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Corporate Information

Name of Company: Modern Port Operations Company

The Modern Port Operations Company (MPOC) is responsible for the operation and administration of the newly built modern port facility, the Kingstown Deep Water Harbour and the Kingstown Cruise and Ferry Terminals.

The new facility is in the capital Kingstown and was commissioned in October of 2025. It is now the heart of port operations with 100 percent of all containerized activity centralized at this point; the new facility also contains its head office and other support departments. The Kingstown harbor which started operations in September 1964 is still in operations and mainly handles general cargo; the port also facilitates inter-island ferries and cruise ship services.

FOREWORD

The Annual Statistical Publication of the **Modern Port Operations Company (MPOC)** provides a comprehensive overview of cargo, vessel and cruise activity across the principal maritime facilities of St. Vincent and the Grenadines for the year 2025.

Following the redirection of container traffic to the Campden Park facility in the aftermath of Hurricane Beryl, this operational arrangement remained in place throughout 2025. Bulk and general cargo activities continued to be handled primarily through the Kingstown Cargo Port, while the Kingstown Cruise Terminal remained central to the country's cruise operations.

The year 2025 recorded notable growth across several key areas of port activity. Vessel calls, container throughput and overall cargo volumes increased when compared with the previous year, while total cargo tonnage registered a strong double-digit increase. These results reflect the resilience of the country's maritime sector and the continued strength of trade activity moving through its ports.

The cruise sector also maintained positive momentum. During the 2024–2025 Cruise Ship Season, both vessel calls and passenger arrivals increased compared with the previous season, with particularly strong growth in passenger numbers. Increased cruise activity was recorded at Kingstown and across the Grenadines, highlighting the continued appeal of St. Vincent and the Grenadines as a multi-island cruise destination. The season was further marked by several inaugural calls, demonstrating growing interest and confidence in the destination among international cruise lines.

These achievements reflect the dedication and adaptability of MPOC's employees, together with the continued support and cooperation of shipping lines, agents, stakeholders and the wider community. Beyond its operational responsibilities, MPOC remains committed to responsible corporate citizenship through initiatives that support youth development, environmental sustainability and community advancement.

As MPOC builds on the legacy of the nation's maritime sector while embracing modern technologies, improved practices and evolving international standards, this publication serves as both a statistical record of port activity in 2025 and a reference point for future planning and development. The pages that follow present detailed statistics on cargo, vessel and cruise activity, providing valuable insight into the performance and development of the maritime sector during the year.

