



# Canada National Polling Survey

**Survey Results — March 2026**

Field Dates: March 1–2, 2026 | N = 1,087 Canadian adults (18+)

Weighted by region × gender × age · MoE ±3.0 pts, 19 times out of 20

## Survey Methodology

### Sample & Fieldwork

This survey was conducted by Mainstreet Research using IVR (Interactive Voice Response) technology among n=1,087 Canadian adults 18 years of age or older. Fieldwork was completed March 1–2, 2026.

### Margin of Error

A probability sample of this size would carry a margin of error of  $\pm 3.0$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20. Results for sub-groups carry larger margins of error.

### Weighting

Results have been weighted by region (Alberta, Atlantic Canada, British Columbia, Prairies, Ontario, Quebec), gender (Male, Female), and age group (18–34, 35–49, 50–64, 65+) using 2021 Census population targets. Weights are normalized so that the weighted total equals the unweighted total (n=1,087) in every table.

### Federal Vote Intention — Three Reporting Standards

The federal vote intention question is reported three ways: (1) All Voters — raw distribution including all Undecideds; (2) Decided + Leaners — respondents who selected Undecided were asked a leaning follow-up; those who expressed a lean are folded into the corresponding party, while hard undecideds (no lean) remain as Undecided; (3) Decided + Leaners, Undecided Removed — same as (2) but hard undecideds are excluded from the base so percentages reflect only those with a vote direction.

### Favourability Questions

Respondents were asked to rate their views of federal party leaders Mark Carney and Pierre Poilievre on a four-point favourability scale (Strongly Favourable, Somewhat Favourable, Somewhat Unfavourable, Strongly Unfavourable), with a Don't know option. Results are reported for all voters.

### Issue & Policy Questions

Additional questions probed voter views on Canada's direction and Mark Carney's stated position on the US/Israeli strike against Iran. Results are presented for all voters and broken out by age, gender, region, education, income, and race.

## Key Insights

Highlights of findings outside the margin of error · Sub-groups with n < 50 excluded

**Liberals lead nationally at 43% among all voters:** Mark Carney's Liberals hold a clear 8-point lead over the Conservatives (43% vs 35%) among all voters. Among decided and leaning voters the Liberal lead widens to 46% vs 36%. The Liberal advantage holds across most regions, with the exception of Alberta (41% Con) and the Prairies (49% Con).

**Conservative support concentrated regionally and among younger men:** Conservatives lead in Alberta (41%) and the Prairies (49%) among all voters, and are strongest among males (45%) and 18–34-year-olds (44%). Among college/trade-educated respondents, Conservatives poll at 42%, their highest educational sub-group nationally.



**Carney holds a net-positive favourability rating; Poilievre net-negative:** Mark Carney's combined favourable rating stands at 58% (35% strongly + 23% somewhat), versus 38% combined unfavourable. Pierre Poilievre records 44% combined favourable but 51% combined unfavourable — with 36% strongly unfavourable, the highest intensity-negative reading in the survey.

**Canada perceived as heading in the right direction — narrowly:** 48% of voters say Canada is going in the right direction versus 42% who say the wrong direction. The positive reading is driven by Liberal voters, women (52% right direction), and seniors 65+ (66%). Among 18–34-year-olds, a majority (53%) say wrong direction.

**Broad support for Carney's stated position on Iran — 68% agree:** 68% of voters agree (39% strongly, 29% somewhat) with Mark Carney's stated support for the US/Israeli strike against Iran, combined with calls for civilian protection. Disagreement is highest among non-binary respondents (36%) and 18–34-year-olds (31%).











Mark Carney has stated that he supports the US/Israeli strike against Iran... Do you agree or disagree?


