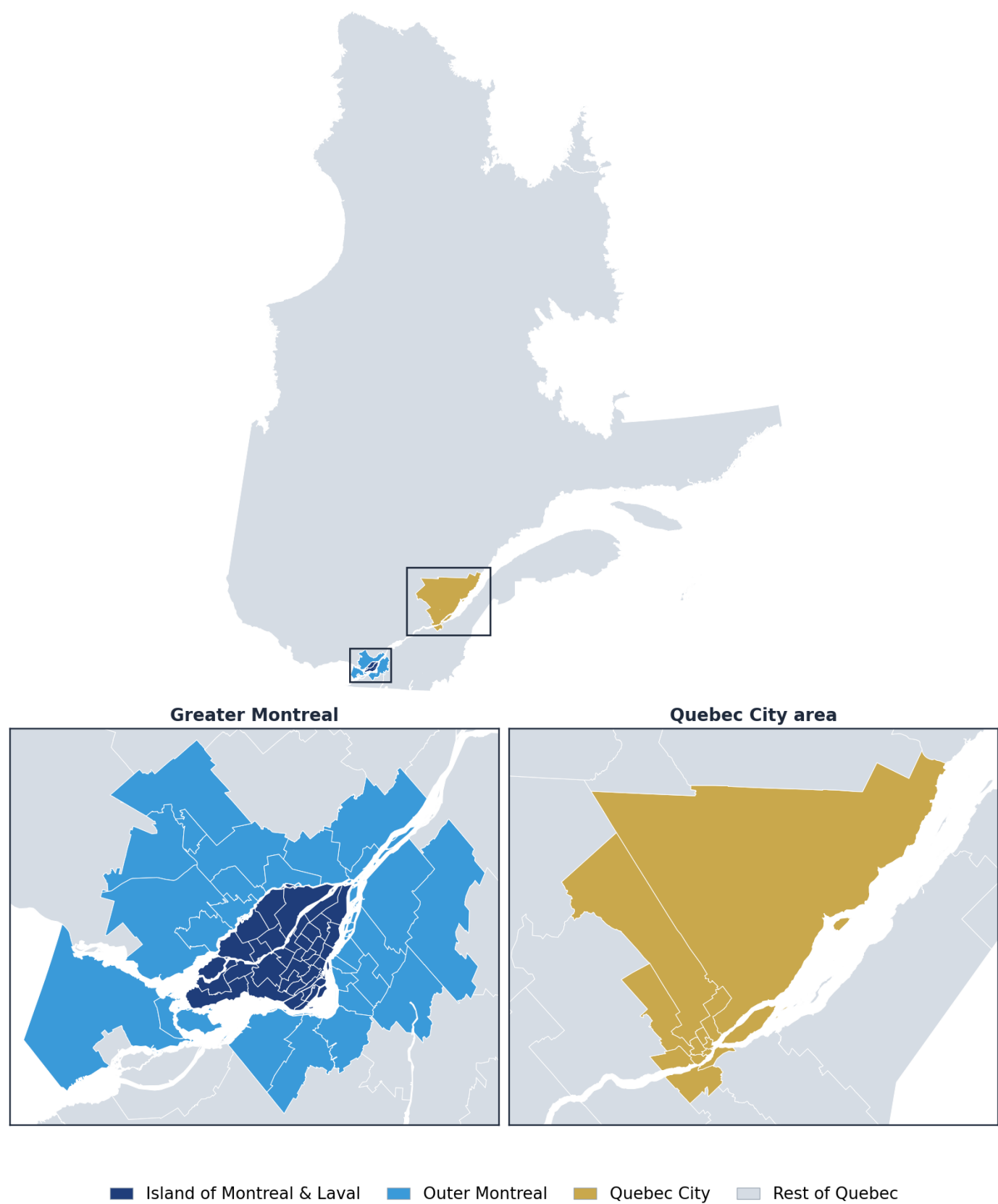

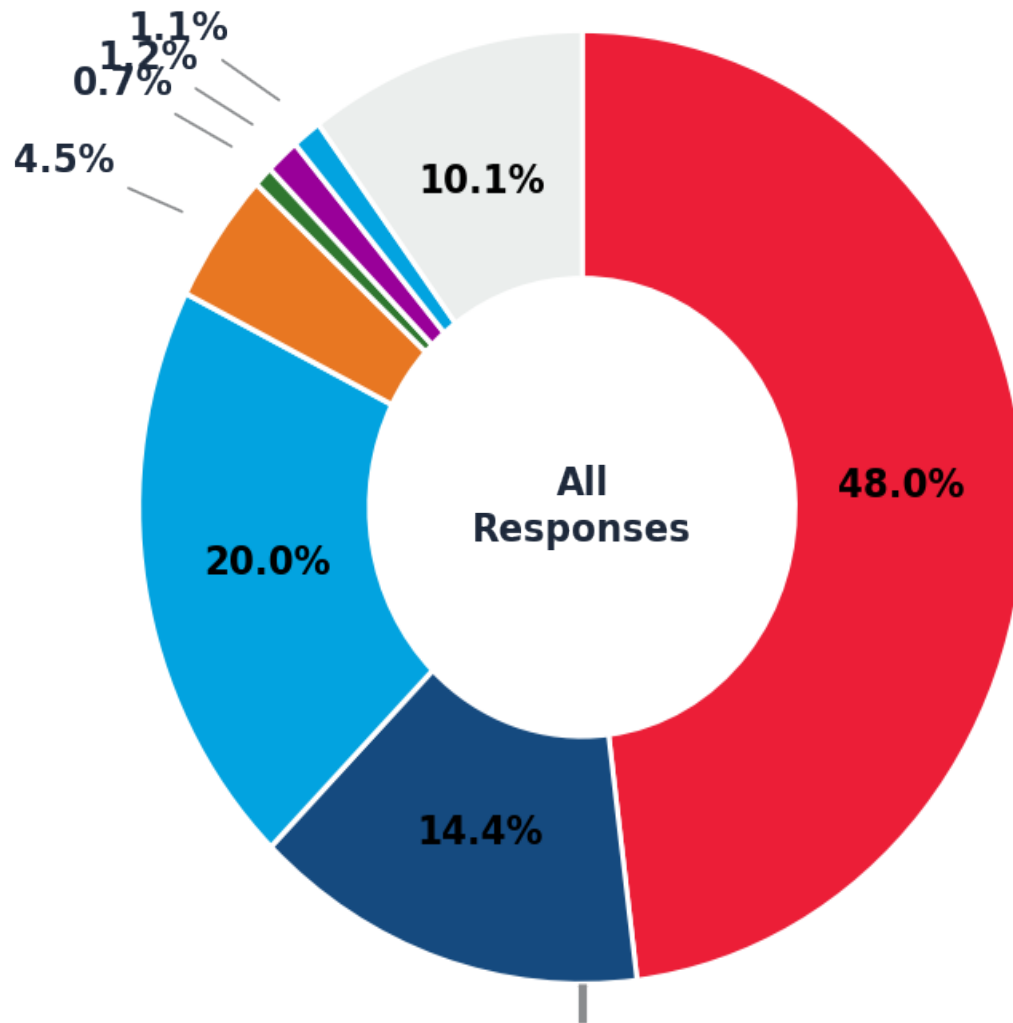
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted September 11-13th, 2026, among a sample of 