

What is a PodVault?



It is a secure, organised digital space within Podplan where you record directions to your important documents, details of your accounts and plans, and guidance on your wishes, all in one place. Think of it as a navigation guide to your later life, not a filing cabinet, but a map of where everything is and who needs to know.

A PodVault typically includes:

PODPLAN



Identity Documents

Where to find your birth certificate, passport, marriage or civil partnership certificate, and National Insurance number, not the documents themselves, but their location.



Financial Records

Bank and building society names, ISA providers, pension schemes, Premium Bonds holder number, and mortgage lender. Account references and who to contact, not login credentials.



Medical Information

NHS number, GP practice details, current medications, known allergies, and specialist contact names, so anyone supporting you in a health situation has what they need immediately.



Household and Property

Utility providers, direct debit details, home insurance policy reference, council tax account, and emergency contacts, the practical information that keeps daily life running.



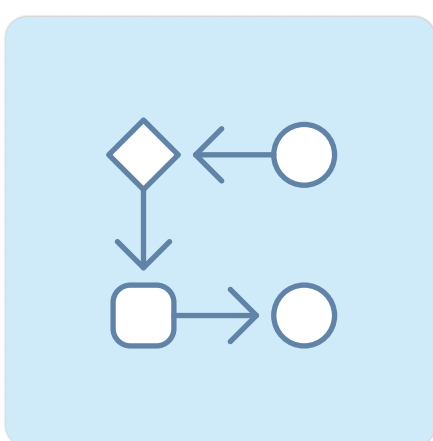
Wishes and Plans

Funeral preferences, care wishes, notes on how you want to live in later life, and guidance on your Advance Decision, your voice, recorded clearly, before decisions become urgent.



Legal Documents

Will, Lasting Power of Attorney (both types), property deeds, and key contact details for your solicitor.



Why it matters

Most families face the hardest decisions at the hardest moments, without knowing where anything is. A PodVault changes that.

It does not store your documents. It tells the people you trust exactly where to find them. Record it carefully. Share it with someone you trust. Update it once a year.

It is one of the most important things you will ever prepare, and one of the simplest.



PodVault does not ask you to upload sensitive documents. Instead, it helps you record where your documents are held.
