You likely remember that nine months ago, the solar system for the children's home went into operation. Due to the electricity cost savings, other small projects have been completed such as a better security fence and roofing repairs.

As of this writing, the children are thriving. In these pages, read how three of our high school graduates are now beginning new educational opportunities. Other students are preparing for major exams that take place every year. Those going into high school and those who are at the end of their senior year sit for weeklong exams that will determine their future education opportunities. While the end of the year is a time when we ask for extra donor support from you, we have two opportunities right now that could use your attention. (1) A graduate student studying accounting is in need of tuition and housing support. (2) Adding water tanks to the current well & water system has been a goal this year. We simply need additional funds to make it become reality.

Opportunities to Engage

You are invited to join in one of the following projects.

If you attended the Kenya Matters annual event, you heard the story of a young university graduate who is again attending school for a degree that will make her far more marketable in the employment world. On the first of September, she started another semester of post-college education for her CPA.

With the Kenyan economy doing poorly, part-time jobs are difficult to find. She is in need of tuition dollars and monthly living expenses while she is in school for the next three months.

Support Needed

The solar project reduced electricity expenses significantly for the children's home. As with any large project, one accomplishment has led to a hope for the next level of efficiency.

The water pump consumes most of the stored solar power when the sun is not shining. Thus, the batteries are often left depleted when electricity is needed. The Kenyan staff has proposed increasing water storage capacity as a solution so that more pumping of water can take place when the sun is shining. This project will increase efficiency, hopefully bringing our need for power from the grid to nearly zero.

The proposed water tower and tanks, as quoted by a reputable contractor in the Naivasha area, includes a fabricated steel water tower, two 10,000 liter tanks, and capacity to add two additional tanks in the future. Total cost for project: \$4,800

1 ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

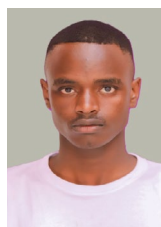
