<u>Individual Pupil Expenses</u> - Many thanks to all those who have paid the Individual Pupil Expenses for photocopying, texts, pupil insurance and art materials. If you did not get a link from Sharon for the payment or if you have a difficulty with this payment, please contact the office.

<u>Child Protection</u> - Our current Child Safeguarding Statement and Risk Assessment is on our school website here. I am the school's Designated Liaison Person (DLP) and Lorna Gerrard is our Deputy Designated Liaison Person (DDLP) for any child protection concerns. I will also be speaking to pupils at assembly about how we keep them safe. We also have a child friendly version of our Child Safeguarding Statement at reception. <u>Bí Cineálta (Be Kind) Anti-bullying</u> - I have already spoken to all pupils about our strategies to deal with bullying behaviour. There are child friendly posters in every room, as well as chat boxes in senior classes. Please find a copy of the child friendly policy attached. The steps pupils follow are: 1. Say no, 2. Sort it yourself, 3. Walk away 4. Tell'. I have also modelled the language to be used to help pupils to try to sort their own difficulties first but to immediately go to an adult if they do not work. Welcome, also, to new Parents' Association members and officers and a special word of thanks to departing members, including Chairperson Bridget Kerrigan, who worked so hard in the role and was a pleasure to work alongside.

Nasal Flu Vaccine - The nasal flu vaccine has been made available free of charge by the HSE for children between 2 and 17 years of age again this year. It will be administered by Nobber Medical Practice on Monday the 20th of October. Your child will bring home an information and consent form in hard copy this week. If you wish for your child to receive the vaccine, return the completed form by Wednesday the 15th of October. If you do not wish for your child to receive the vaccine, do not return the form.

<u>School Closures</u> - We have a number of school closures this year for various reasons. I am conscious of child-minding difficulties for parents and have communicated closure days as early as possible as a result. We have also been informed that we will have no electricity on Tuesday the 7th of October. Rather than closing on that day, we will remain open with contingencies in place to keep things as normal as possible.

<u>Swimming Lessons</u> - Lessons resume for all classes from 1st to 6th this year between Hallowe'en and Christmas. We will be sending letters home with more information and the link for payment before the Hallowe'en break.
