Register for free MARAM – Adults Using Family Violence Training

The Family Violence Multi-Agency Risk Assessment and Management Framework (MARAM) supports professionals across the service system to better understand their responsibilities to undertake risk assessment and management, including information sharing and working collaboratively.

The training is free and helps build skills and knowledge on how to identify and manage risks when working with adults using family violence.

Sessions are available now until June 2025

Who needs to complete this training?

Professionals who work directly with individuals and families that may be experiencing or using family violence within MARAM 'prescribed' organisations.

Identification

- 1 day training for professionals who may come in contact with family violence victim survivors or adults using family violence while providing universal services.

Safe and Equal training registration or No to Violence training registration

Intermediate

1.5 day training for professionals who may have contact with people experiencing or using family violence in their work, however responding to family violence is not their core role or function No to Violence training registration

Comprehensive

2 day training for professionals whose core role is to respond to people experiencing or using family violence.)



Are you a woman looking for a leadership opportunity?


Become a Peer Educator and help stop family violence in Mitchell Shire.

Northern Community Legal Centre, in partnership with Mitchell Shire Council, is looking for women from diverse cultural backgrounds who live in Mitchell Shire to join our inno family violence peer education project, Take the First Step, which develops innovative ways to reach isolated women in the community who need support.

WHAT WOULD I BE DOING?

Participants will attend training sessions to learn about the signs and effects of family violence and how to help someone experiencing family violence. They will also design and distribute messaging to the community, and participate in awareness-raising events and activities. Meetings will run for two hours, once a month. Participants will receive a \$25 gratuity voucher for each in-person session they attend.
