





Lead and Convene Meaningful Conversations in the Community







Frog Hollow Children's Centres are passionate and inspired by the Reggio Emilia approach and philosophy. We offer exciting and stimulating opportunities for children and their families to grow in an environment that values full participation, self-determination and a belief in the unlimited potential of the child. Frog Hollow provides both part-time and full-time care for children from Infant to School Age.

YOUTH

This year, our mighty team of 20+ youth workers engaged 676 youth across 13 programs and 5 locations. Our innovative youth services have been featured in the Globe and Mail, on CBC Radio, CityTV, University of British Columbia publications, and government publications.

Our Youth Programs are designed to inspire and equip young individuals with the skills they need to thrive. Through engaging activities and mentorship, we aim to foster leadership

The Youth Advisory Committee

Provides young people a forum to voice their needs and an opportunity to make a difference in their community. Projects vary from fundraising ideas to supporting social issues in the community.

Building a Safer Environment Program

Is a social engagement and community connection program that works to address bullying, harassment, and discrimination at Vancouver Technical Secondary School and in the Hastings-Sunrise community.



SETTLEMENT

Frog Hollow Settlement Programs provide settlement services for work permit holder, international post secondary student, permanent resident, convention refugee and protected person, refugee claimant, and Naturalized Citizen.

Sadly, in December 2024, IRCC informed us that the federal funding for our settlement services will be reduced by about 66%, or approximately \$1.1 million, as of April 1, 2025. This will result in the layoff of numerous settlement staff, including Arabic, Spanish, and Cantonese/Mandarin speaking settlement workers, youth settlement worker, and mental health support workers etc. We are able to retain a smaller team at reduced hours.

SUNRISE

Our location offers a comprehensiverange of settlement and integrationservices, including one-on-one supportand over 15 languages. Programs such asConnecting with Indigenous Peoples &Culture, Working Opportunities forWomen (WOW), Pathways to Leadership,the Multicultural Conversation Circle,English Comer, Yes Chef YouthEmployment, Youth Leadership Drop In,Community Connections, Informationand Orientation, and EmploymentWorkshops are designed to empowernewcomers, helping them adapt andthrive in their new environment.

With our expanded and renovated space (funded by IRCC since 2023), we can now accommodate more participants and host a greater variety of programs. The new Sunrise location features:

6 one-to-one meeting rooms

workshop classrooms

childminding rooms

Fully equipped kitchen

Our multi-functional program rooms are ideal for workshops, conferences, and events, each accommodating up to 30 participants. With these extended spaces, we can now serve over 50 participants at a time.

FAMILY

From April 2024 to March 2025, we provided 166 sessions over 337 hours in the 3-day drop-in program, La Colmena, the Spanish drop-in program, the parent-led Japanese program and the indigenous drop-in program.

From July to August, during our summer program, Frogs in the Park, with the support of 48 volunteers over 920 hours, we welcomed 80 unique adults/caregivers, 23 seniors, 9 youth and 112 children to join the fun at Clinton Park over six weeks.

We wrapped up the summer program with Harvest Festival, where we included 109 adults, 49 seniors, 19 youth, 79 children with the support of 50 volunteers over 244 hours.

In this fiscal year, we also offered 2 cycles of Nobody's Perfect program, supporting 16 adults, 7 seniors, and 14 children, with 37 meals and 141 food support throughout the 12 weeks.


In addition, we received extra funding to offer My Tween and Me, supporting 11 adults and 12 youth while providing 93 food support throughout the program.

In Family programs, we also offered special events such as Winter Celebration and Lunar New Year Celebration. In those events, we served 108 adults, 12 seniors, 18 youth, 107 children. In addition, we served 53 meals and 210 food support in those special events.

Frog Hollow Seniors Program is composed of a small & mighty staff team of 4, supported by 51 volunteers who generously contributed more than 1600 volunteer hours in 2025!

Collectively we supported more than 300 seniors and provided 3420 services to isolated seniors managing mobility challenges, food insecurity, and loneliness.
