Dear Brother and Sisters,

We've had some good questions from high school students over the last few weeks. During a recent school visit, there was time for Q & A with the 6^{th} Form students. One question has stayed with me.

'What is the hardest thing you've had to overcome?'

The question came from a young man whose face revealed complete sincerity. Maybe that - the quality of the one who asked the question - along with the quality of the question itself, is why it has stayed with me.

The question has provoked another question: Why must things be overcome at all? And another:

Why not simply follow every whim, suggestion and inclination - just go with the flow?

To answer that I need only attend to my experience:

Where does going with the flow of every whim, suggestion and inclination take me?

Being human includes experiencing inclinations in one direction and yet being called (or invited or summoned) in another direction. I can be bent one way and meant for another. I might be enticed to sin, but I am called to virtue. This tension is one of the lingering effects of original sin. There is a narrow gate and a hard road that leads to life and a wide gate and easy road that leads to death. Jesus told us that (see Mt 7:13-14). Human experience confirms it. Overcoming is essential.

'What is the hardest thing you've had to overcome?'

There are many ways I could answer that. During the high school visit, I mentioned a few things – fears, lies, temptations, the seven capital sins, ultimately self. It's not finished yet.

And once we identify what needs to be overcome, how do we overcome?

'You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, beware lest you be carried away with the error of lawless men and lose your own stability. But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen' (2 Peter 3:17-18).