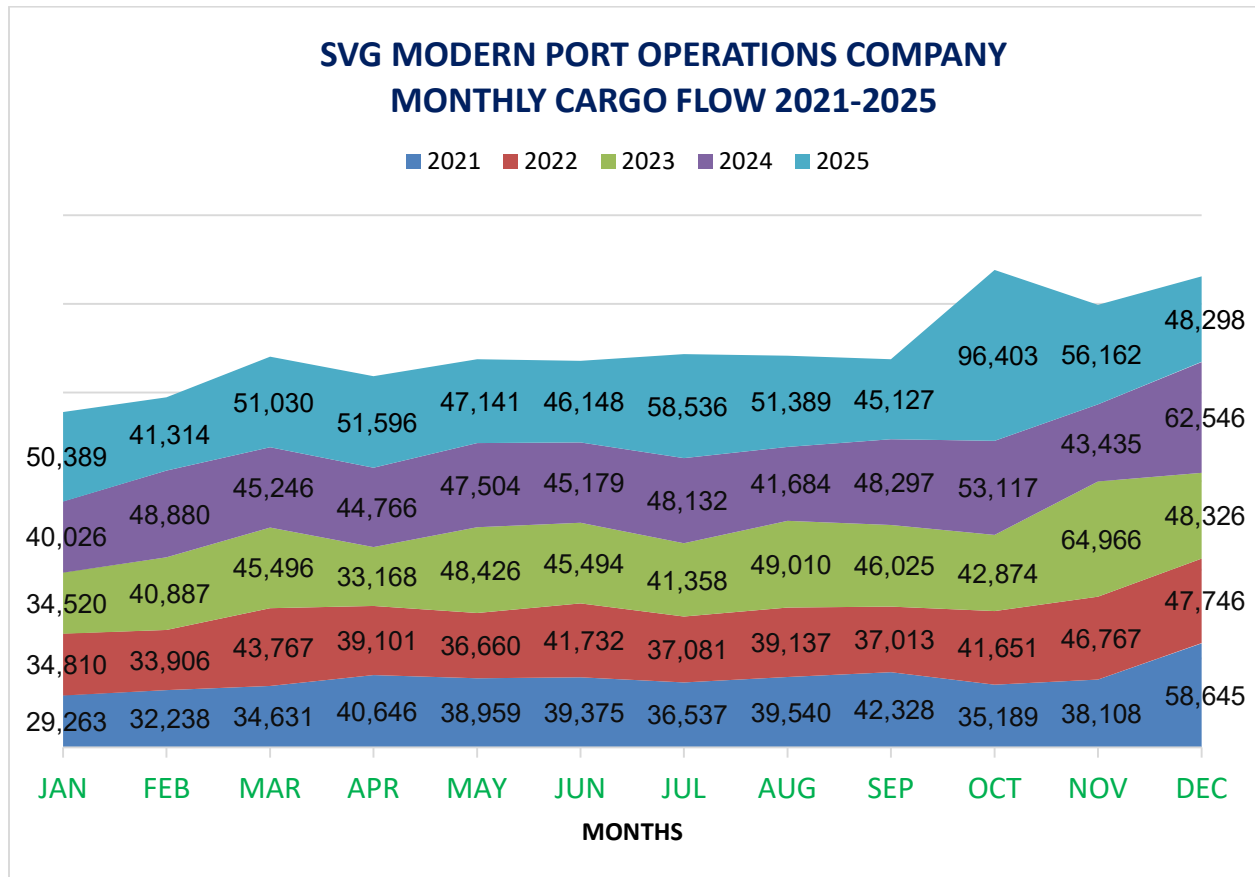
TOTAL CARGO STATISTIC

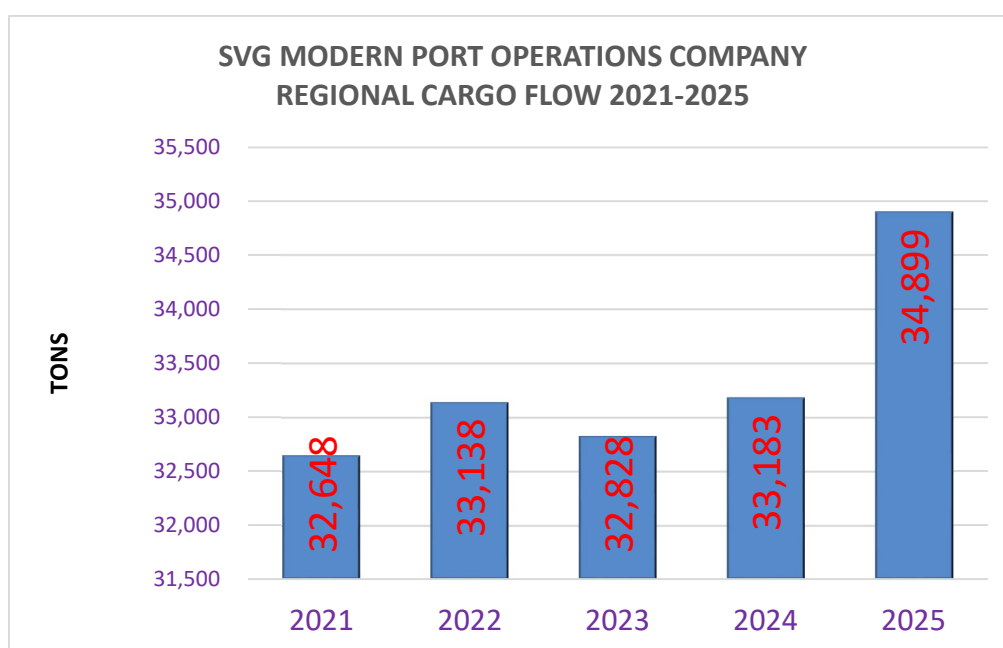

MONTHLY REGIONAL CARGO FLOW 2021-2025**

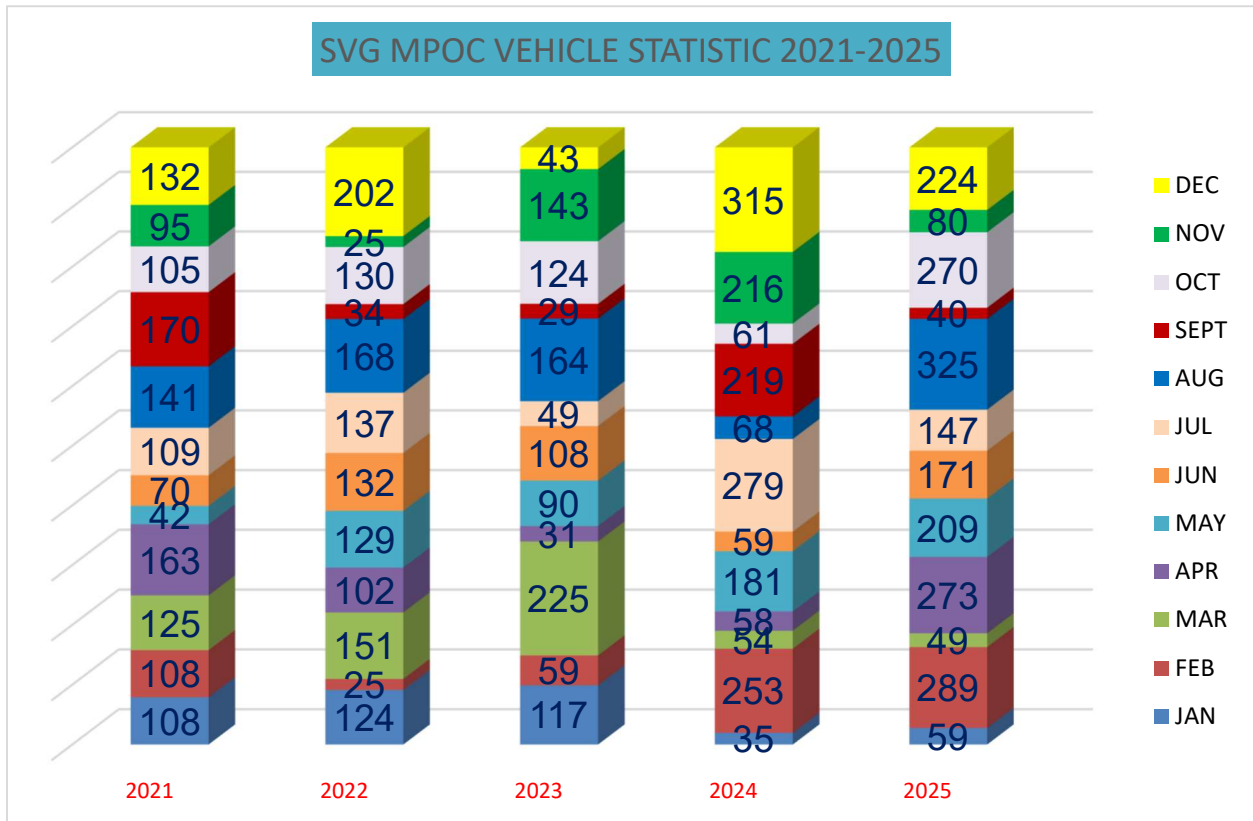

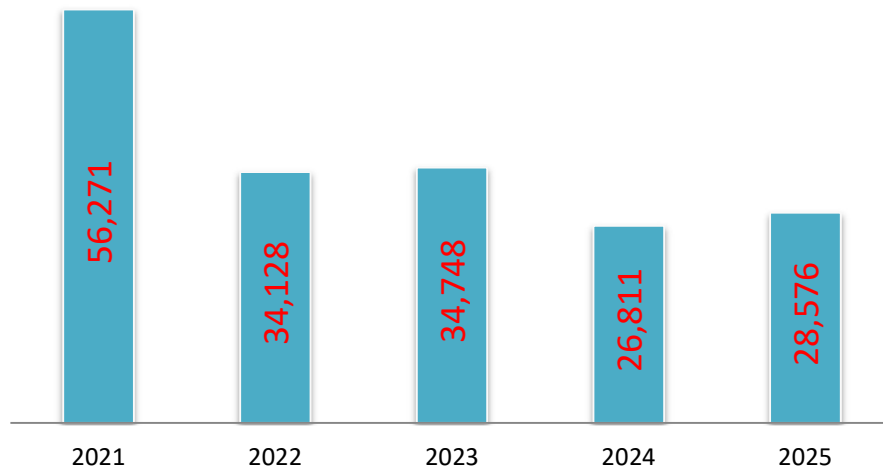
