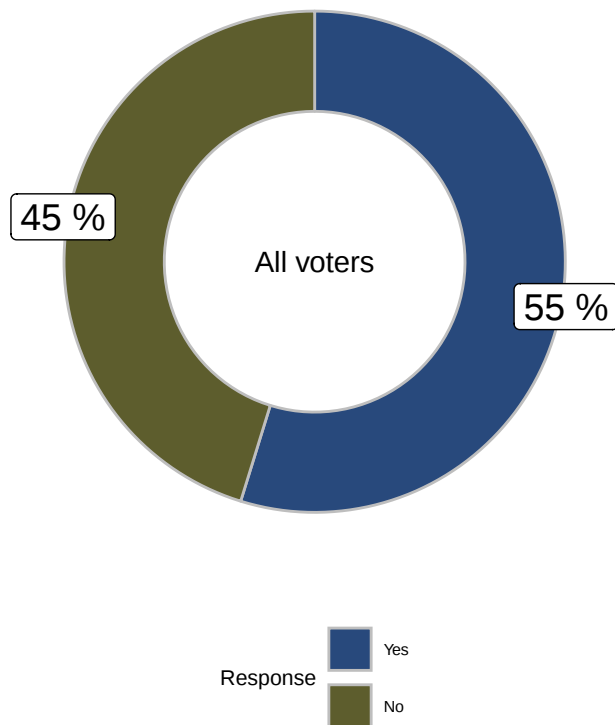
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Friday, November 7th to Saturday, November 8th, 2025, among a sample of 626 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Ridings of Floor Crossers. The survey was conducted using smart IVR. Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Ridings of Floor Crossers.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3.9% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample. Totals may not add up 100% due to rounding.

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First, are you aware that your Member of Parliament either has already decided or is rumoured to consider joining the Liberal Government? (All voters)



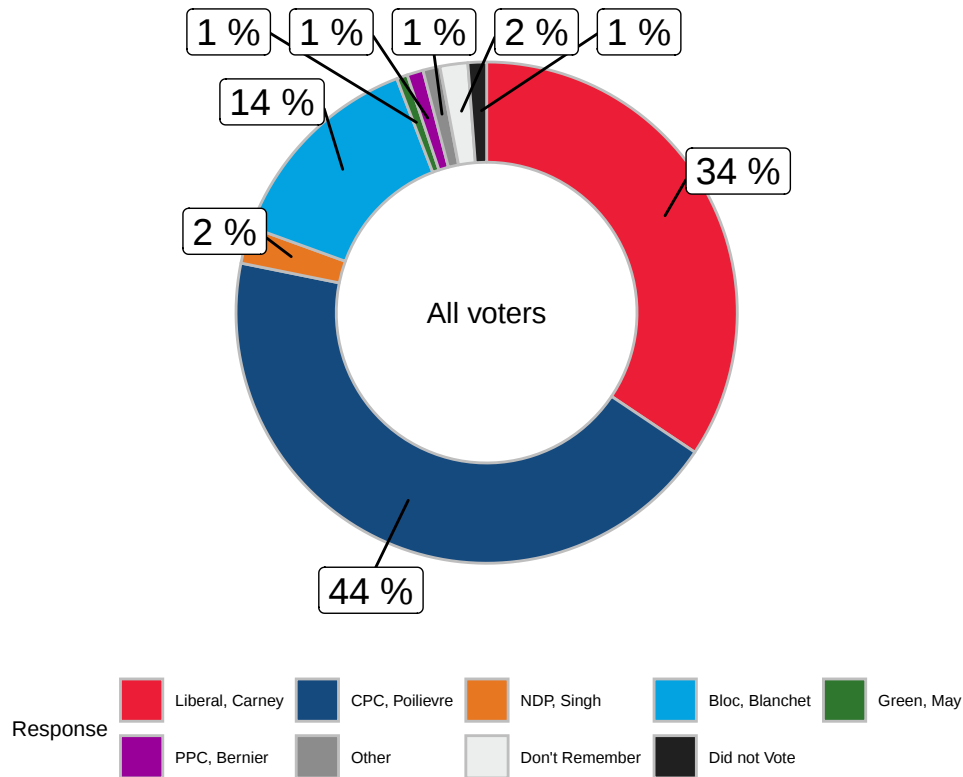

How did you vote in the last Federal election that took place in April of 2025? (All voters)



