The chief chorus, the principal chora event of the Eisteddfod, went to the Charters Towers competitive choir, with 179 points. Townsville being second with 178. and Cairns securing third position with 176.

Algy's prowess in recitation was demonstrated many years earlier as this clipping from the Courier Mail of 20 April 1927 attests.

Port Moresby Story from Ken Rossiter

I knew Eric from Wharf Street where we were in the Correspondence Department and Ian Entwistle (a cousin of Lou) worked at Adelaide Street, where I was a teller at the time of this trip.

It was extremely hot and humid and food expensive. Meat and milk were imported frozen and cost three to four times the prices paid in Brisbane. Notwithstanding this, the staff living at the quarters seemed quite happy with their lot.

Due to the sticky conditions they showered and changed clothes five times a day, which included the shower they had when they went home for lunch.

Native boys did their cooking, cleaning and laundry. When Spratty spilled his fountain pen ink on his shorts, the laundry boy scrubbed until there was no ink stain. The bad news however, was that there was a hole in its place.

On Monday morning many of the locals would draw out their entire savings in coins (not notes) and sit on the Bank's verandah, count it to make sure their money was intact, then promptly rebank it.

I was told that if I drove into a pedestrian wandering willy nilly across the road, I should not to stop to assist. If I did, "You'd run the risk of being hacked to pieces by irate bystanders", many of whom would be related to the injured party.

The bar at the Port Moresby Hotel was caged in from ceiling to counter by mild steel mesh, (normally used for reinforcing concrete) with a small opening to pay for and receive your drink; evidence of some wild brawls there.

The RSL Club was even more secure – a blank wall with a small door and shelf to obtain a beer from. The only thing visible of the barman was a pair of hands. On Saturday night beer was the drink of choice and there was a long queue to the hole in the wall. As soon as you obtained a glass of the amber fluid (a pint) you went straight back to the end of the queue.
