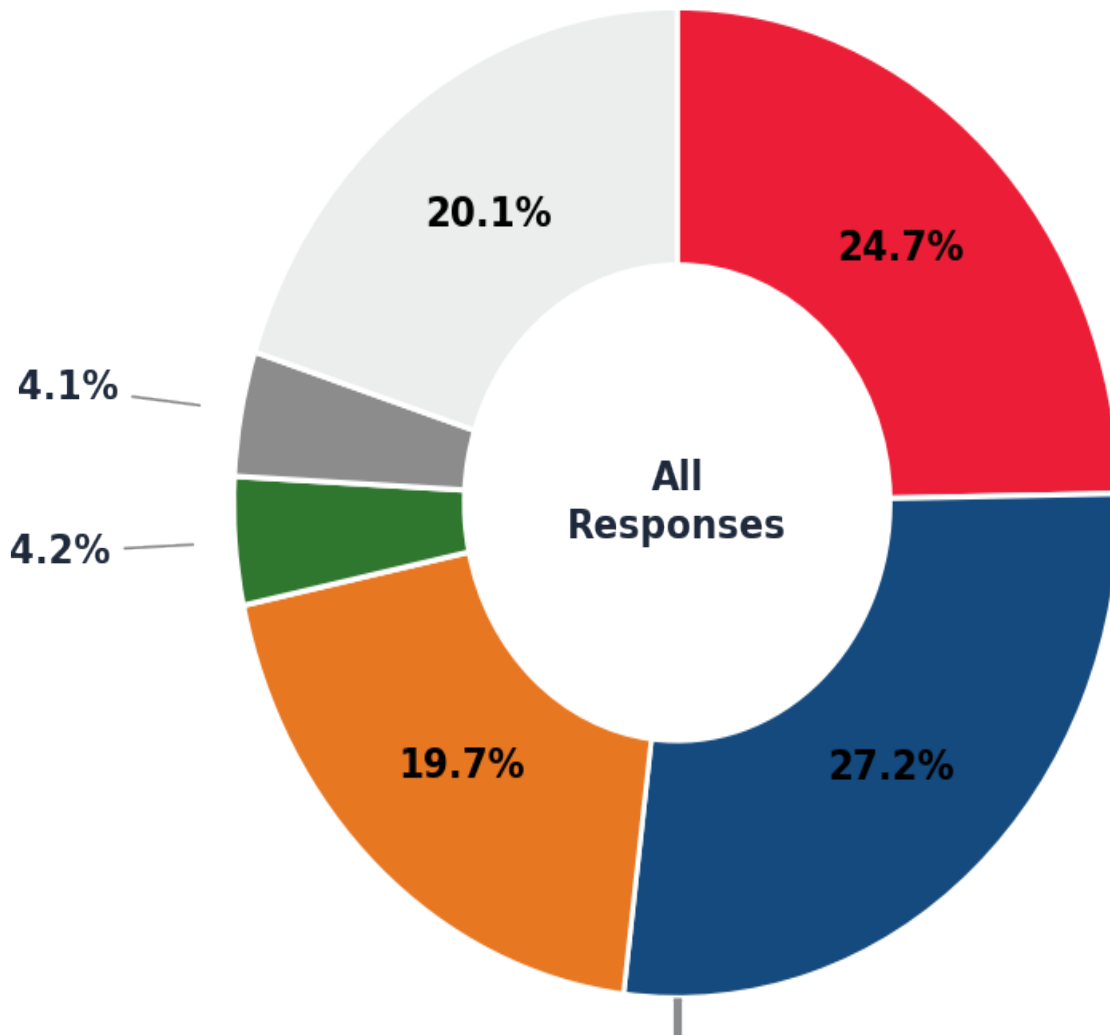

Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted May 5-7th, 2026, among a sample of 910 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Ontario. The survey was conducted using Integrated Voice Response (IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