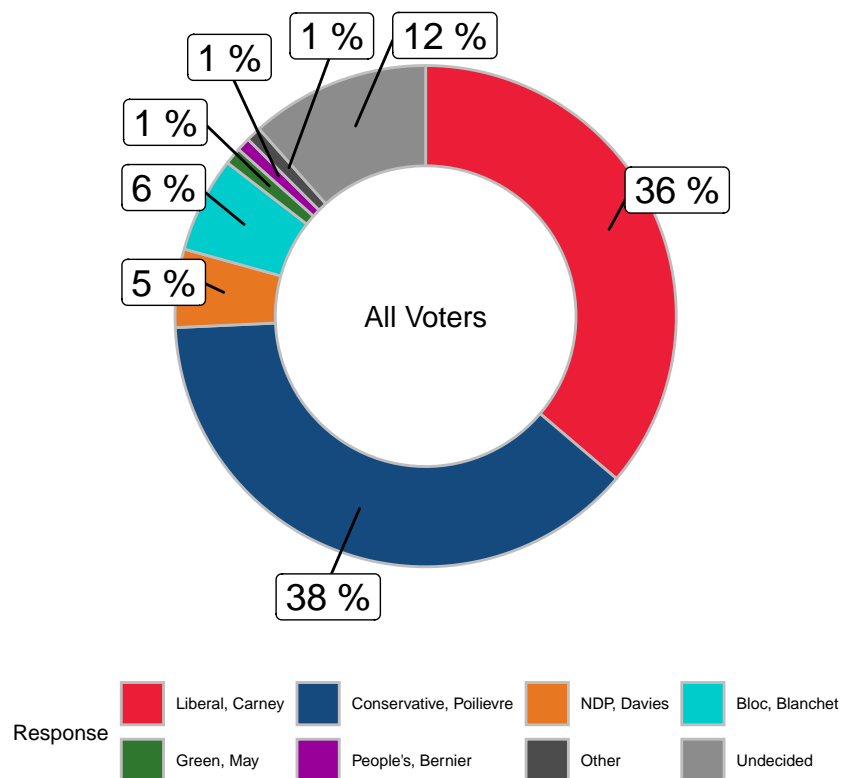
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Sunday, December 7th to Friday, December 12th, 2025, among a sample of 1098 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Canada. The survey was conducted using IVR and SMS to online survey. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Canada.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

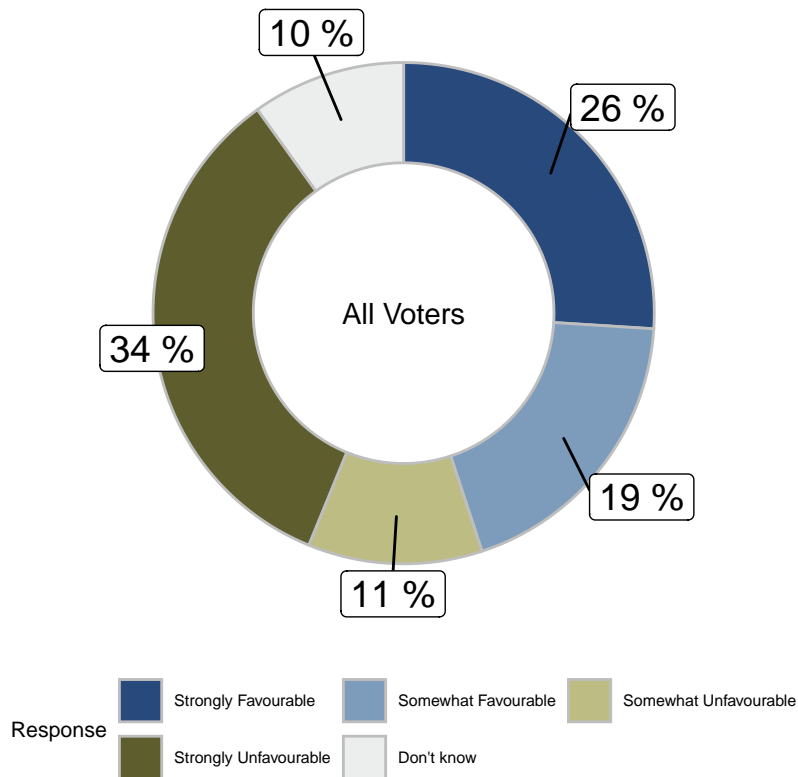

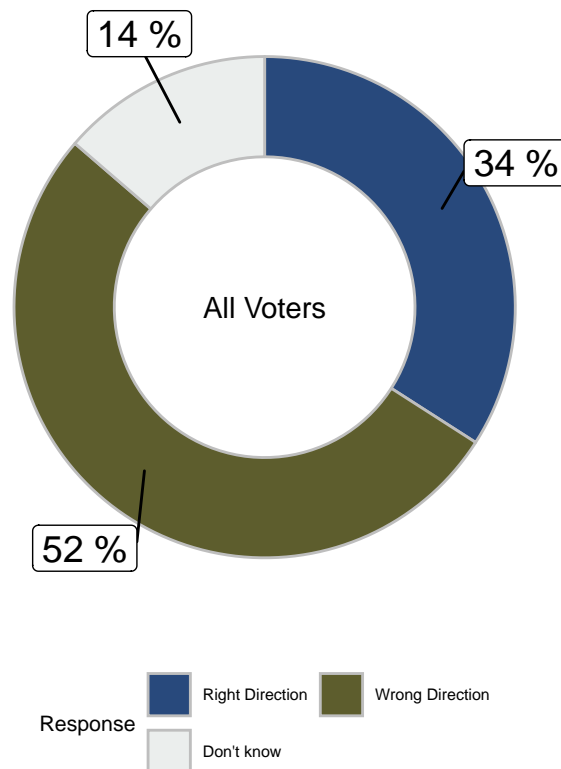

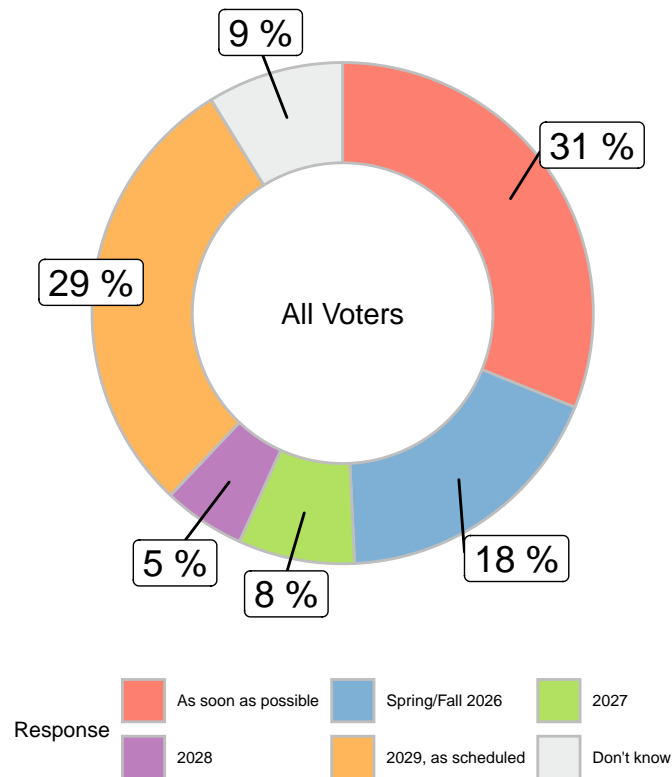