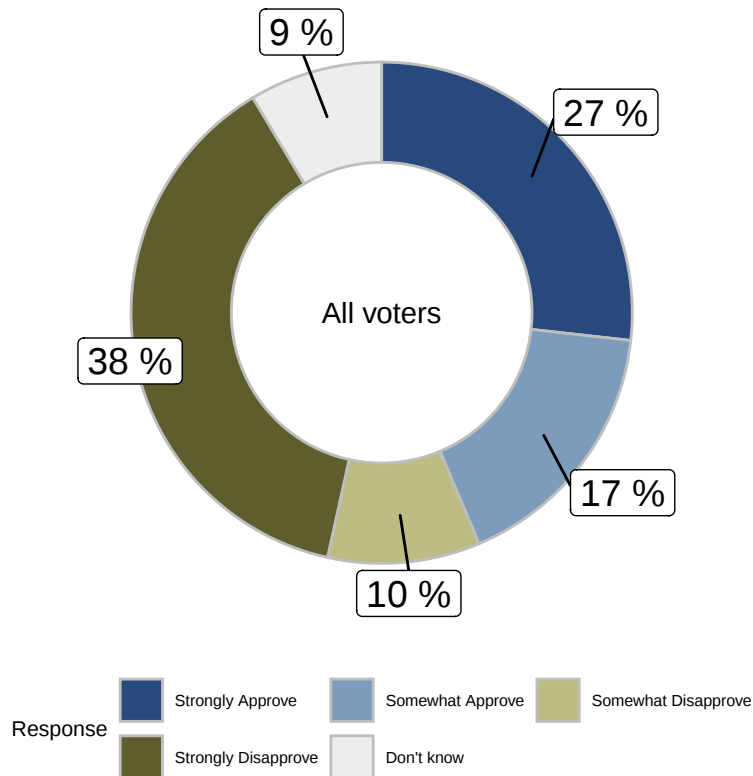

(All voters)**



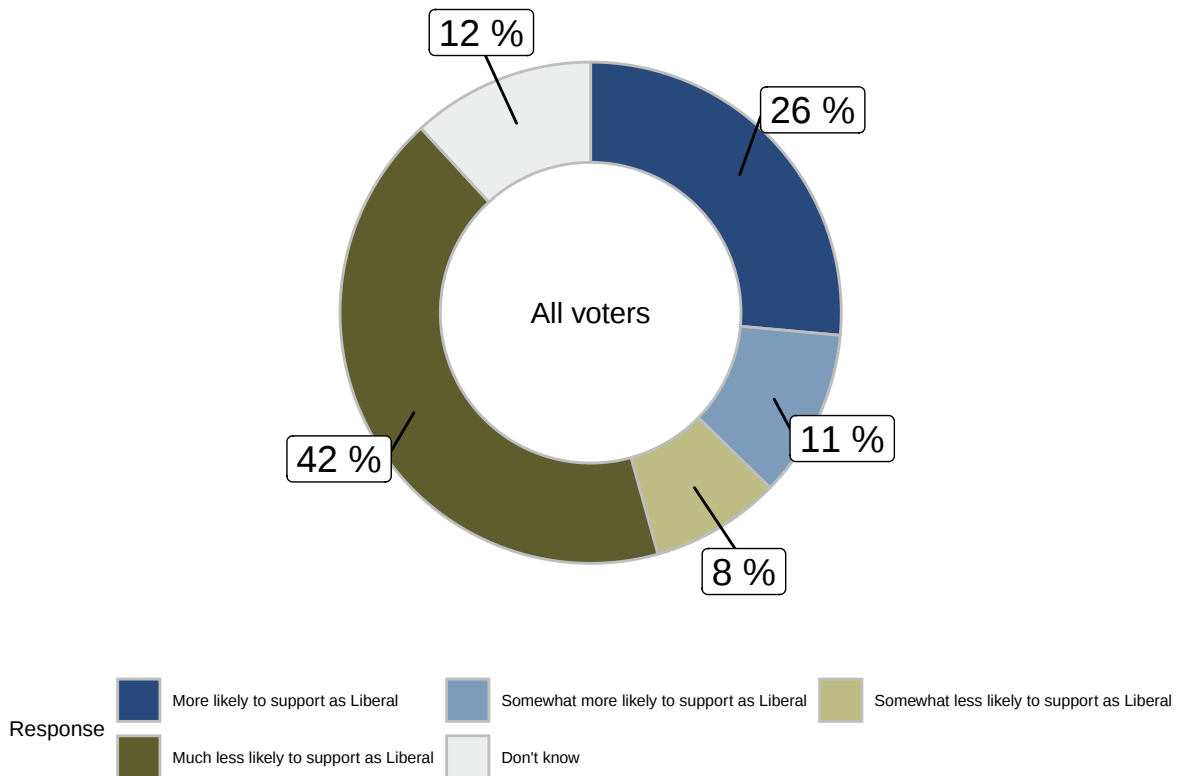

Would you be more or less likely to vote for your Member of Parliament