Ontario. The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3.2% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample. Totals may not add up 100% due to rounding. 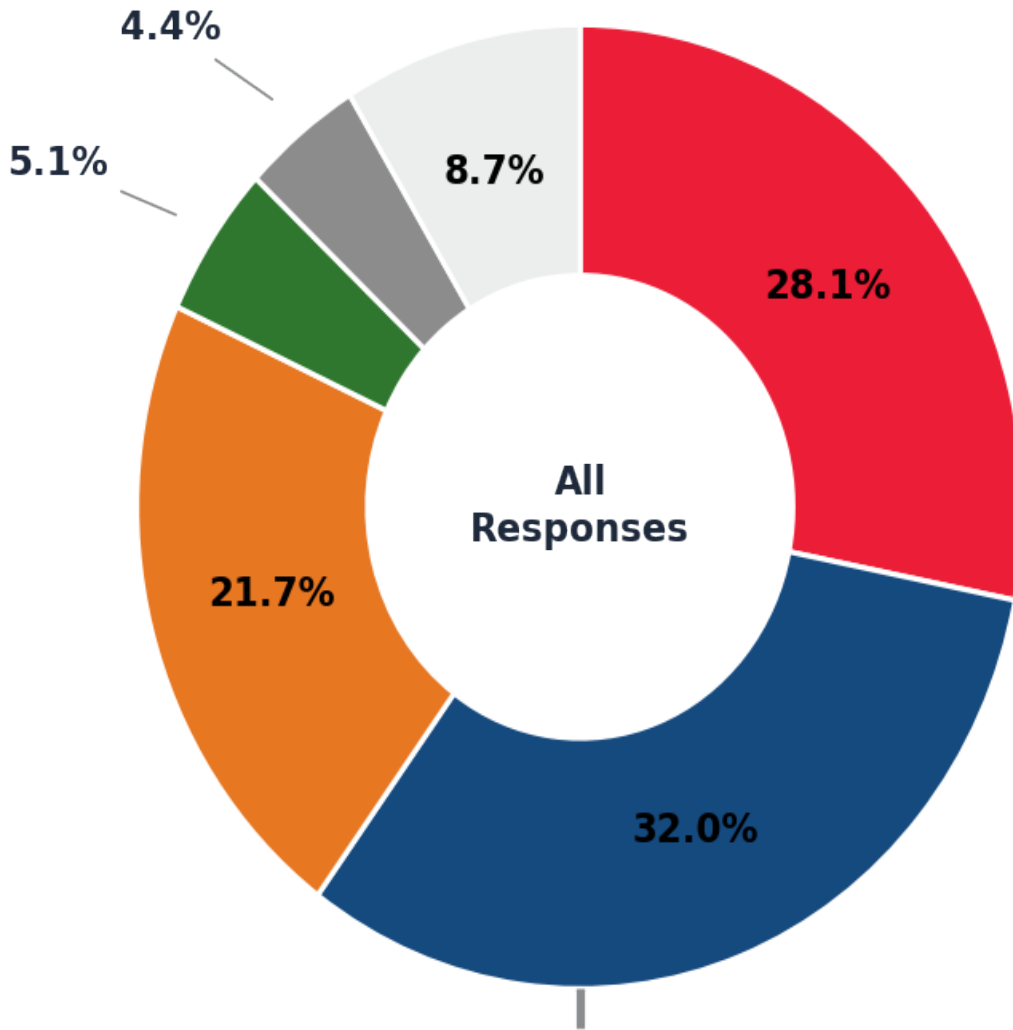

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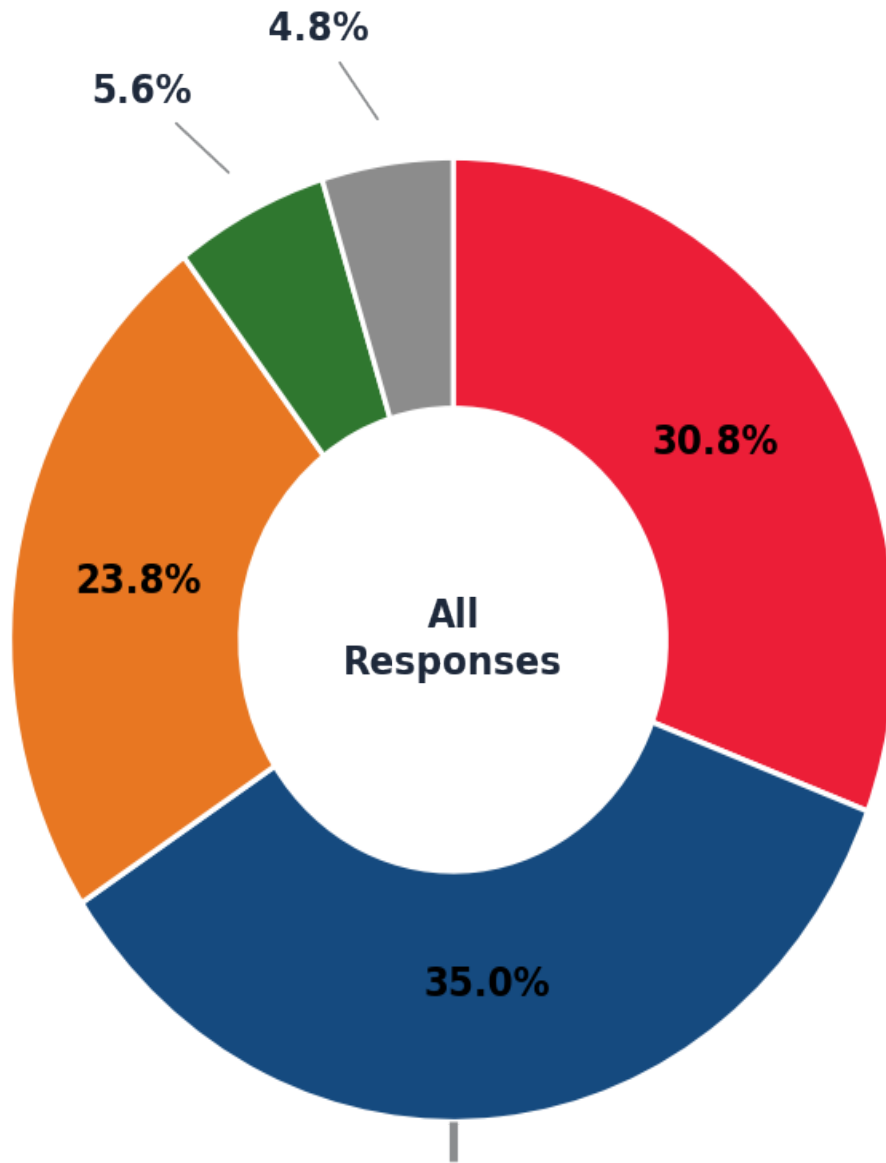

