Dear brothers and sisters,

Earlier this year my uncle Tony died. You could say he was instrumental in my vocation story because one Christmas he gave me a book, 'Seven Story Mountain' by Thomas Merton. It was the right book at the wrong time. I didn't read it until years later. Then it became the right book at the right time. I read it and I was different because I had. The right book at the right time has the power to change us, even the very direction of our lives. That book awakened a desire planted deep in my heart, to give myself to something, Someone, without reservation, Someone worthy of everything.

As I prepared to move to London last month I did what we friars call a 'poverty check'. My aim was to carry everything from Derry to London, via plane and train. I managed to do it with the exception of a box of letters and cards which I shipped over the sea. In that box I came across a letter from my uncle Tony, the only one I have from him. He wrote it after I celebrated a Mass of Thanksgiving in Sydney after my ordination to the priesthood in 2018. In the letter he writes:

'Who can fathom the mystery of the human soul and the manner of each in response to the infusion of God's grace? I fancy there is a commonality in the nature of our saints that they possess simultaneously dual aspects of the vigor of youth and the wisdom of age. The natural course for most of us is that the disciplines of the latter (wisdom of age) are in part at least, learned through the loss of the former (vigor of youth).



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Pride is a willing bed fellow of self and like the cunning cat creeps back unseen each time we think we have put it out.'

Our two new saints, St. Carlo Acutis and St. Pier Giorgio Frassati, possessed 'simultaneously the vigor of youth and the wisdom of age'. How? At some point they killed the cat - pride. Or they allowed the cat to be killed. By who? Jesus Christ. Pride went, humility found a home in them. Not their own humility, but the humility of Jesus Christ, whom they welcomed as the Divine Guest of their souls. Humility Incarnate, Love Incarnate, Wisdom Incarnate, was welcomed by young Carlo (died age 15) and young Pier Giorgio (died age 24). No doubt pride once had a place in each of them (as it does in each of us born with a good but wounded human nature), but pride is no match for the humility of Christ.

May the two new saints show us by their example and help us by their prayers to welcome afresh the Humble, Wise, and ever Youthful One. Why not right now? And give Him permission to make us saints. Because what else is there?


