Annual Security Report – Delta College

Campus Security Authority & Crime Reporting Procedures

Delta College maintains a commitment to campus security and encourages immediate reporting of all criminal actions and emergencies. Students, employees, and visitors must report all known or suspected crimes and emergencies immediately. The Campus Director at each location serves as the primary Campus Security Authority (CSA) and coordinates with designated staff to monitor and record information related to reports.

Reports should be made as follows:

- 1. **For Emergencies (Immediate Threat):** Contact Local Law Enforcement (911) and then immediately notify the Campus Director.
- 2. **For Non-Emergencies or Crime Reporting:** Contact the Campus Director or an Academic Affairs Officer directly.
- 3. **Confidential Reporting:** Students and employees may report crimes or suspicious activity confidentially to the Campus Director or the Provost. The College will make every effort to respect requests for confidentiality but must weigh this against the obligation to protect the health and safety of the community. In such cases, the College will assess available information to determine the necessity of issuing a Timely Warning without revealing the victim's identity.

Timely Warnings and Emergency Notifications

Delta College will issue a Timely Warning to the campus community when a Clery Act crime is reported and confirmed to pose a serious or ongoing threat to students and employees. The College will issue an Emergency Notification upon confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of students or employees occurring on campus. The decision to issue an alert is made by the Campus Director in consultation with the CEO/Provost.

Timely Warnings and Emergency Notifications will be disseminated as quickly as possible, usually through a combination of:

- 1. Campus-wide Email: Sent to all students and employees.
- 2. **Text Alerts:** Sent to all individuals subscribed to the College's emergency text system.
- 3. **In-person Notification:** Verbal announcements in classrooms and office areas, where appropriate.

Dissemination to the Larger Community

In the event of an ongoing or serious threat, information will be disseminated to the larger community, including prospective students, visitors, and vendors, who are not on the College's primary alert list, through the following channels:

- College Website Posting: A prominent alert banner or dedicated news post will be placed on the Delta College homepage (e.g., www.deltacollege.com). This serves as the official and most reliable public channel for emergency information.
- Local Law Enforcement Notification: If necessary, local law enforcement agencies will be notified. Communication to the larger local community will then be executed through the appropriate public information channels utilized by law enforcement personnel.

Annual Emergency Program Testing Procedure

The institution is required by the Clery Act to test its emergency response and evacuation procedures, including the emergency notification system, on at least an **annual basis**. The objective of this procedure is to evaluate the preparedness of the campus community and the functionality of the College's emergency systems.

Test Planning and Approval

Responsibility: Campus Director in consultation with the CEO/Provost.

The annual test will incorporate the following mandatory testing components to ensure comprehensive evaluation:

- 1. **Full Evacuation Drill:** The procedure must include at least one full, announced evacuation drill of the facilities each year. This drill must evaluate the speed and efficiency of the community's response to an evacuation order.
- 2. **Emergency Notification System Test:** The procedure must test all components of the institution's emergency communication system, including text alerts, emails, and any public address systems. This test must verify the system's ability to reach the entire campus community promptly.
- 3. **Shelter-in-Place/Lockdown Component:** The test must include a scenario or component that evaluates the community's ability to follow directions for a shelter-in-place or lockdown, simulating a non-evacuation response (e.g., active threat or severe weather).

The final plan incorporating these components, along with the schedule and necessary external notifications, must be submitted to the CEO/Provost for final approval prior to execution.

Community Notification

The College will issue advance notice to all students and employees (via email and website) at least 24 hours prior to the drill. This notice must clearly state the date, time, and emphasize that the event is a scheduled test to prevent undue alarm. The Campus Director will also establish and communicate the distinct method for issuing the "All Clear" or "End of Drill" message.