Vehicle units for 2020 amounted 1,388

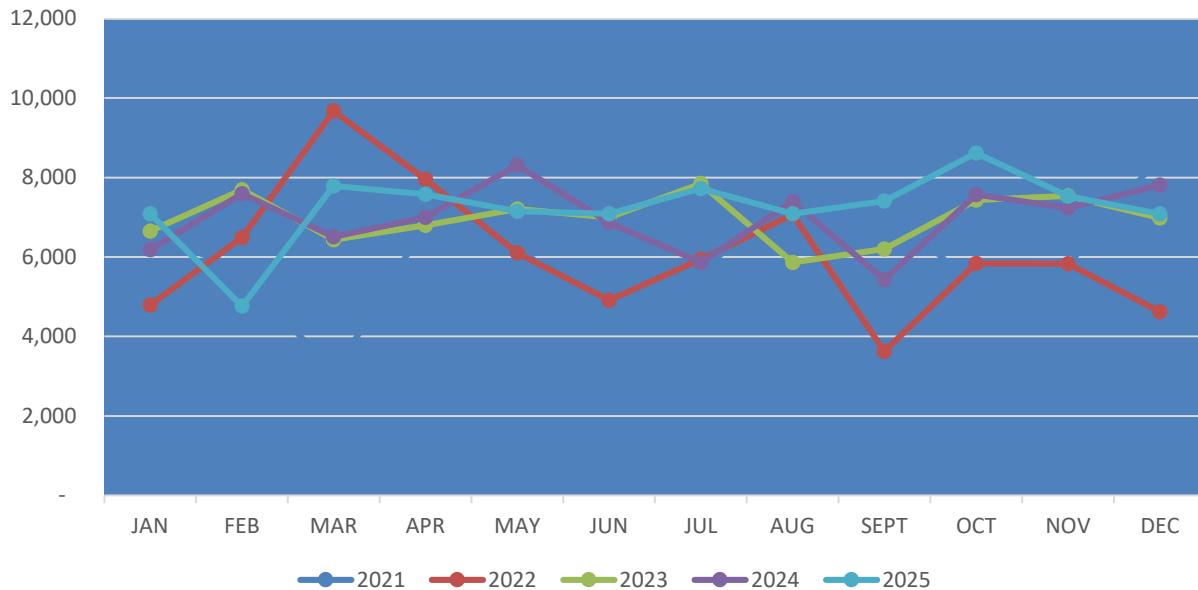
MPOC BARREL STATISTICS 2021-2025

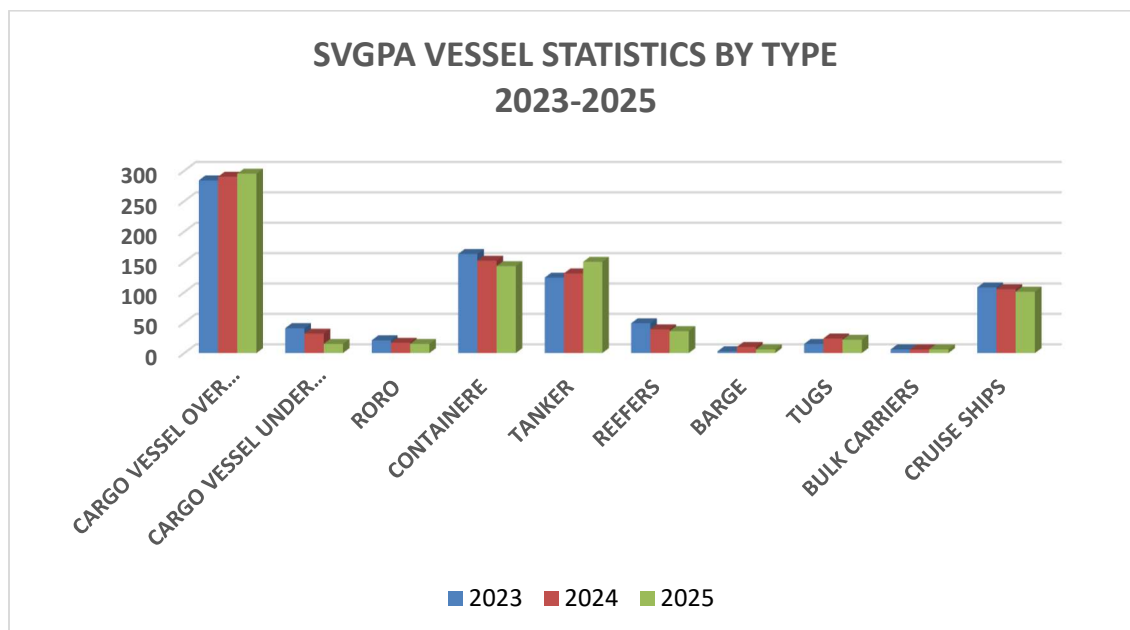

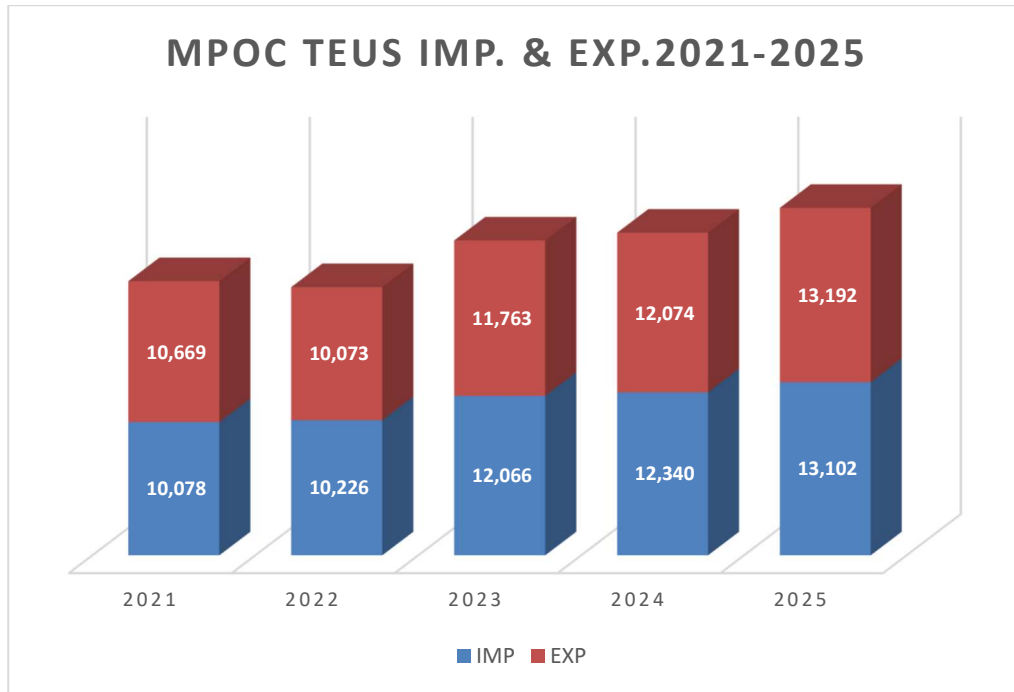

