

Clinton Community College's College Advancement Program (CAP)

Program Overview

The College Advancement Program (CAP) provides high school students with an exciting opportunity to get a head start on their college education through concurrent enrollment at Clinton Community College. Students will build a transferable transcript, accepted by many colleges. Students will adhere to college-approved syllabi for course expectations, projects, and exams.

Registration Process

Students register for CAP through a straightforward 3-step process while in school:

1. Apply to Clinton Community College as a new student (one-time process)
2. Select and register for desired course(s) in Fall and Spring
3. Complete the certificate of residence each year

Tuition and Payment Information

The cost per course depends on the number of credits attached to the course. Courses are 3 or 4 credits for full-year and semester long courses. CCC offers a significantly reduced rate of \$70 per college credit and offers a scholarship for financially qualifying students. PHS can also offer financial assistance through grant funds to financially qualified students. Students will pay Clinton Community College directly using their Online Portal or submit mail-in payment.

Important Notes

- Some PHS courses may be equivalent to two CCC courses
- For multi-course equivalents, students can register for the second course during Spring registration
- Students must re-enroll if they choose to attend CCC after high school with a scholarship available to CAP participants