Execution of the Test

- 1. **Initiate Emergency Alert:** The Campus Director will trigger the emergency notification system (text, email, loudspeaker) as outlined in the plan. The initial alert message must prominently and unambiguously use the word "EXERCISE" or "DRILL."
- 2. **Direct Evacuation:** The Campus Director will initiate the full evacuation drill, requiring all occupants to follow posted evacuation routes, proceed immediately to their designated assembly points, and report their presence to their instructor or supervisor.
- 3. **Monitor and Observe:** The Campus Director will observe and record key metrics, including the time taken for the initial alert, the time taken for the building to fully evacuate, and the efficiency of employee and student accountability procedures.
- 4. **Issue "All Clear":** The Campus Director will officially end the drill using the designated "All Clear" notification channel, signifying the safe return to normal operations.

Documentation and Review

- 1. **Post-Test Review:** Within 30 days of the test, the Campus Director will review the collected metrics and observer reports to identify any weaknesses in the plan, execution, or equipment functionality.
- 2. **Documentation:** The Campus Director will formally document the test date, time, drill scenario, results, and a list of all identified deficiencies. This official documentation must be maintained for a minimum of seven (7) years as required by the Clery Act.
- 3. **Implementation of Changes:** The Campus Director is responsible for updating the emergency response and evacuation program/policy to correct the deficiencies identified during the annual test, ensuring continuous improvement in campus safety.

Crime Prevention and Awareness Programs Alcohol and Drug Policies

The unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol is strictly prohibited on Delta College property and during all College-sponsored activities. The College complies with all applicable federal, state, and local laws regarding alcohol and drug possession. Violations of this policy will result in disciplinary action up to and including immediate termination of enrollment (per the Student Conduct policy in the catalog), and referral to appropriate law enforcement authorities.

Drug and Alcohol Abuse Education:

The College provides educational materials and programming on drug and alcohol abuse prevention, including the health risks associated with substance abuse, College policies, and available counseling/rehabilitation resources. This information is distributed to all new and continuing students and employees annually through orientation and published materials.

Title IX

The college prohibits all forms of illegal discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and coercion on campus and at college related activities and functions. The college is required to investigate all allegations regarding sexual misconduct under Title IX. Sexual misconduct incorporates a wide range of behaviors including sexual assault (which includes rape and any kind of nonconsensual sexual contact), sexual harassment, intimate partner violence, stalking, voyeurism, and any other conduct of a sexual nature that is nonconsensual, or has the purpose or effect of threatening, intimidating, or coercing another person. Hostile Environment Harassment: Unwelcome sex-based conduct that, based on the totality of the circumstances, is subjectively and objectively offensive and is so severe or pervasive that it limits or denies a person's ability to participate in or benefit from the recipient's education program or activity (i.e., creates a hostile environment). Whether a hostile environment has been created is a fact-specific inquiry that includes consideration of the following: (i) The degree to which the conduct affected the complainant's ability to access the recipient's education program or activity; (ii) The type, frequency, and duration of the conduct; (iii) The parties' ages, roles within the recipient's education program or activity, previous interactions, and other factors about each party that may be relevant to evaluating the effects of the conduct; (iv) The location

of the conduct and the context in which the conduct occurred; and (v) Other sex-based harassment in the recipient's education program or activity.

Sexual Harassment: Unwelcome behavior of a sexual nature including unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature.

Sexual Violence: Any physical act which is sexual in nature that is committed by force or without the full and informed consent of all persons involved.

Consent: Words or overt actions by a person who is competent to give informed consent indicating a freely given agreement to have sexual intercourse or sexual contact.

Dating/Domestic Violence: Any of the following engaged or threatened to be engaged in by an adult against another adult living with or in a dating relationship with the person:

- -Intentional impairment of physical condition
- -First, Second or Third Degree Sexual Assault
- -Whoever intentionally causes damage to any physical property of another without the person's consent

Stalking: Behavior directed at a specific person(s) that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety or the safety of others or suffer substantial emotional distress.

Voyeurism: Practice of spying on people engaged in intimate behaviors, such as undressing, sexual activity, or other actions usually considered to be of a private nature.