in the next election if they were a Liberal Party MP? (All voters)



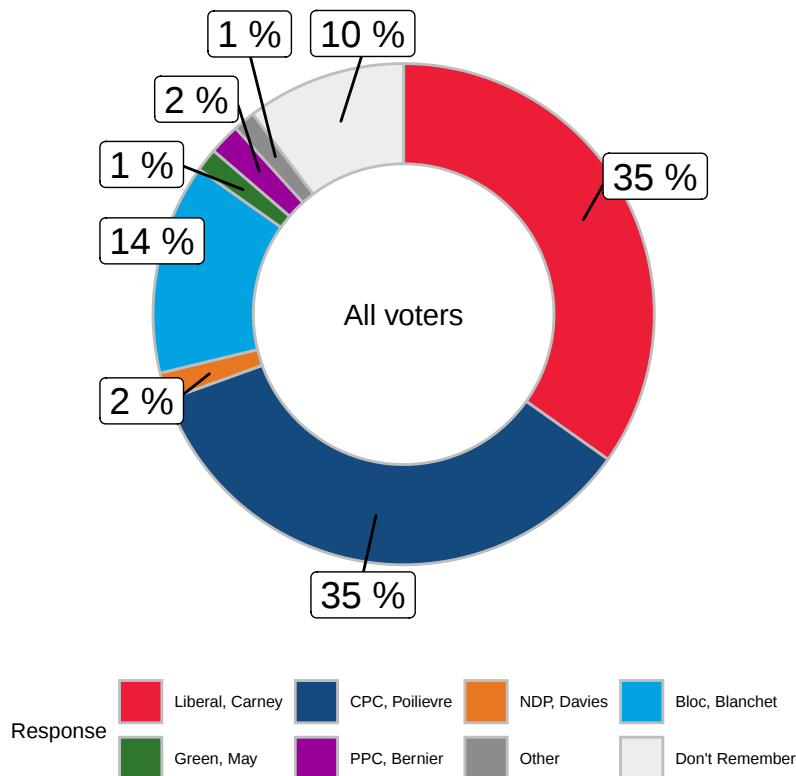

(All voters)**



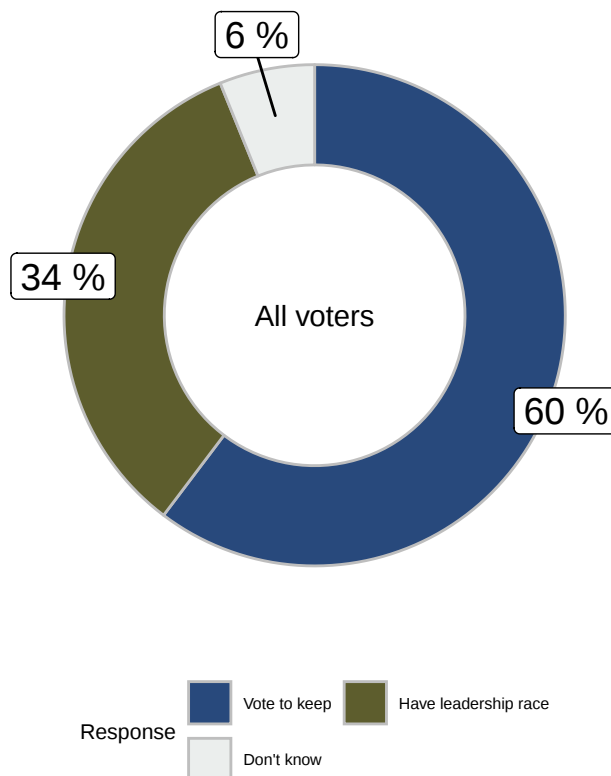
