






TREK.TRAVEL. ADVENTURE.

EVEREST BASE CAMP [PREMIUM] TREK 9TH MAY 2025



Eight close friends from Bengaluru had been dreaming and preparing for this journey for months. Their dedication showed from the early morning training sessions to the quiet encouragement they gave each other on the trail. You could feel the excitement and readiness in every step they took.



But the mountains, as always, had their own story to tell. A few members couldn't complete the final stretch, but the group's spirit never wavered. They supported one another through every challenge and stood at Everest Base Camp, reliving all the moments they had planned for.





ANNAPURNA BASE CAMP [PREMIUM] TREK 3RD MAY 2025



At 70+, most people settle into comfort. But for this decorated Army veteran from Ferozepur, Punjab, the call of the mountains was louder than ever.

This May, he started on a solo journey to Annapurna Base Camp through a trail of rhododendron forests, remote Himalayan hamlets, and beautiful views of Annapurna I, Machapuchare, and Hiunchuli.



No stranger to endurance, he's a long-distance cyclist and had trekked the Valley of Flowers with us last year. That experience lit a spark within him, one that brought him back, seeking something more deeper experience.

If he can walk into the mountains at 70 for the joy of it, what's stopping you? Experience the beauty of Annapurna Base Camp with us.





ANNAPURNA CIRCUIT TREK [PREMIUM] 10TH MAY 2025



This trek felt quite personal for us. Three friends who had previously trekked Everest Base Camp with another operator chose to walk with us this time. They had seen how we run our treks before, and this time, they said, "We want to do Annapurna with you". It's a real joy for us to be part of their journey and witness the bonds they build along the way.

Over 14 days of diverse terrain, from lush subtropical forests to high alpine deserts. They journeyed together through winding villages. One friend even flew in from halfway across the world just to be on this trail with his close buddies.

EVEREST BASE CAMP [PREMIUM] TREK 15TH MAY 2025



No noise. No crowds. This time, the trail was a peaceful escape from a lowseason Everest Base Camp trek with a small, diverse group from across India. Over 12 days of steady walking through stunning Himalayan landscapes, there were no queues at suspension bridges, steady rhythm iust the of boots crunching on gravel and the ever-Khumbu wind present whispering through the valleys.



They reached Base Camp safely, soaking in the iconic panorama of towering peaks and prayer flags fluttering in the cold breeze. But rather, they pushed further to the Advanced Base Camp, catching rare glimpses of the route that mountaineers brave on their quest for the summit.



A PLACE THAT CHANGED US BEFORE WE EVEN WENT THERE - LADAKH







Kang Yatse II Expedition (6250M) - For the Trekkers Who Are Ready for the Next Chapter


If you've done 5,000m+ treks and are looking for the next big summit - this is it.