Help & Support: Emergency (911), law enforcement reporting, institutional reporting (Title IX Coordinator, Campus Director), anonymous reporting, and confidential support resources. Reporting to the College is independent of reporting to law enforcement; the College will assist with contacting law enforcement upon request. Victims receive written notification of rights, options, and available supportive measures and accommodations.

On-Campus

If you fear for your immediate safety, contact 911.

Note that by law, all staff are mandated to report any potential Title IX violations for investigation.

Off-Campus

Contact your local Police Department to report abuse and to help keep yourself safe, 911 or the non-emergency number. Any of the on-or off-campus resources can assist in finding information about legal options such as filing a protective/harassment order. Even if you do not plan on talking to anyone on campus about the incident, please submit a report form. This information will help the college obtain a more accurate picture of violence that is happening on and around campus.

Bystander Intervention

The college believes that risky, potentially dangerous situations can be avoided if a bystander witnesses the event and steps in to intervene. The college encourages students who observe a concerning situation to move past being a bystander and become active.

Here are some tips to become an active bystander:

- Dial 911
- Tell a staff person what you observed
- Submit a report.
- Yell for help
- Intervene directly, if you feel you can safely do so
- Ask a victim if he/she is OK and actively listen to them without telling them what to do

Emergency Alert System: Our campus currently uses Student First, the College's student information system, to initiate outreach for emergency alerts. In addition, supplemental announcements and updates may be distributed through our social media platforms and Canvas, the College's learning management system. The College will, without delay and taking into account the safety of the community, determine the content of the notification and initiate the notification system, unless issuing a notification would, in the professional judgment of responsible authorities, compromise efforts to assist a victim or to contain, respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency. The Campus Director and/or Corporate Office is responsible for initiating emergency notifications.

Alcoholic Beverages: Alcohol is prohibited on campus and at College activities. Violations may result in disciplinary action up to suspension/expulsion or termination. See the College's Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program (DAAPP) for standards of conduct, legal sanctions, health risks, available counseling/treatment, and disciplinary sanctions. The DAAPP is distributed annually and reviewed biennially for effectiveness and consistency of enforcement.

Illegal Drugs or Weapons: Illegal drugs and unlawful possession or use of controlled substances are prohibited. Weapons are prohibited on College property and at College activities, subject to state law exceptions. Violations may result in disciplinary action up to suspension/expulsion or termination and referral to law enforcement.

Annual Security Reports

The ASR includes three years of Clery crime statistics and required policy statements and is distributed to all current students and employees by October 1. It is available to prospective students and employees upon request and on the College website at deltacollege.com. Statistics are submitted annually via the U.S. Department of Education Campus Safety and Security site at https://survey.ope.ed.gov/campussafety. Clery geography includes on-campus property, noncampus buildings or property, and public property immediately adjacent to and accessible from campus.

Title IX Formal Resolution Process Flowchart

This document is an overview of the *Title IX* formal resolution process. For specific procedures, see the current *school catalog* available at www.deltacollege.com.

- The Title IX complaint process is initiated by the alleged victim (hereafter referred to as the "complainant"), appropriate Title IX coordinator, or an official with the authority to institute corrective measures on behalf of the school.
- To file a complaint, the complainant contacts the appropriate Title IX coordinator or deputy Title IX coordinator or submit compliant to titleIX@deltacollege.com.
- · If reported orally, the complaint is reduced to writing by the appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee.
- The complaint must contain the complainant's actual or digital signature. If the complainant is not willing or able
 to willing to sign the complaint, the appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee signs the complaint in the
 complainant's stead.
- Retaliation against any participant (complainant, respondent, or witness) is strictly prohibited and subject to disciplinary action
- All records related to complaints, investigations, hearings, appeals, and supportive measures will be maintained for at least seven years, in accordance with federal regulations.

- The appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee promptly contacts the complainant and offers the notice of supportive measures (as outlined in school catalog).
- These supportive measures and resources are available to the complainant whether or not they choose to file a formal complaint.
- In the event a formal complaint is filed, and the appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee determines an investigation should be initiated, supportive measures are also offered to the respondent.
- All supportive measures offered and provided will be documented regardless of whether a formal
 complaint is filed.