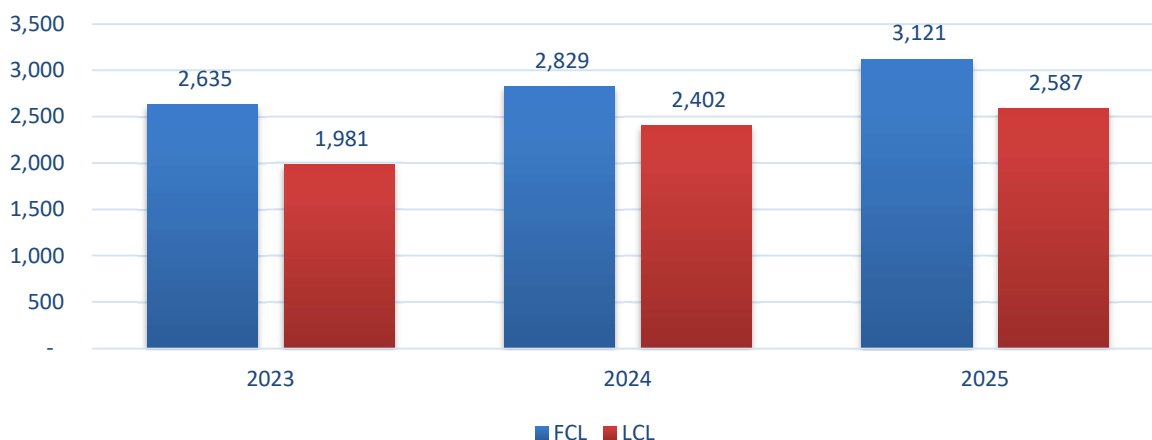

CRUISE SHIP STATISTICS

The 2024-2025 Cruise Ship season recorded a total of 249,112 passengers from 235 cruise calls. A total of 98 calls and 213,133 passengers called at Kingstown, while a total of 137 calls and 35,979 passengers made visits to the Grenadines Islands. There was an overall increase in cruise calls of 0.9% and an increase in passengers of 8.1%; when compared to the 2023-2024 Cruise Ship Season.

