ESG BEYOND WHAT WE MEASURE

ESG was meant to go beyond financial returns and embed responsibility into decision-making.

Yet today, ESG often focuses on what is easiest to measure emissions, assets, and outputs.

***What we measure well is delivery.
What we measure poorly is why impact lasts or fades.***



WHAT ESG REPORTS OFTEN MISS

Real ESG outcomes depend on invisible systems:

- Institutional capacity and leadership
- Community trust and ownership
- Behavioural norms and local accountability



A solar panel, sanitation system, or waste solution succeeds only when these systems are in place.



WHEN EVALUATION LOOKS BEYOND OUTPUTS

- Applied ESG evaluations show that sustainability depends on more than infrastructure.
- Institutional readiness, community engagement, and operational capacity determine whether environmental gains endure.
- When ESG evaluation integrates qualitative insights with metrics, it reveals what truly sustains impact.



FROM COMPLIANCE TO CAPABILITY

The future of ESG lies in asking better questions:

- Can systems sustain themselves?
- Who maintains assets once projects end?
- How does governance work on the ground?



ESG must evolve from scores to systems making invisible enablers visible, valued, and strengthened.
