



From June 1–15, One Mississippi's flagship program, **River Days of Action**, delivered its largest impact yet for people, land, water, and wildlife. Vital habitat cleaned up and restored, communities united for collective impact, individuals, organizations, businesses, Tribal Nations, and governments taking action.

Now in its sixth year, **the Mississippi River's largest collective impact and event series** leans on the founding expression of the United States: *E pluribus unum*; from many, one. Like the Mighty Mississippi with tributaries flowing together, we reach our grandeur by uniting, becoming something bigger than anything we could achieve alone.

The numbers tell a powerful story:



National Mississippi River Day: A Rising Wave of Impact

In its second year, **National Mississippi River Day on June 2**, a new cornerstone of River Days of Action, continues to grow into a mighty wave from the Headwaters to the Gulf. A record-setting **30 states, cities, counties, and a Tribal government** issued official proclamations, recognizing the central role the River plays in our lives and committing to taking action on its behalf.

Our growth this year included several Lower River communities: Louisiana proclaimed the day statewide, and major metros, including New Orleans, Baton Rouge, and Memphis, joined the movement. In the headwaters region, the Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe became the first Tribal government to proclaim the day, recognizing the River whose story has always been woven with Indigenous peoples.

Together, these proclamations are public commitments to the River's people, land, water, and wildlife, not just official declarations.



From the 2026 National Mississippi River Day Proclamation:
"The Mississippi River is at the heart of our nation's history, culture, and economy...From the wild rice beds at the Mississippi's headwaters in Minnesota to the oyster reefs at its mouth in Louisiana, the River sustains millions of people, provides critical habitat for diverse wildlife, and is a vital artery for commerce and recreation."

Stories from Along the River

There's no single way to care for our Mighty Mississippi, and River Days of Action embraces that range: communities showed up in ways reflecting their own histories, cultures, and landscapes, united in action for the River we all share.

In Dubuque, Iowa, that meant a traditional Ojibwe water blessing ceremony on the Riverbank open to all, alongside *Climate Rendezvous!* and *100 Rivers: Signals of Repair*, a month-long public art installation that culminated in a community performance at the Dubuque Farmers Market. As Victoria Bradford Styrbicki, Executive Director of A House Unbuilt, put it, "Connecting people with the River is at the heart of my work, bringing the River to the people so the people may go to the River."

Downstream in New Orleans, Louisiana, River Days of Action became the launchpad for a new way of understanding how the Mississippi itself is governed. The Tulane Institute on Water Resources Law and Policy (TIWRLP) hosted a webinar introducing its new *Law of the Mississippi River* online resource, helping community members and policymakers alike navigate the complex laws that shape the River. As TIWRLP's Associate Director Haley Gentry shared, "The webinar's discussion generated valuable feedback that will make the new tool even more accessible and effective."

Two events, a thousand miles apart, told the same story in different languages: art and ceremony in one place, policy and governance in another. **Positive impacts don't only stay in one part of the River;** they travel the whole system, becoming something greater than any one community could accomplish alone.

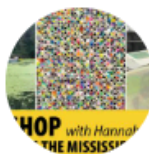

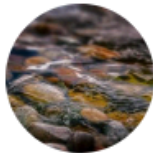

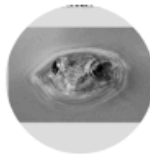

About River Days of Action and National Mississippi River Day

One Mississippi's River Days of Action engages organizations and individuals to take meaningful action for the people, land, water, and wildlife in their communities. Held annually June 1-15, events and actions take place along the Mississippi River and throughout the watershed, and include restoration projects, cleanups, in-person and online educational events, paddling and other recreational outings, and more.

National Mississippi River Day, held annually on June 2, is part of River Days of Action.

Launched by One Mississippi in 2025 in partnership with Mississippi River Network members and partners across the watershed, it celebrates one of North America's most iconic waterways, stretching roughly 2,350 miles from the wild rice beds of northern Minnesota to the oyster reefs of southern Louisiana, draining portions of 31 states and providing drinking water to more than 20 million people.