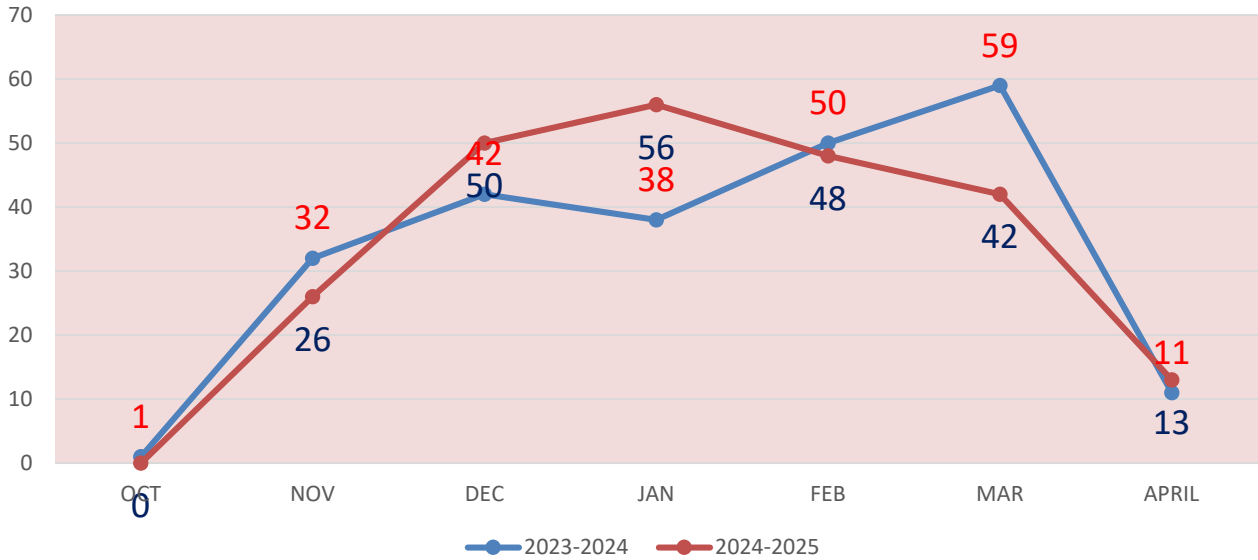