Determination to Proceed with an Investigation

- The appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee determines whether the allegation(s): 1. occurred while participating in or attempting to participate in the school's education program or activity, 2. impacted a person in the United States, and/or 3. if proven, would meet the definition of prohibited conduct.
- If the allegations meet the criteria defined above, the appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee assigns an appropriate individual(s) to investigate the complaint.
- If the allegation(s) should be addressed through another school process, the appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee forwards the complaint to the appropriate party.
- If the allegations do not meet one (1) or more of the criteria listed above, the complaint is dismissed. Additionally, the school may dismiss a complaint at any time if: 1. the complainant would like to withdraw the complaint, 2. the respondent is no longer enrolled at or employed by the school, or 3. specific circumstances prevent the school from gathering evidence sufficient to reach a determination.

Investigation

- The respondent is presumed to be not responsible for the alleged misconduct until a written determination is made at the conclusion of the Title IX complaint process.
- The burden of gathering evidence and burden of proof falls on the investigator, not the parties.
- The investigator notifies the parties of their rights and options.
- The investigator meets separately with each party and their respective advisors (if the parties elect to provide their own advisors during this phase).
- The investigator meets separately with each witness.
 - The investigator engages in an individualized safety and risk analysis to determine whether interim action(s) are appropriate and may recommend interim action(s) to the appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee. If the interim action(s) include a removal (e.g., temporary immediate suspension, temporary removal from the school premises, temporary employee administrative leave, etc.), the respondent has the right to challenge the interim action(s) immediately after the removal.

Investigation Report

- At the conclusion of the investigation, the investigator writes an *Investigation Report* that fairly summarizes the investigation and includes all evidence.
- The investigator sends the parties and their respective advisors (if the parties elect to provide their own advisors during this phase) the *Investigation Report* in electronic format or hard copy, and gives them 10 days to respond to the document prior to finalizing it.
- The investigator finalizes the Investigation Report at least 10 days prior to the live hearing.
- The investigator notifies the parties and their respective advisors (if the parties elect to provide their own advisors during this phase) simultaneously in writing of the final *Investigation Report*, and sends a copy of the document to them in electronic format or hard copy.

Live Hearing

- The investigation is followed by a live hearing.
- If a party is unable to obtain an advisor, the appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee assigns an appropriate advisor to the party for the purpose of conducting cross-examination for the party during the live hearing.
- The appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee notifies the parties and their respective advisors simultaneously in writing of the date, time, and place of the live hearing.
- Specific procedures for the live hearing, including time limits for statements, rebuttal, and cross-examination, will be provided to the parties and their respective advisors prior to the live hearing.
- The appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee assigns an individual(s) from the pool of hearing officers to conduct the live hearing.
- The hearing officer deliberates on the evidence, determines responsibility using the preponderance of the evidence standard (i.e., more likely than not to have occurred), and composes a Written Determination of Responsibility.

Appeal

- Either the complainant or respondent may appeal the hearing officer's determination within 10 school business days on the following grounds: 1. procedural irregularity that affected the outcome, 2. new evidence not reasonably available that could affect the outcome, or 3. conflict of interest or bias by the school's participants that affected the outcome.
- The appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee notifies the non-appealing party the other party has appealed and allows them to submit a written statement in response.
- The appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee assigns the appropriate vice president or designee to serve as the appeal decision-maker.
- The appropriate designee deliberates on the evidence, makes a determination using the preponderance
 of the evidence standard (i.e., more likely than not to have occurred), and composes an Appeal

Expulsion and Termination Appeals

- In cases where expulsion of a student or termination of an employee is recommended, either party may appeal by submitting a written request to the appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee within 10 school business days of the appeal decision-maker's determination.
- The appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee notifies the non-appealing party the other party has appealed and allows them to submit a written statement in response.
- The appropriate Title IX coordinator or designee forwards all information regarding the case to the school president or designee.
- The school president or designee deliberates on the evidence and makes a determination to affirm, modify, remand, or reverse the recommendation for expulsion or termination.
- The school president or designee's decision is final and non-appealable.

