

Faculty: Prof. Sandra A. Corr and Dr. Ralph Abercromby Foundational orthopaedic skills training covering fracture planning, biomechanics, bone plating, external fixation, and management of open fractures, with a practical "mystery fracture" assessment.



Canine Spinal Disease: Fundamentals to Comprehensive Management

Faculty: Dr. Ana Cloquell Miro & Dr. Adriana Kaczmarska University of Glasgow. An intensive neurology course combining lectures, case discussions, neuro-localisation practice, CSF analysis, neuroimaging interpretation, and cadaver-based spinal surgery (hemilaminectomy and ventral slot).


OUR PARTNERSHIPS















The majestic 34-foot idol — the world's tallest statue of Shrimad Rajchandraji — towers over the spiritual valley.
