This *Handbook* provides a systematic and comprehensive overview of resource nationalism, interrogating the scale and scope of how mineral-producing societies implement various forms of resource sovereignty. Leading experts in the field explore the theory, practice and historical evolution of resource nationalism across diverse geographies, commodities and time periods.

Contributing authors present a comparative assessment of international resource governance strategies, outlining the role of natural resources in shaping the global supply chains of energy transition and advanced manufacturing. Chapters consider legal, political economy and sociological dimensions, while examining the varying forms of state-society relations embedded in the extractives sector. The *Handbook* provides a commodity-specific analysis of resource governance and development, namely concerning the extraction of oil and gas, platinum group metals, tin and nickel. Drawing on key global case studies, it investigates the long-term implications of efforts to resolve the climate emergency whilst managing strategic competition among international powers.

The *Handbook of Resource Nationalism* is a valuable resource for scholars and students of comparative political economy, development studies, sociology and public policy. It is also highly relevant to policymakers, policy advocates and third sector researchers interested in understanding resource governance, politics, initiatives and outcomes.

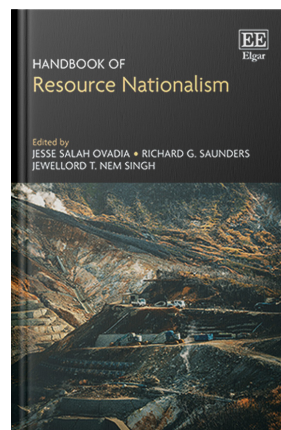