2145 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Quebec. The survey was conducted using Interactive Voice Response (IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Quebec. Results were weighted regionally: within each of 4 regions (Island of Montreal & Laval, Outer Montreal, Quebec City and Rest of Quebec), responses were weighted by gender, age, education & language to that region's own 2021 Census profile, and each region was then weighted to its share of the valid votes cast in the 2022 provincial election. The margin of error for the poll is +/- 2.1% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample. Totals may not add up 100% due to rounding. 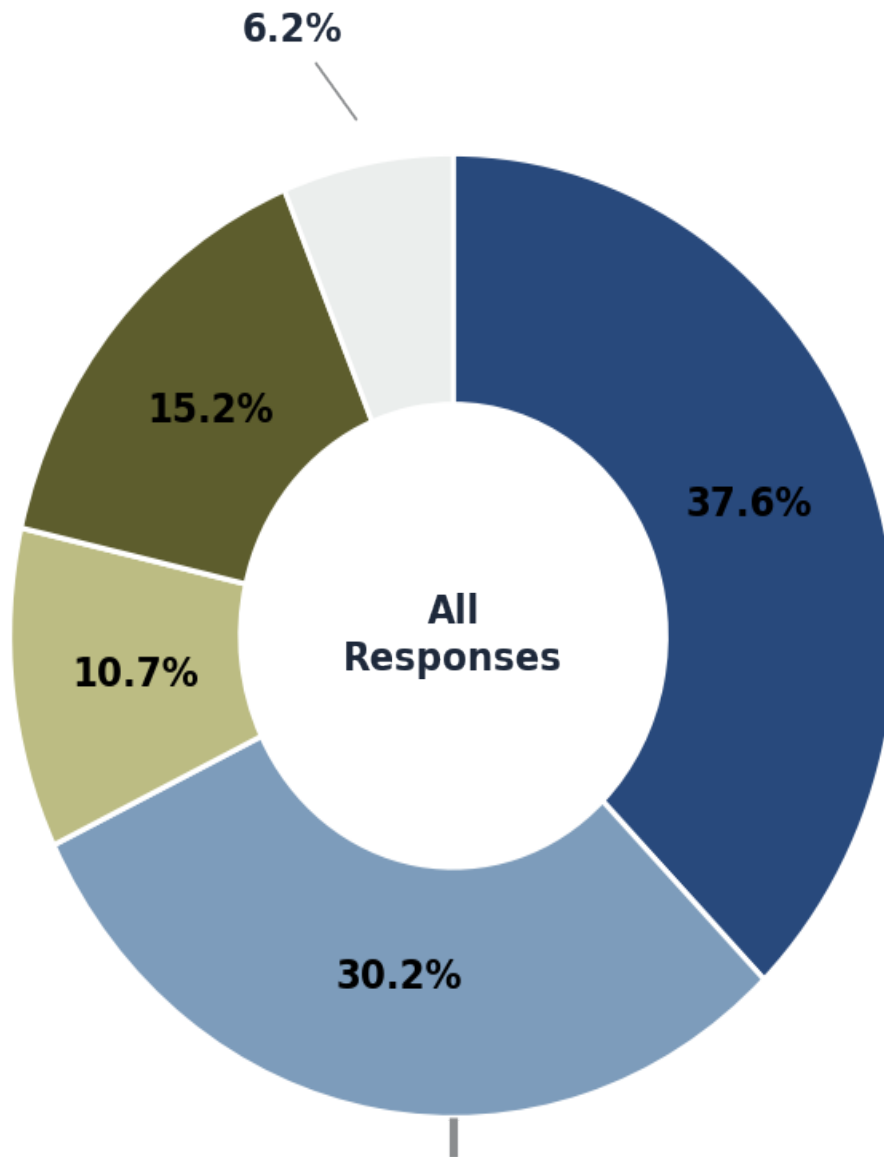

