During your time in Kenya, you will spend time with the children, staff, and community that you support via Kenya Matters. Activities will include playing games, taking walks, and going on a field trip with the children. You will visit local communities and learn about the life of rural Kenya. We have a three day safari planned to visit the incredible Masai Mara, too!

Those of us who have traveled to Kenya have been so inspired by the generosity and commitment of our Kenyan staff, board, and village neighbors. Of course, the kids at the children's home are always the highlight of our visit.

You will stay near the children's home, with arrangements that include tasty food & colorful culture, fully immersing yourself in the daily life of Kenya. Your trip will be led by our Kenya Matters board president, who has much experience navigating the entire process of visiting East Africa.



THE DETAILS

- Airfare to & from Nairobi, Kenya, cost determined by airfare at the time of reservations. (Approx. \$1200-1500 round trip)
- Lodging, most of your meals, & ground transportation, \$750.
- Safari to the Masai Mara, three days & two nights, including lodging & the majority of your food, approx. \$650.

NEW "JUNIOR SECONDARY" SCHOOL

Since 2017, the Kenyan Government has been transforming the education system by introducing the Competency Based Curriculum (CBC). The structure of the new system means students will spend two years in pre-primary, six years in primary, six years in high school and three years in University (2-6-6-3). This is the first year this system has been implemented and we have Grade 6 students who have now entered Junior Secondary.

We have 5 new high school students this year and we are proud that they all performed very well in their Grade 8 national exams.




