Survey Results — March 2026

Field Dates: March 11–13, 2026 | N = 1,054 BC residents (18+)

Weighted by region × gender × age · MoE ±3.0 pts, 19 times out of 20

Survey Methodology

Sample & Fieldwork

This survey was conducted by Mainstreet Research using IVR (Interactive Voice Response) technology among n=1,054 British Columbia residents 18 years of age or older. Fieldwork was completed March 11–13, 2026.

Margin of Error

A probability sample of this size would carry a margin of error of ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. Results for sub-groups carry larger margins of error.

Weighting

Results have been weighted by region (Vancouver area, Vancouver Island, Elsewhere in BC), gender (Male, Female), and age group (Under 35, 35–49, 50–64, 65+) using 2021 Census population targets. Weights are normalized so that the weighted total equals the unweighted total (n=1,054) in every table.

Provincial Vote Intention — Three Reporting Standards

The current-leader provincial vote intention question (Q2, Halford) is reported three ways: (1) All Voters — raw distribution including all Undecideds; (2) Decided + Leaners — respondents who selected Undecided were asked a leaning follow-up (Q3); those who expressed a lean are folded into the corresponding party, while hard undecideds (no lean) remain as Undecided; (3) Decided + Leaners, Undecided Removed — same as (2) but hard undecideds are excluded from the base so percentages reflect only those with a vote direction.

Scenario Ballots — Two Reporting Standards

Four additional provincial vote intention questions (Q7–Q10) test hypothetical BC Conservative leaders (Caroline Elliott, Peter Milobar, Iain Black, Kerry-Lynne Findlay). These are reported two ways: (1) All Voters — full distribution including Undecided; (2) Decided Voters — Undecided respondents excluded from the base.

Key Insights

Highlights of findings outside the margin of error · Sub-groups with n < 50 excluded

NDP leads on current-leader provincial VI: With Trevor Halford as BC Conservative leader, the BC NDP leads across all reporting bases: 31.7% vs 32.5% (all voters); 36.2% vs 34.6% (including leaners); 38.6% vs 36.8% (decided voters only).

All four BC Conservative leadership candidates lead the NDP among decided voters: Elliott (39.9% vs NDP 39.3%), Milobar (43.8% vs NDP 38.3%), Black (40.8% vs NDP 40.0%), and Findlay (40.2% vs NDP 39.9%) all lead among decided voters. Milobar holds the largest margin at 5.5 pts.

Milobar scores highest among all voters and among decided voters: Peter Milobar scores 37.7% among all voters — the highest BC Con total of the four leaders — and 43.8% among decided voters, a 5.5 pts lead over the NDP. His lower undecided rate suggests he mobilizes softer Conservative support more effectively.

All leadership candidates would beat the NDP, only Peter Milobar would secure a majority: While Elliott, Black and Findlay would each win one more seat than the NDP (46 vs 45), only Peter Milobar would secure a clear majority against the NDP, projecting 53 Conservative seats to 38 NDP seats.

Liberals lead federally at 46.7%: The federal Liberal Party under Mark Carney leads with 46.7%, ahead of the Conservatives at 34.1% and NDP at 9.6%. The Liberal lead is driven by strong performance in Metro Vancouver and suburban ridings.



Greens polling strongly provincially at 11.6% among decided voters: The BC Green Party under Emily Lowan polls at 11.6% among decided voters — significantly above their 2024 provincial result — suggesting a meaningful protest vote pool that could affect close NDP–Conservative races.

Hard undecided share is low at 6.2% after leaners folded in: After folding in the Q3 leaning question, only 6.2% of voters remain hard undecided — well below the 17.4% all-voter undecided rate. Most soft undecideds have a directional lean.

Cost of living and healthcare dominate the issue agenda: Cost of living (27.0%) and healthcare access (20.1%) together account for nearly half of all first-choice issue mentions. DRIPA ranks fourth at 11.7%.










Q7 — Provincial VI Scenario: Caroline Elliott as BC Conservative Leader




Q8 — Provincial VI Scenario: Peter Milobar as BC Conservative Leader




Q9 — Provincial VI Scenario: Iain Black as BC Conservative Leader