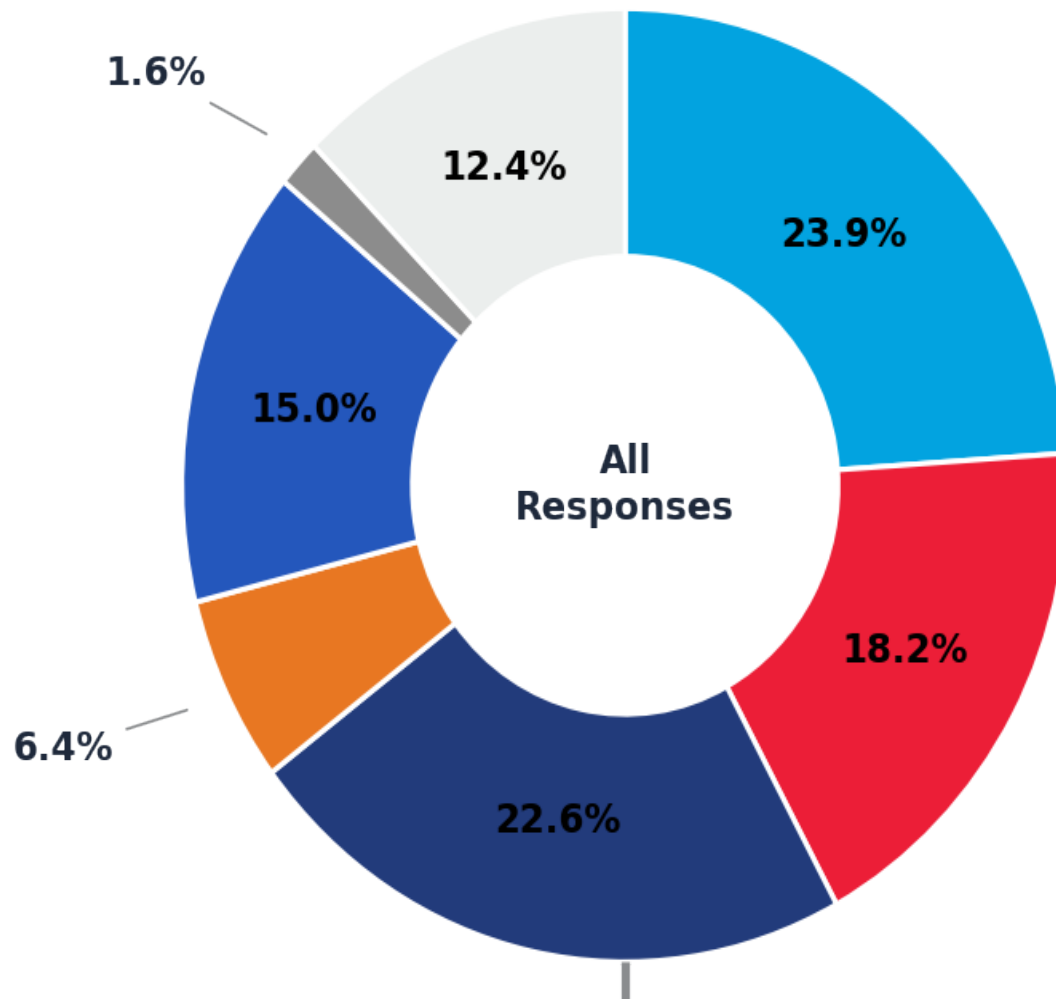

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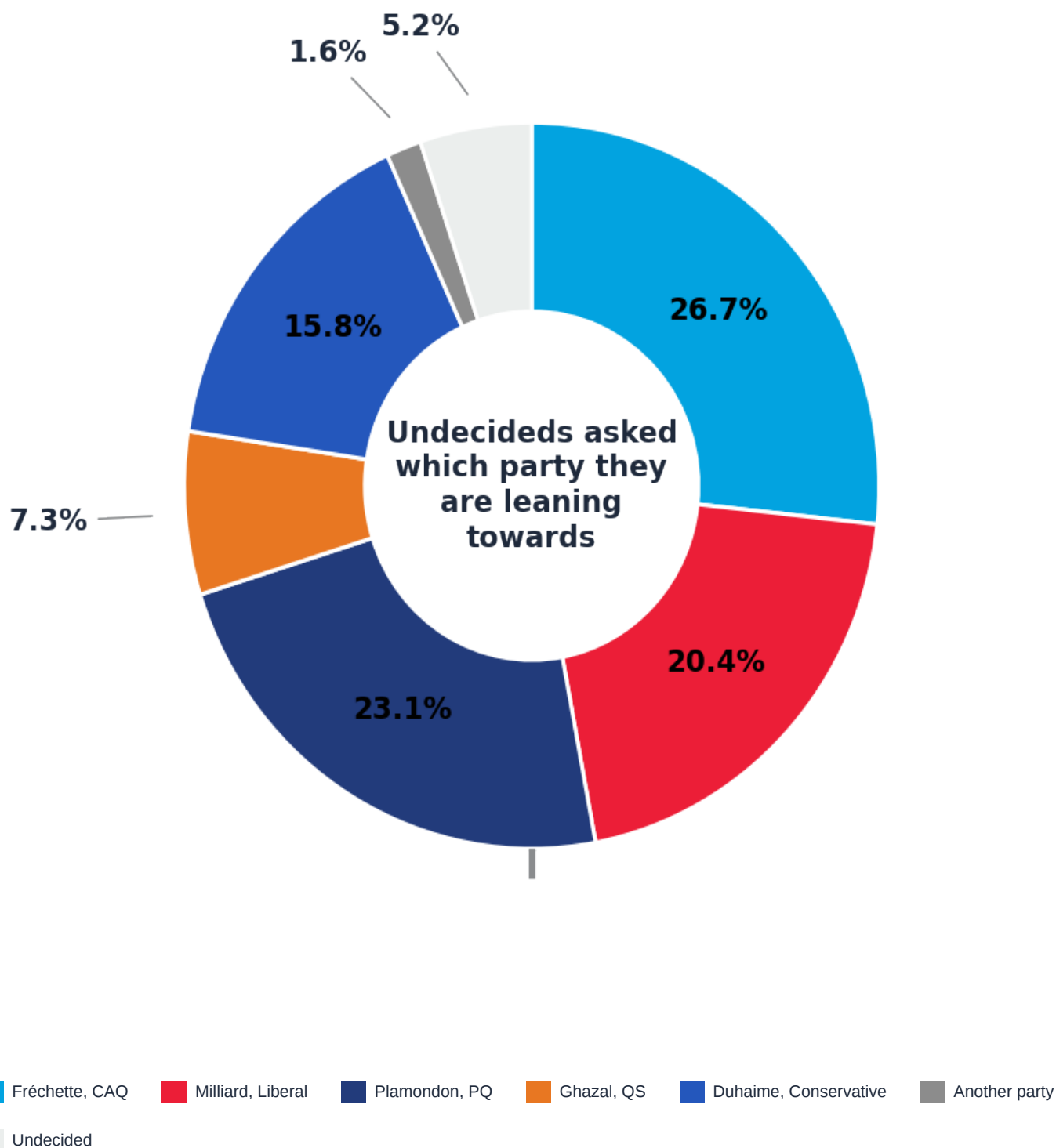

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