
South Carolina Public Opinion Survey -Republican Primary Voters

The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.








If you had to choose, which of these comes closest to how you would describe yourself politically? Sample Size: 600




Would you say you were a Very Conservative, Somewhat Conservative, Moderate, Somewhat Liberal or Very Liberal? Sample Size: 600



What is the highest level of education you have completed?



What is your gender? Sample Size: 600




