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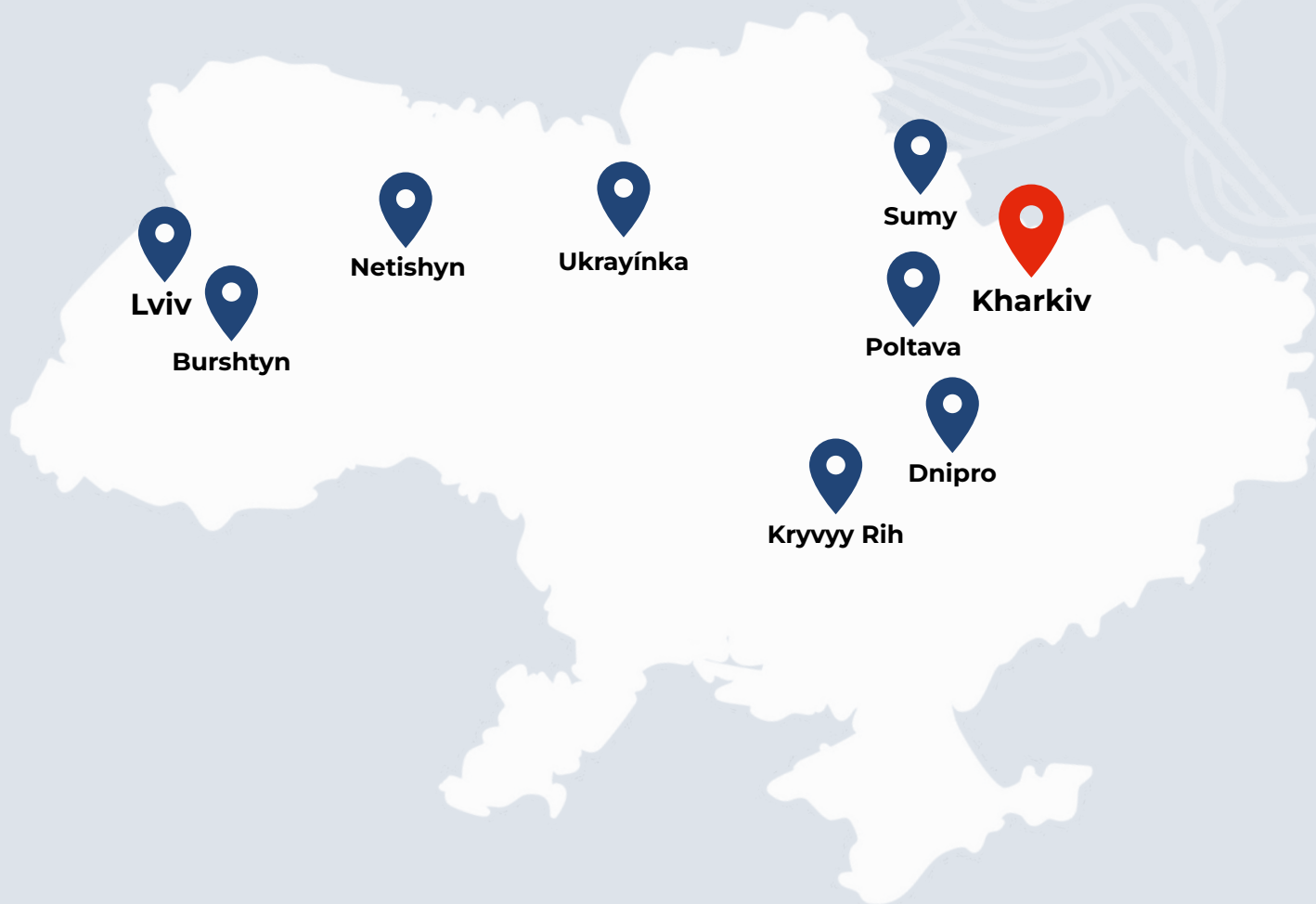

In 2024, Mission Kharkiv continued its program, prioritizing uninterrupted treatment access for patients in combat zones. We significantly increased the volume of reserved medication courses, ensuring patients maintained consistent therapy and felt confident in their ongoing treatment.

Throughout the year, 193 new patients received assistance, with the total number of dispensed doses reaching 2,730. Significantly, 2024 saw the program's first-time dispensing of the innovative drug Keytruda. This expands treatment options for complex cases, aligning Ukrainian oncology patients with modern therapy standards.