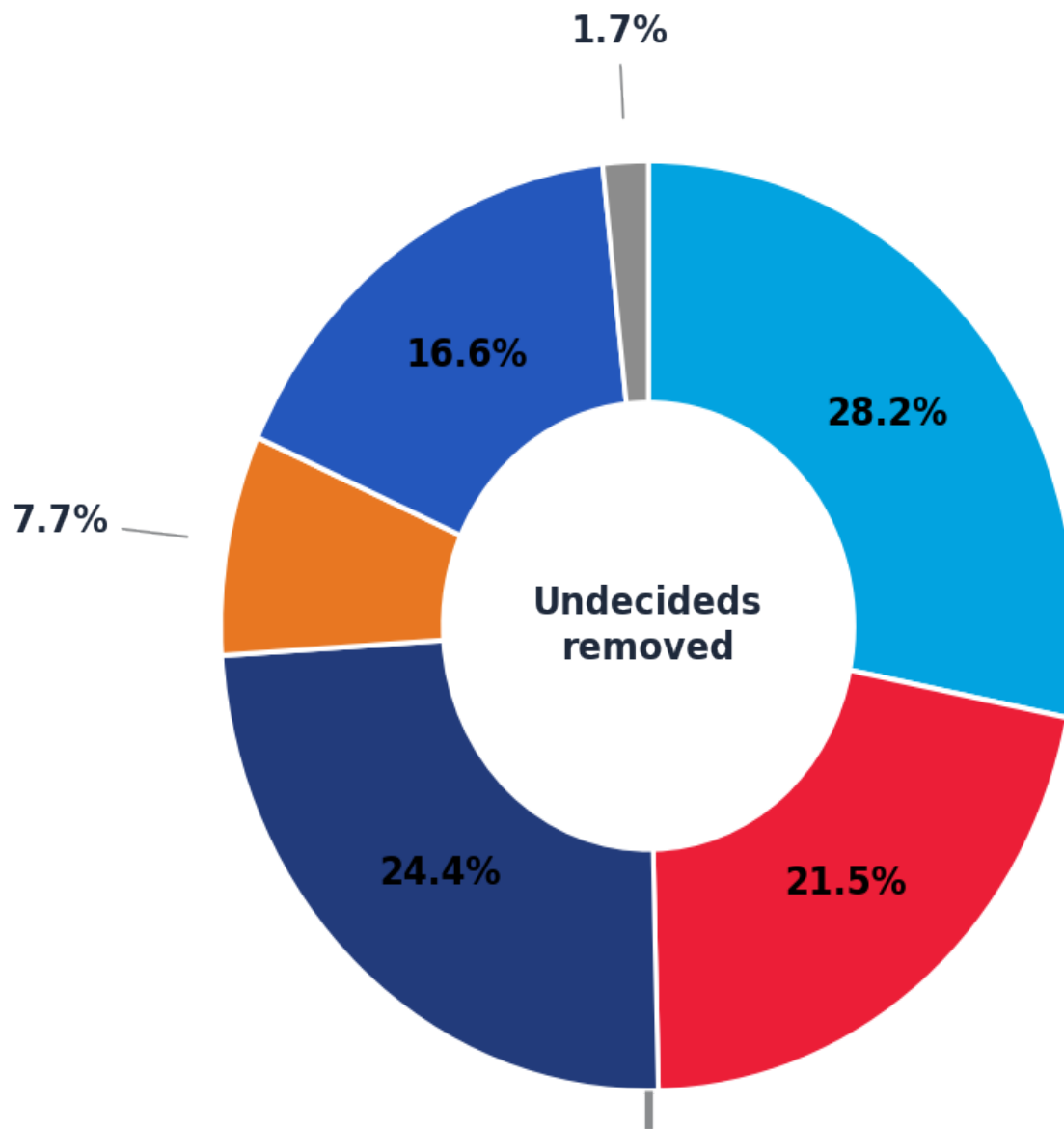

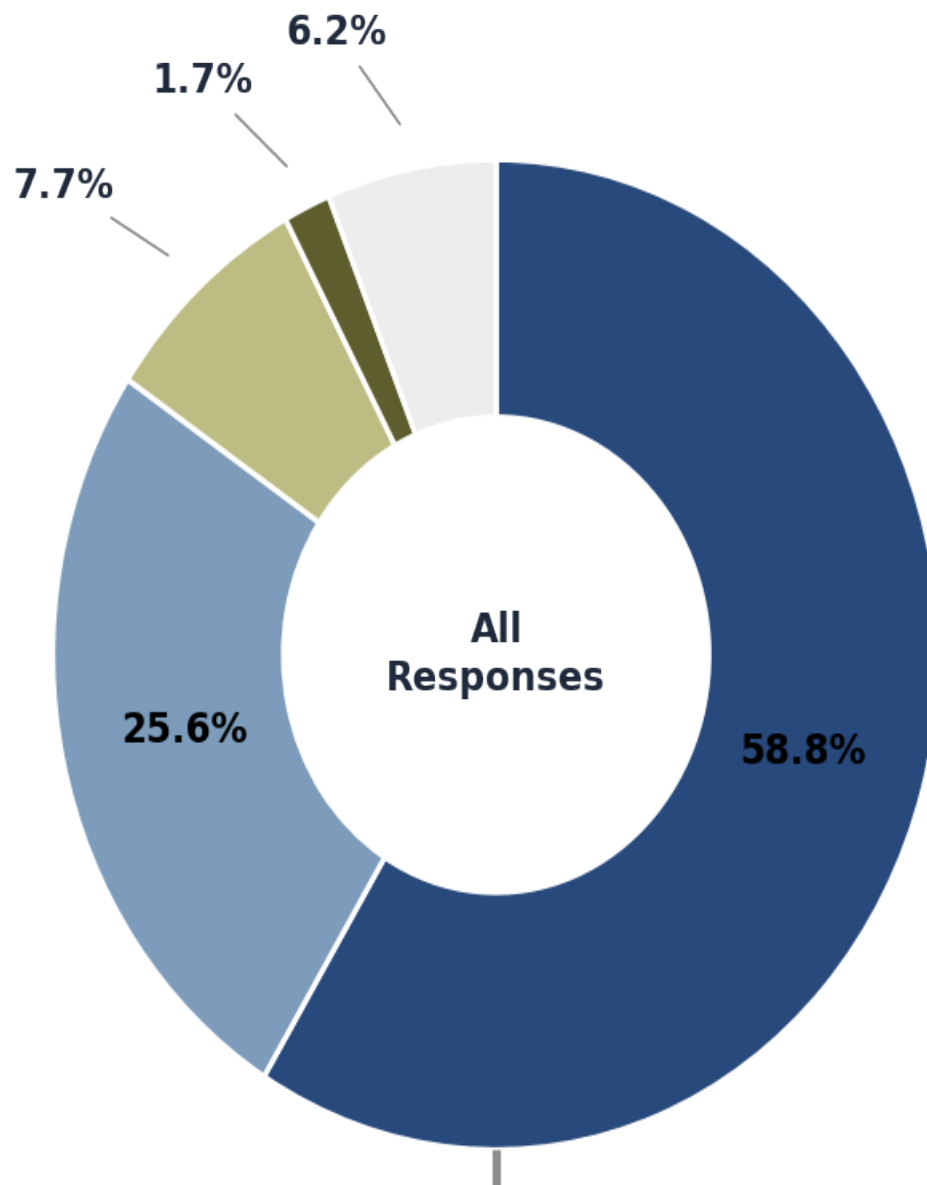

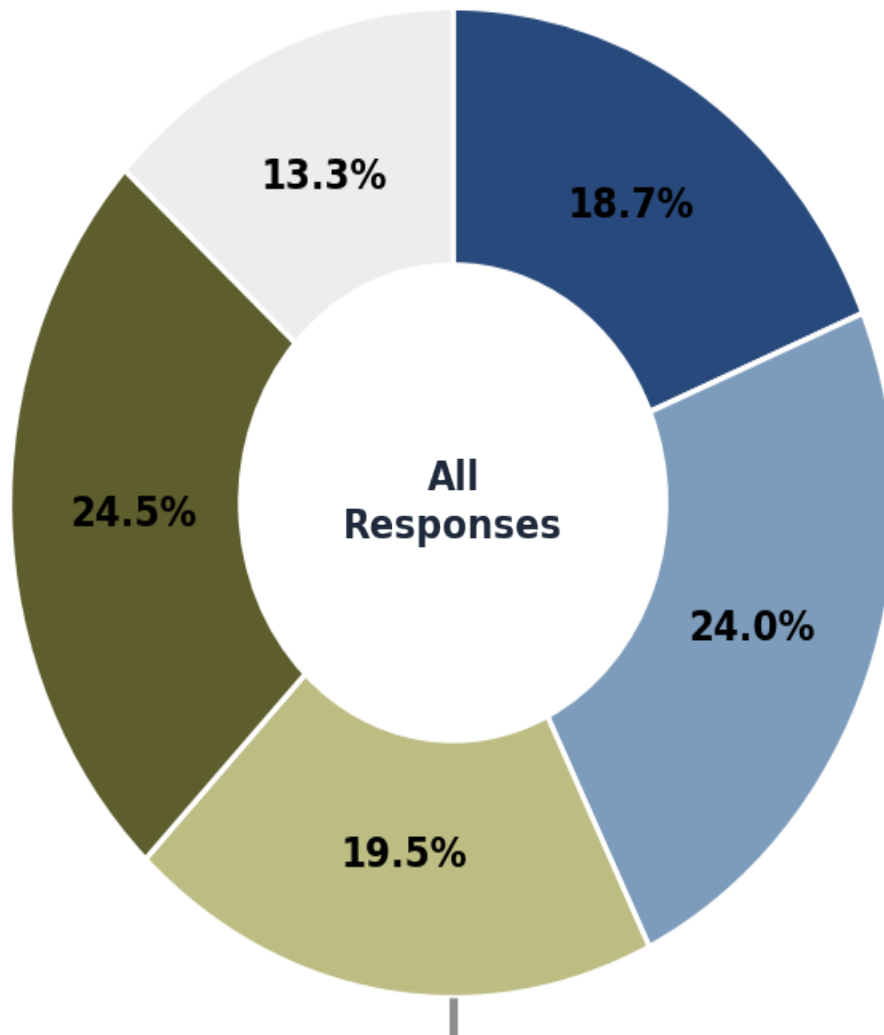

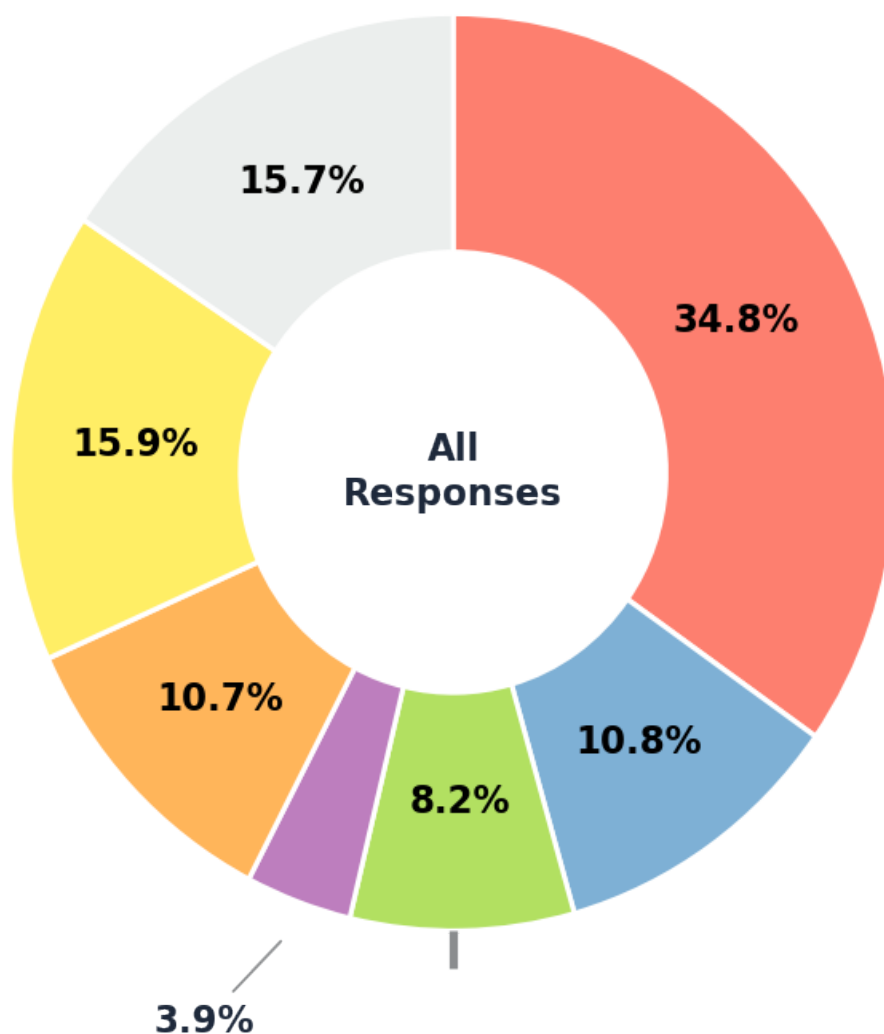

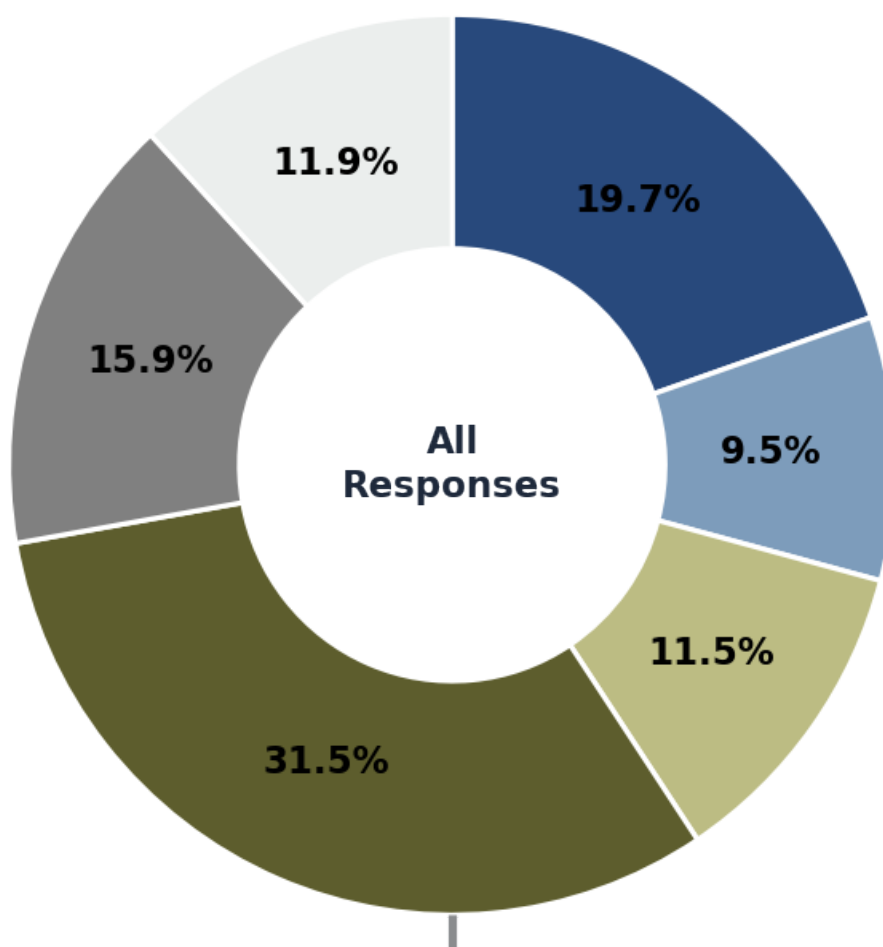