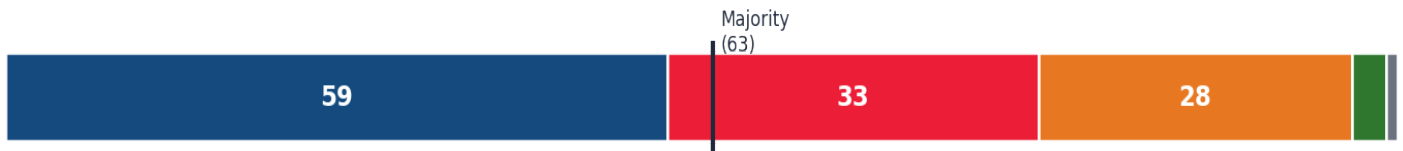

Province-wide uniform swing from 2025 results - Decided Voters + Leaners

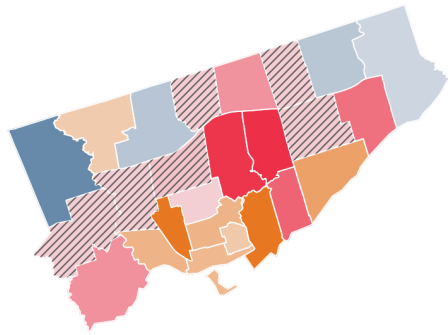


MINORITY — PC, Ford (59 seats, 4 short of majority)

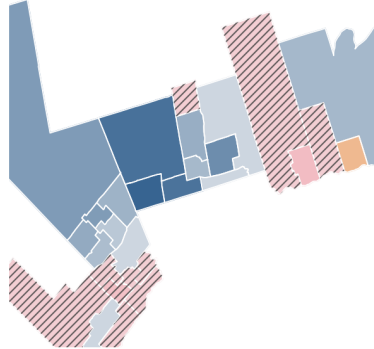
Projected Seat Outcome — PC, Ford MINORITY (59 seats) - Decided Voters + Leaners