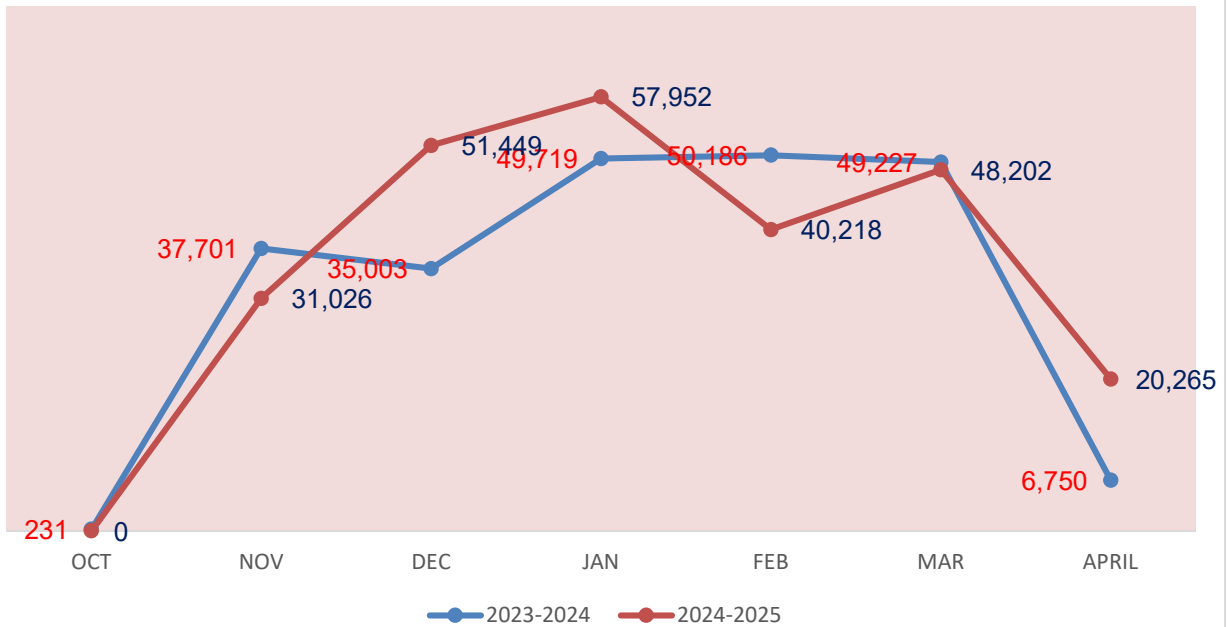

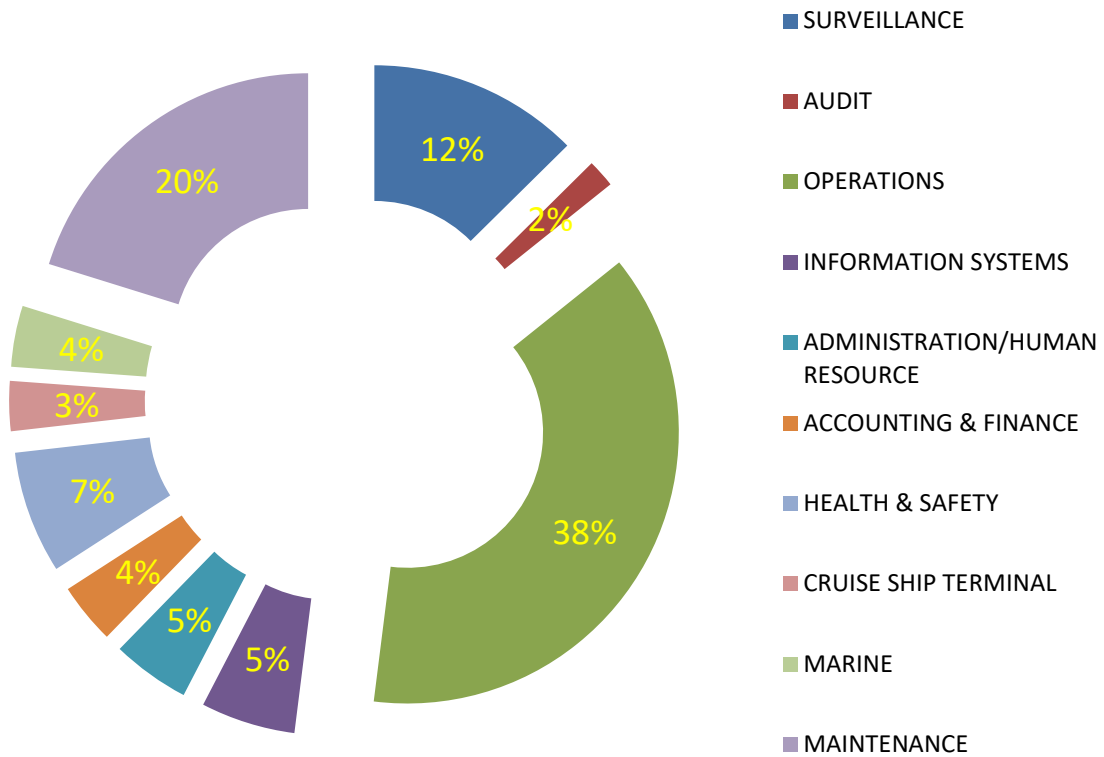
