

# BC Conservative Leadership 2026

Survey Results — March 2026

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Field Dates: March 19–22, 2026 | N = 2,578 eligible voters & intenders

Weighted by regional riding-point allocation + household size · 93 ridings · 9,300 pts total

## Methodology & About Mainstreet Research

### Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on a survey conducted March 19–22, 2026, among a sample of 2,578 adults who are either currently registered members of the BC Conservative Party, or indicated an intention to sign up before the April 18, 2026 membership deadline.

Results were weighted by region using a riding-points system assigning 100 points per riding across all 93 BC Conservative ridings grouped into six geographic regions. An additional household-size weight (inverse of number of adults per household) corrects for over-representation of multi-adult households.

The margin of error is  $\pm 1.93$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20. Margins of error are higher within subsamples.

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
## Key Insights

*Findings outside the margin of error · Crosstabs with n < 50 excluded*

- **Elliott leads on first choice, race extremely tight**  
 Caroline Elliott leads all candidates at 21.2%, but Peter Milobar sits at 20.8% — a 0.4-point gap well within the margin of error. With 31.6% still undecided, the undecided pool is by far the largest single block in the race.
- **Milobar opens a clear electability lead**  
 When asked who is best to unify the party and defeat the NDP, Milobar leads at 30.6% vs. Elliott's 26.0% — a 4.6-point edge outside the margin of error that strongly reinforces his electability argument.
- **Milobar dominates BC South; Elliott leads Vancouver**  
 Milobar leads decisively in BC South (33.0%) and Greater Victoria (29.1%). Elliott's single strongest region is Vancouver (26.8%), followed by the Lower Mainland (21.2%). Van. Island and BC North are key battlegrounds.
- **Cost of living is now the defining issue**  
 Cost of living and affordability is the top issue at 34.2% province-wide, ahead of Land and Property Rights (DRIPA) at 25.9%. Jobs & the economy ranks third at 15.2%.
- **Electability is the #1 voting factor**  
 Voters rank "Is best candidate to win the next election" first among leadership factors (mean 3.99 on a 1–10 scale), ahead of policy alignment (4.14) and fiscal conservatism (4.23).
- **Milobar wins ranked ballot over Elliott 50.5–49.5**  
 In a simulated instant-runoff ballot using first, second, and third choices, Peter Milobar wins the final round at 50.5% vs. Elliott's 49.5% — an extremely close result with 385 exhausted ballots in the final round.
- **Kerry-Lynne Findlay is the kingmaker**  
 Findlay holds 17.5% of valid votes entering Round 5, the final elimination round. Only 21.8% of her supporters transfer to Elliott vs. 11.9% to Milobar — but 66.3% exhaust, making her voters the decisive swing block.
- **47% would vote for any candidate**  
 Nearly half of eligible voters say they would vote for any of the candidates — suggesting a large persuadable pool whose final choice will depend on campaign momentum and debate performance.
- **CPC brand dominates; One BC emerges as a third force**  
 45.4% of members most closely align with the Conservative Party of Canada, followed by BC Conservative (26.8%). One BC sits at 7.7% — a meaningful centre-right bloc that neither leading candidate fully owns.



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









## Ranked Ballot Simulation

Based on Q3 first choice, Q4 second choice, Q5 third choice — weighted results. Undecided respondents and those expressing no preference are excluded.


Using respondents' ranked preferences, Mainstreet simulated a full instant-runoff ranked ballot election. In each round, the lowest-polling candidate is eliminated and their supporters' next valid preference is redistributed. If the second choice has already been eliminated, the third choice is counted. Ballots with no remaining valid preference become exhausted and are excluded from the valid vote total. A candidate must cross 50%+1 of valid votes to win. Total valid weighted votes in round 1: 1,764.