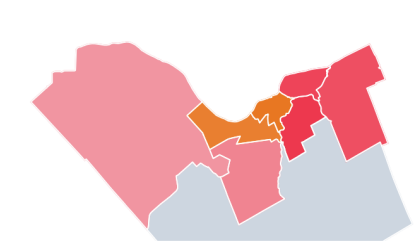

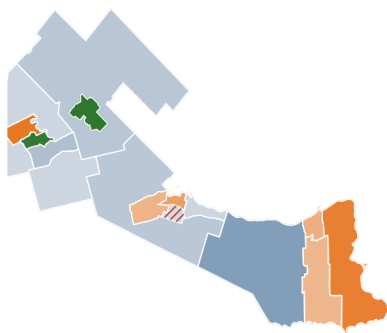

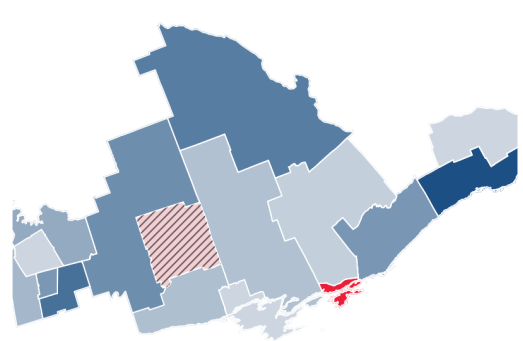

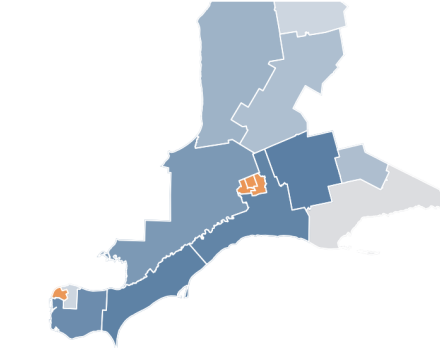

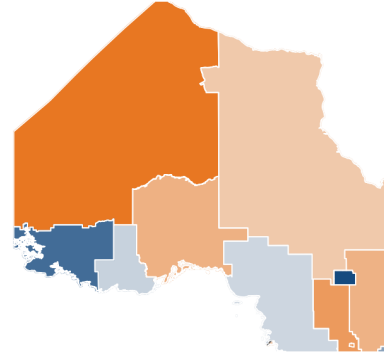

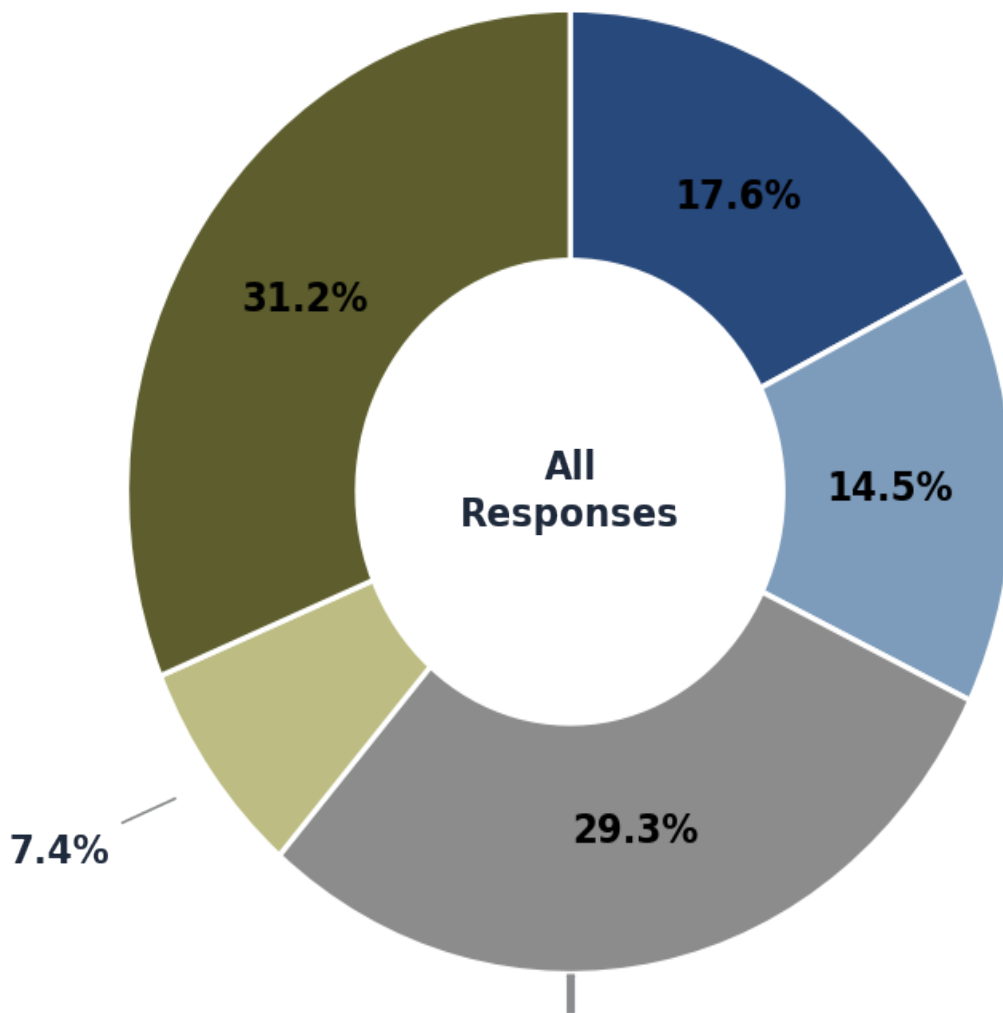
