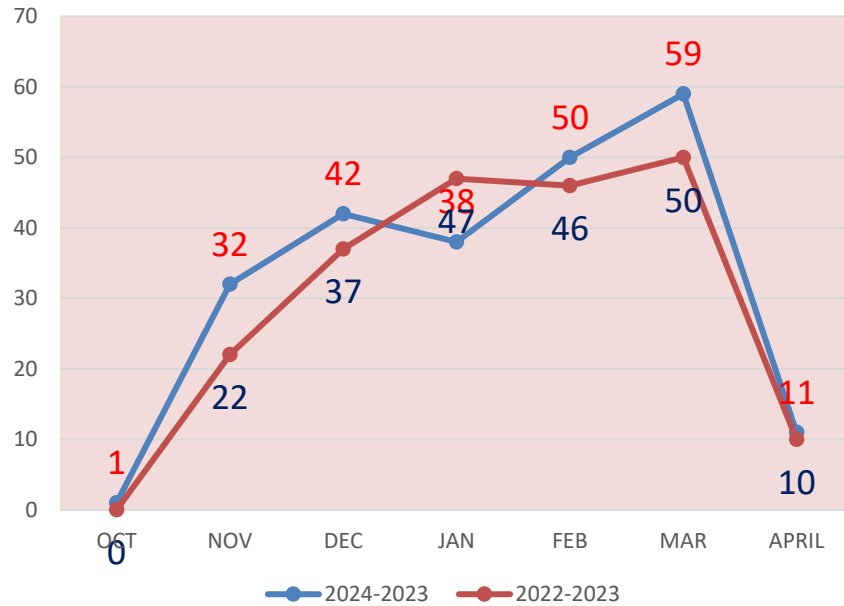

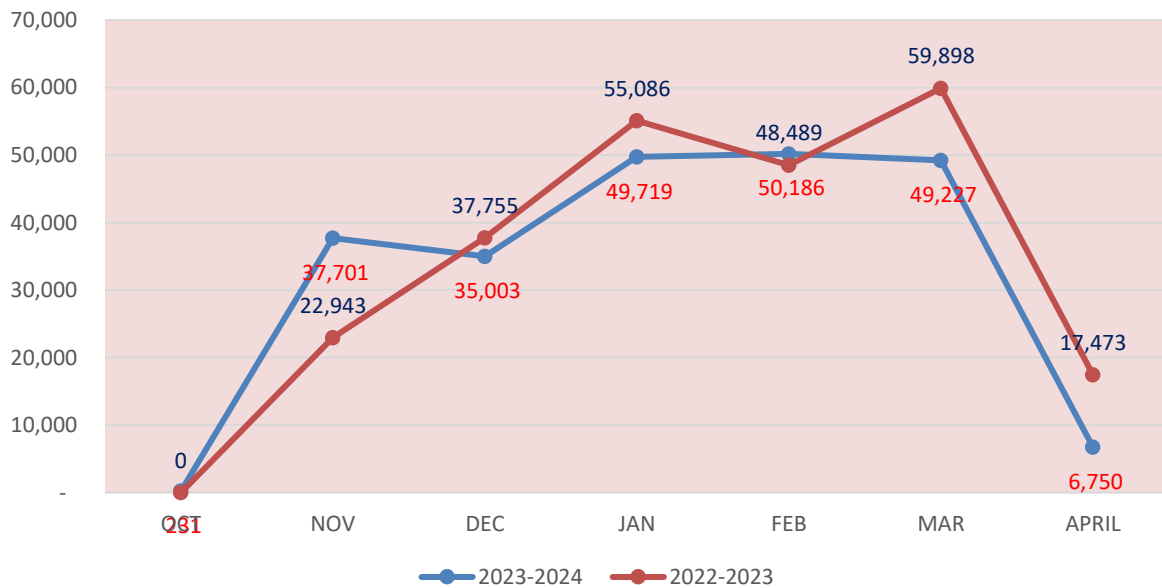

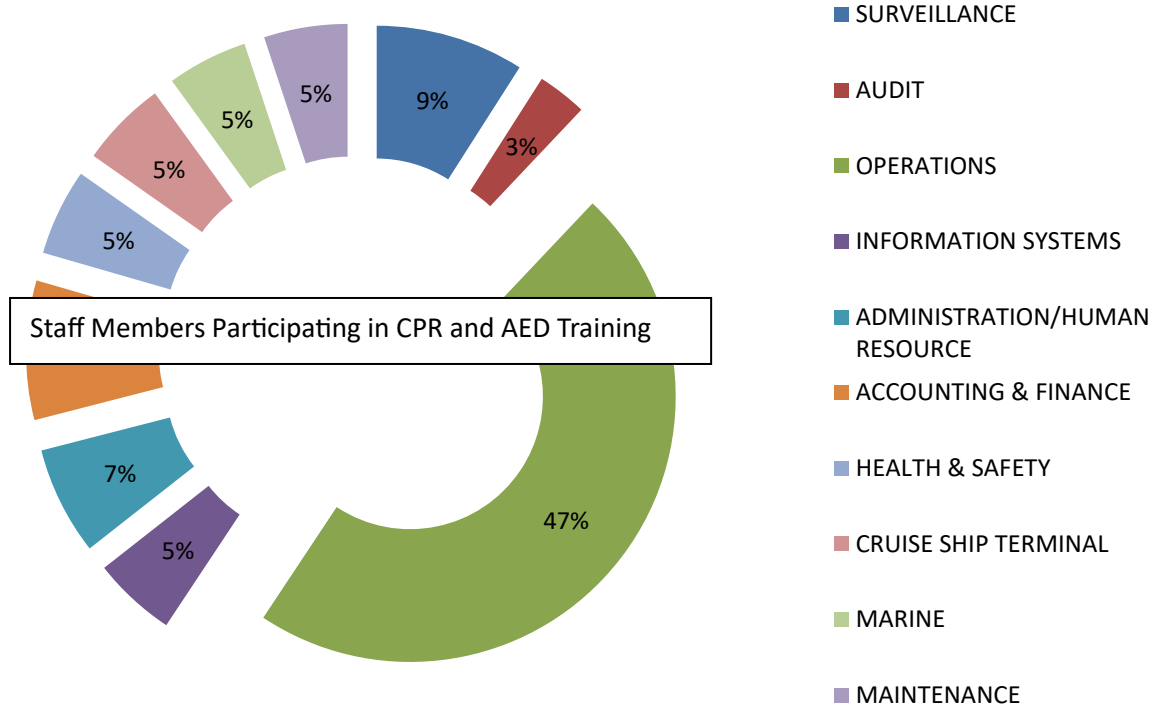