Patient Feedback

Women, 37 years old, from Kharkiv city

I want to thank you for the help you provided in obtaining my medication. It has been several months since I received the infusion at the hospital. The reason I am writing this review only now is that I wanted to track my well-being and analyze my health over time to truly see how much the drug helped. Now, I can say that I am still in remission. I feel well and am happy to be living a normal, healthy life, finally free from the frequent relapses that required hospitalization—I had three in the last year alone. Thank you so much to Mission Kharkiv for helping me obtain this medication. I am hopeful that in six months, when I need the next infusion, you will be able to help me again. You are doing wonderful work by helping patients. I wish your team good health and continued success in your efforts. Selfless assistance is exactly what everyone needs in these times.

Women, 49 years old, from Kharkiv city

My village has been under occupation since February 2022. During the occupation, my husband, who was a police officer, was tortured to death for refusing to collaborate with the occupiers. After our village was liberated in September 2023, my daughter and I moved to the city of Kharkiv. While living here, we discovered that my daughter has a genetic disease, leukodystrophy, and is a person with a disability. I am the only working member of our family, so I am under significant financial strain and my own health is deteriorating. Thank you for your help! Without exaggeration, Mission Kharkiv helped me overcome an incredibly difficult stage of my life and contributed to my daughter's recovery, for which I am immensely grateful. Mission Kharkiv ready to help in such a difficult time and save lives. Thank you so much once again!"

Men, 80 years old

Despite my age, I was a very healthy man and in good physical shape. Then, suddenly, an unexpected illness struck. It came out of nowhere, and my health deteriorated rapidly. I couldn't perform basic daily tasks and started forgetting everything. It was a very difficult time. But thanks to my treatment, and specifically the medication I receive from 'Mission Kharkiv,' I have started to feel much better.

Woman, 48 years old

With the start of the full-scale war, there were many stressful situations that took a heavy toll on my emotional state. My husband defended the country from the very first days, and in early July 2022, he was captured. I lived with constant stress and uncertainty.

In October 2023, a common cold developed into a persistent cough, and my thyroid gland became visibly enlarged. That was the first time since the war began that I went to see a doctor in Kharkiv. It took about three months of various examinations to get a diagnosis. I have now been diagnosed with Non-Hodgkin's diffuse B-cell lymphoma and am undergoing chemotherapy.

Men, 52 years old, from Kharkiv region

My name is Serhii. My house in the Izium district was completely destroyed, all my property was lost, and the land we owned is mined.

In December 2022, I suffered a concussion, and then in 2023, I was diagnosed with cancer.

Inclusive Equipment

In 2024, we continued to implement the "Inclusive Equipment" program, which has become a reliable pillar of support for hundreds of people with disabilities in the Kharkiv region. Amidst the war and an unstable humanitarian situation, we remained dedicated to caring for those who most need assistance in their daily lives.

Throughout the year, equipment was provided to 397 beneficiaries—individuals who received wheelchairs, orthopedic mattresses, walkers, crutches, shower chairs, commodes, hearing aids, and other aids that restore mobility, comfort, and dignity.

We adhered to the principle of an individualized approach, ensuring that each person received precisely what would genuinely ease their daily life.

Save the Workers

In 2024, the "Save The Workers" project significantly expanded its scope, both in terms of the number of workers reached and its impact on the safety of critical infrastructure in Ukraine. We continued to provide enterprises with first-aid kits designed to stop critical bleeding during missile and mine-explosive attacks.

These kits were made available free of charge to employees of enterprises who provide vital services to the population daily.

Mission Kharkiv's team of instructors continued to conduct training sessions on providing pre-medical aid using our first-aid kits.

Project Expenses accounted for 5.01% (€515,784.56) of the total budget. This category covers the costs associated with implementing all projects. Despite amounting to over half a million euros, its relatively small share of the overall budget highlights the high operational efficiency of project management, as the majority of funds are directed straight to core activities rather than overhead.

Oncological Drug Distribution represented the largest portion of the budget, accounting for 94.8% (€9,770,852.18) of the total. This substantial investment was dedicated to the "Ukraine Cancer Relief" program, which focused on providing free-of-charge anti-tumor medication and other supportive medical drugs to cancer patients across Ukraine. In 2024, the program prioritized ensuring uninterrupted treatment access, especially for patients in combat zones, by significantly increasing the volume of reserved medication courses.

Charitable Aid constituted a small but significant portion of the budget, making up 0.04% (€3,957.66). This funding supported various humanitarian efforts. Although it represents a minor share of the overall expenditure, it highlights the organization's commitment to addressing diverse, perhaps smaller-scale but crucial, needs that fall outside the main priority areas.
