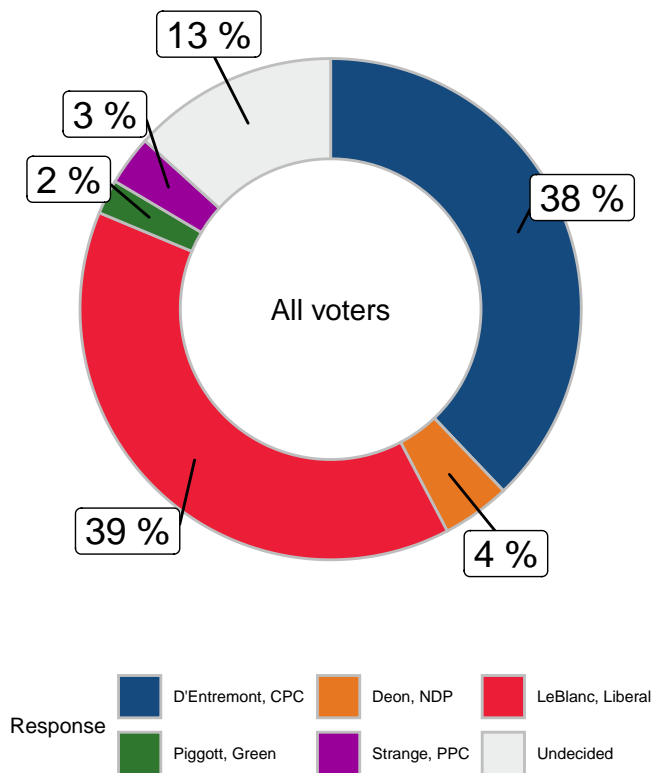
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Saturday, April 19th to Sunday, April 20th, 2025, among a sample of 464 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Acadie—Annapolis. The survey was conducted using smart IVR. Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Acadie—Annapolis.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 4.5% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample. Totals may not add up 100% due to rounding.