Campus Facility Security

Delta College's primary focus for facility security is maintaining a safe and accessible environment during operational hours. All exterior doors are secured when the College is closed. During hours of operation, Campus Directors and designated staff ensure that facilities are appropriately monitored. Security measures include:

- **Key Control:** Access to classrooms and administrative areas is restricted to authorized personnel.
- Lighting: Parking lots and walkways are regularly inspected to ensure adequate lighting.
- **Security Awareness:** New students receive an orientation on security best practices, and the Annual Security Report provides details on safety procedures.

VAWA Offenses (Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking)

Delta College is committed to providing a learning and working environment free from sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking (collectively, "Sexual Misconduct"). The College prohibits all forms of Sexual Misconduct as defined in its internal Title IX and Student Conduct policies. The formal resolution process is outlined in the TITLE IX FORMAL RESOLUTION PROCESS FLOWCHART (catalog pages 52-53). Any individual found responsible for committing an act of Sexual Misconduct will face institutional disciplinary action, up to and including expulsion or termination of employment.

Victims of Sexual Misconduct are entitled to immediate interim measures and reasonable accommodations, which may include academic schedule adjustments, withdrawal without penalty, and assistance connecting with counseling and legal services.

Prevention and Awareness Programs:

The College conducts mandatory prevention and awareness programs for all students and employees. These programs include training on:

- Institutional definitions of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.
- Bystander intervention strategies.
- Risk reduction resources and strategies, which focus on practical steps individuals can take to enhance their personal safety and security. These resources include advice on:
 - Secure Communication: Utilizing privacy settings on personal devices and social media.
 - Safe Transportation: Using campus escort services, trusted ride-sharing apps, or walking with a group.
 - o Boundary Setting: Techniques for clearly and firmly communicating one's limits and recognizing manipulative behaviors.
 - o Situational Awareness: Strategies for remaining alert to one's surroundings, avoiding isolated areas, and trusting one's instincts.
- Reporting options and procedures (confidential and formal).
- Victim services and resources available on and off campus.

Academic Accommodations

The institution will provide assistance to students in adjusting their academic schedule and situation. Available accommodations include, but are not limited to:

- Course Changes: Assistance in withdrawing from a course without penalty, receiving an incomplete grade, or making arrangements to finish course requirements at a later date.
- Class Scheduling: Assistance in arranging a modified class schedule, including changing course sections or moving courses to a different format (e.g., online).
- Access to Tutors: Providing access to alternative tutoring or academic support services.
- Extension Requests: Facilitating extensions on papers, assignments, and exams.

On-Campus Living Accommodations

Delta College does not own or operate any on-campus housing facilities. Therefore, the institution cannot provide on-campus housing changes.

However, to ensure the victim's overall well-being and safety, the institution will provide immediate assistance by:

- Referral to Community Resources: Providing a written list of available local domestic violence shelters, safe housing options, and community-based organizations that specialize in emergency and temporary housing assistance.
- Assistance with Transportation: Coordinating with local services and utilizing available campus transportation options to facilitate movement to and from a safe off-campus location.
- Safety Planning: Working with the victim to develop a comprehensive safety plan that addresses concerns related to their off-campus residence.

Transportation Accommodations

The institution will assist victims in securing safe transportation options as necessary. Available accommodations include, but are not limited to:

- **Parking Changes:** Assistance with changing campus parking locations or permits if safety is a concern.
- **Travel Assistance:** Coordinating with local law enforcement or community services to assist with necessary off-campus transportation.

Working/Employment Accommodations

For employees or students who hold on-campus jobs (including student employment, workstudy, or graduate assistantships), the institution will provide assistance in adjusting their working situation. Available accommodations include, but are not limited to:

- Work Location Change: Assistance in changing the physical location of the victim's employment (if an institutional employee) assignment.
- Leave Requests: Assistance in arranging for a temporary leave of absence.
