

Clients receive prompt estimates, precise engineering, clear specifications, full-scale mockups if appropriate, and careful delivery and installation. Technology is combined with artistry to produce superior millwork.

BACKGROUND

In 1978, Mark Richey began his woodworking career while working as an apprentice to a harpsichord builder. In 1981, he founded Mark Richey Woodworking and has since, with the invaluable help of wife Teresa Richey and a top caliber administration team, seen the business steadily grow.

TODAY

Today, the company occupies a 130,000-square-foot facility in Newburyport, Massachusetts, and employs a diverse workforce of 100 highly-skilled craftspeople and construction specialists renowned for mastering monumental, complex projects.

In addition to architectural millwork, Mark Richey Woodworking has a tradition of building fine, custom furniture. In 2018, that tradition grew with the purchase of the WallGoldfinger brand — a highly reputable custom corporate furniture maker. That brand is now WallGoldfinger Furniture, a division of Mark Richey Woodworking, with offices in Vermont and Massachusetts.











APPROACH

Mark Richey Woodworking's projects reflect its dedication to three principles: commitment, collaboration and craftsmanship.

COMMITMENT

Mark Richey Woodworking serves the needs of its customers and the environment. The goal is providing clients the best service they have ever received. That means adhering to deadlines, keep promises and ensuring success for each project.

COLLABORATION

From estimating and pre-construction through sourcing of materials and engineering to production and installation, every member of the Mark Richey team works together to turn complex, one-of-a-kind projects into reality. This is possible in part through the sense of ownership, accountability and pride each team member feels for the project.

CRAFTSMANSHIP

The Mark Richey Woodworking factory is the ultimate custom woodshop, where technology combines with artistry to deliver superior woodwork. The Mark Richey team works with precision, attention to detail and an openness to innovation.

This approach of commitment, collaboration and craftsmanship lasts through all stages of a project, from estimating through installation.























TOOLS AND TECHNOLOGY

Mark Richey Woodworking deploys old-world craftsmanship with state-of-the-art equipment. Among that equipment are 5-axis CNC routers as well as a closed-chamber, automated finish system.

CNC

Mark Richey Woodworking uses state-of-theart, five-axis CNC routers. These machines allow complex shapes to be made in a single setup, increasing efficiency and reducing errors to achieve unparalleled accuracy.

FINISH

Mark Richey is also home to a robotic finish spraying system that was the first of its kind in the United States. This automated system allows flat panels up to 10 feet in length to be finished efficiently and consistently. The system utilizes heat and UV-curing in a closed chamber for clean, efficient curing. A polishing machine additionally turns opaque and clear finishes to a high gloss with the greatest possible precision.

The most durable finishes available on the worldwide market are utilized. Finish options include two-component catalyzed acrylic polyurethane; polyester; and water-based, UV-curable urethane. All are made in Italy, used by the top manufacturers in Europe and contain no formaldehyde, meaning no off-gassing on site. Acrylic polyurethane is additionally hailed for its ultra clear finish. It goes on clear and contains a UV inhibitor to stay clear over time.

Merge this technology with expert hand craftsmanship for finished results sure to wow.







ENVIRONMENT

Mark Richey Woodworking is one of the greenest manufacturers in the country.

Through on-site wind and solar, the Mark Richey Woodworking factory achieves nearly 100 percent renewable energy production. An on-site 600-kilowatt wind turbine generates 60 percent of the company's total electrical needs and a 500 kilowatt rooftop solar array generates the remaining 40 percent. In addition, a biomass furnace burning sawdust and wood chip waste heats 85,000 square feet of the manufacturing facility, nearly eliminating the consumption of fossil fuel for heating.

Mark Richey Woodworking is Forest Stewardship Council® chain of custody certified. For the East Coast cities of Boston, New York City, Philadelphia and Washington, D.C., Mark Richey Woodworking is an important resource for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) green building certification.

Mark Richey Woodworking's industry-leading commitment to environmental excellence has earned it many awards, accolades and speaking invitations and made it a popular manufacturer to visit, especially coupled with its high-tech equipment and quality craftsmanship.

AWARDS AND OUTREACH

Mark Richey Woodworking gives back to its local and world community through power generation, financial and material donations, and through relief efforts and building projects. Those building and outreach efforts have included sponsoring the building of a school in Afghanistan in 2008. In 2010, Mark Richey assisted with relief efforts in Haiti following an earthquake and ultimately donated all of the millwork for a new, 300-bed teaching hospital and dormitories that opened in 2013. In 2015, the company contributed to relief efforts in Nepal following a major earthquake there. And in 2022, Teresa and Mark Richey traveled to Tanzania with the Himalayan Cataract Project to help restore vision to 300 people suffering needless blindness due to lack of access to cataract surgery.


Locally, Mark Richey, president of Mark Richey Woodworking, has educated school children on sustainable manufacturing and the company designed and made an archway to a nearby trail popular among runners and bikers.

While these outreach efforts often occur quietly, the company's day-to-day work has earned many Architectural Woodwork Institute excellence awards. Green efforts have additionally earned it numerous awards, such as a National Pollution Prevention Roundtable Award in 2017 and a 2018 EPA Merit Award.

Mark Richey Woodworking is a member of the U.S. Green Building Council, certified by the Architectural Woodwork Institute, is Minority/ Women-owned Business Enterprise (M/WBE) certified in Massachusetts and New York City, and nationally Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) certified.