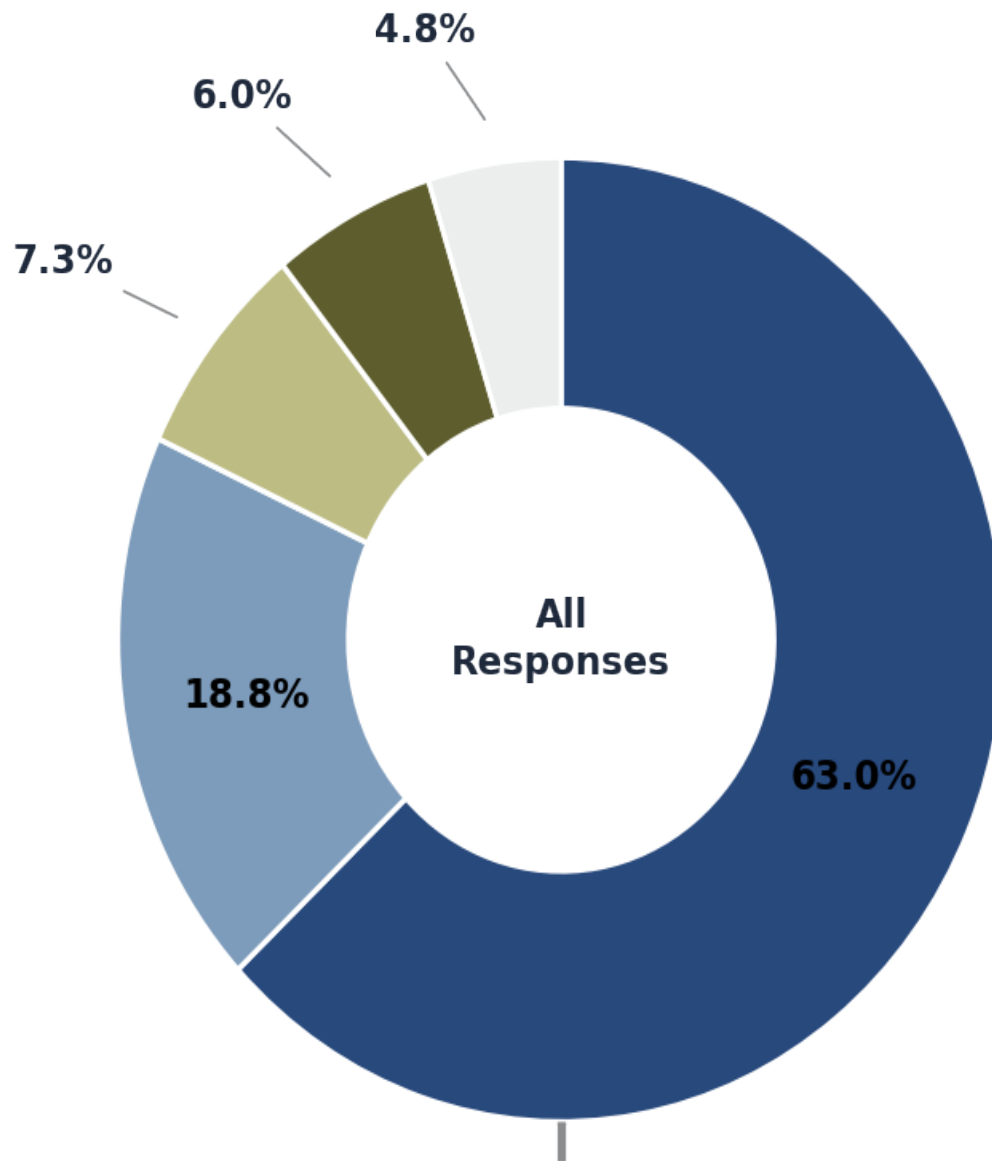

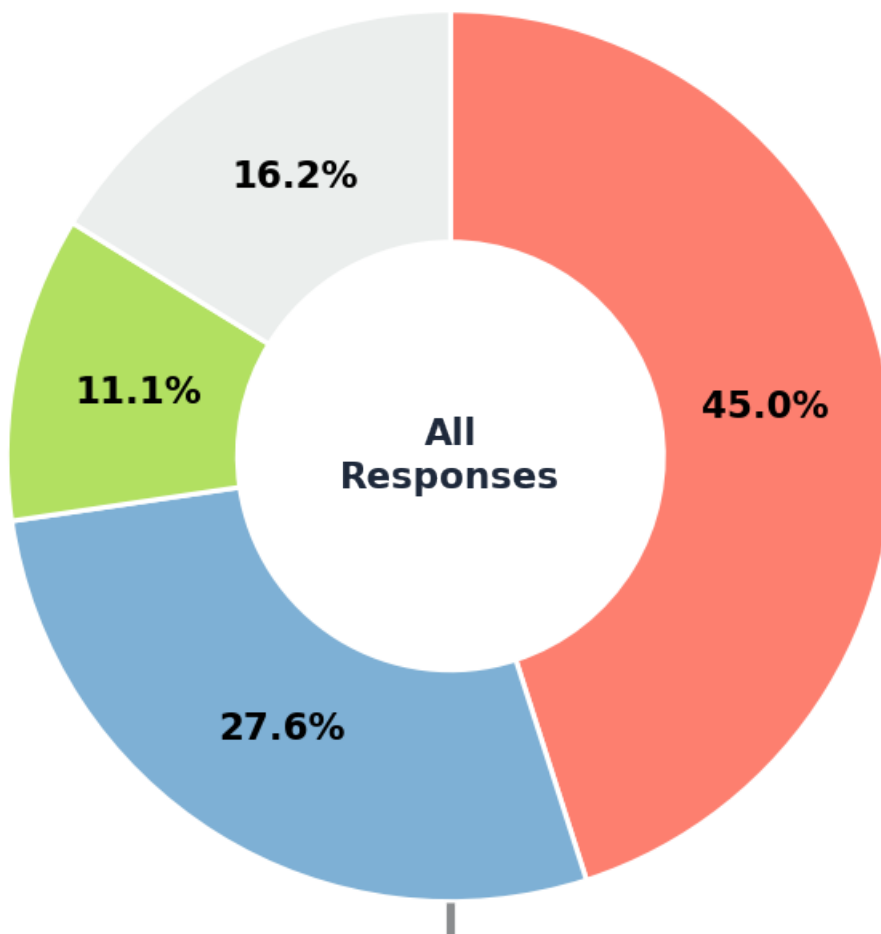

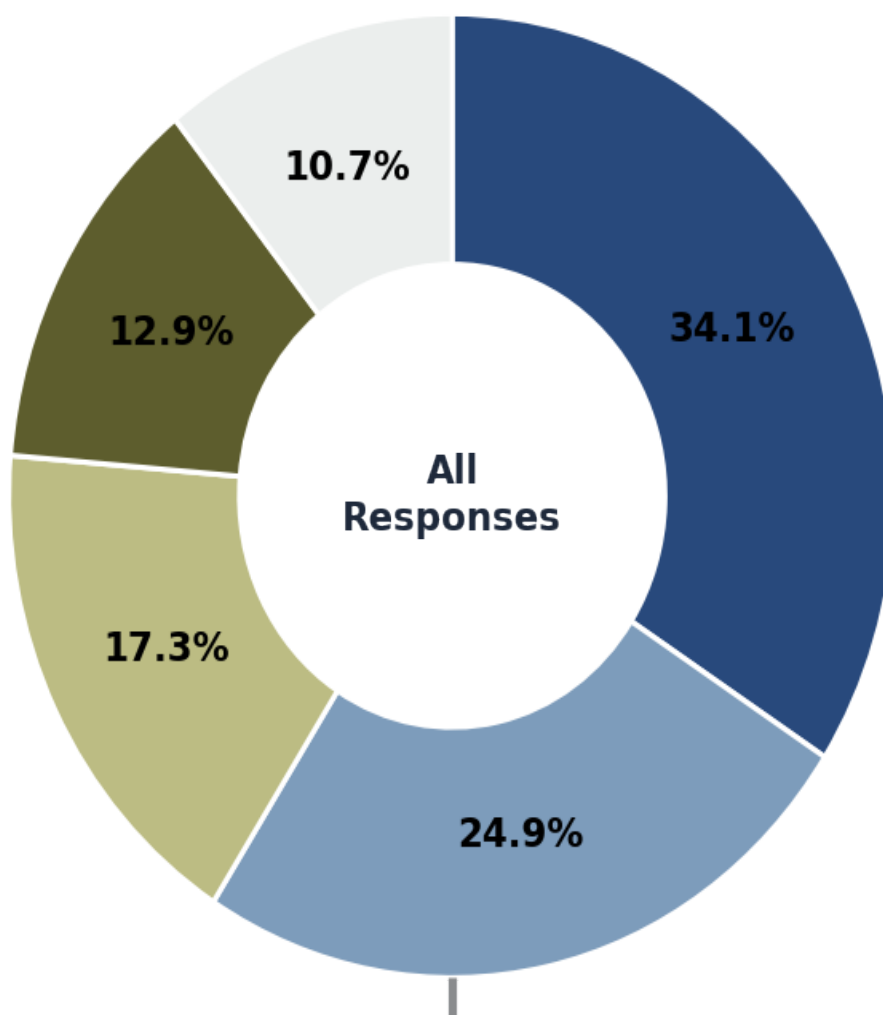

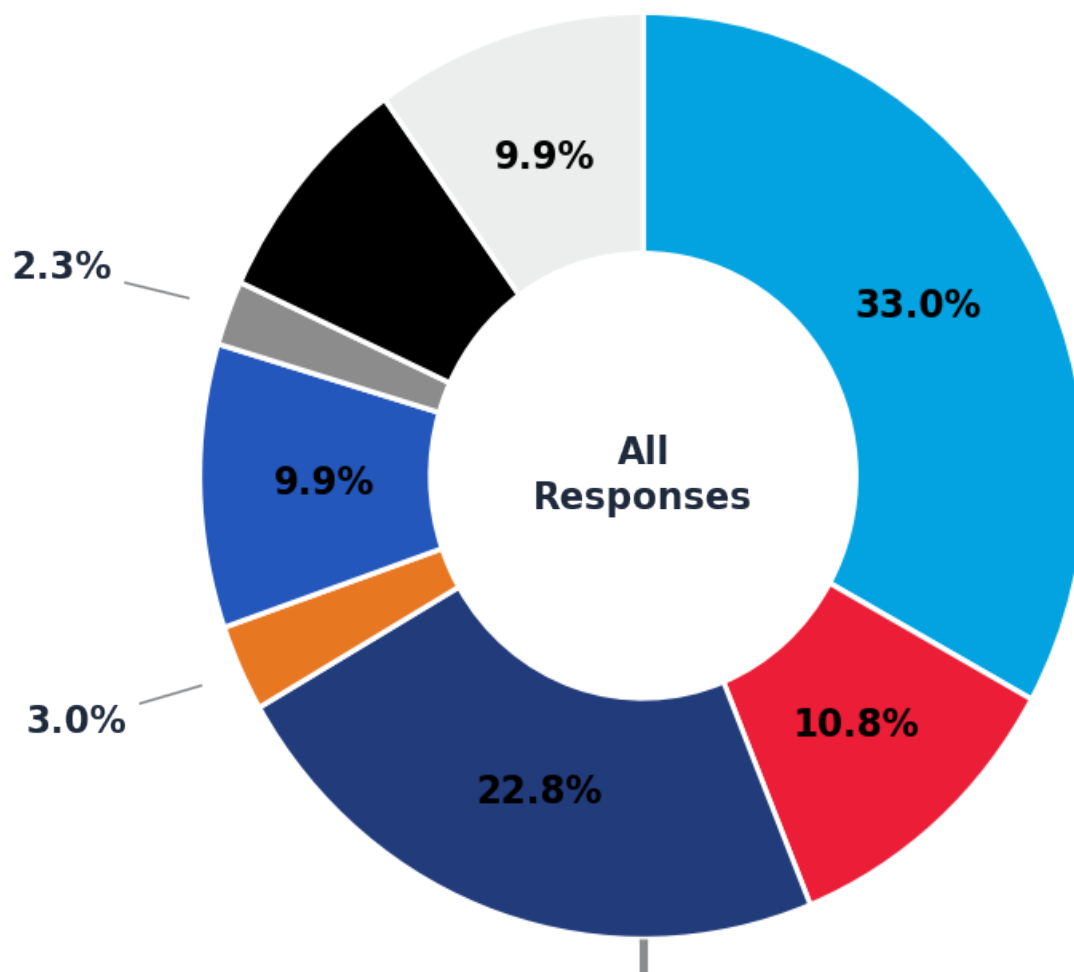
