The remote control has a back cover that needs to be lifted up to insert two AAA batteries. There are different modes such as Home Use or Retail use and also options to select the country. We should set it to "Home Use" for best picture quality in our homes. It is recommended not to put the TV in retail mode unless we need to display some items on the store shelf. The menu has icons like picture, sound, channel, and setup, where we can access different settings by pressing the Enter button or using the arrow buttons to navigate. We can select "Store Demo" for retail environment or press "Home Use". We also have options such as analogue or digital broadcast with the country selection. We should select a channel by pressing the "+" button until it appears on the screen, and then we can view the EPG which is information provided by broadcasters that may appear out of date. In the settings menu, we can manage channels to add, delete, or mark them as favorites using the program guide for digital broadcasts. We can also use the channel list function to display all available channels. We can erase and add a channel if needed. Press the ENTER button after pressing the MENU button and selecting Channel or Channel List. When Child Lock is set to on, locking channels is available. On page 39, see how it works. If the country is set to Norway, locking channels is allowed when pressing the ▲ or ▼ buttons to select the desired channels, then press the TOOLS button. On page 23, you can reserve a program by setting the current time first. See pages 36-37 for more information. Press the ENTER button after selecting Channel, then press the ENTER button again. You can view, modify, or delete your viewing reservations. Press the ENTER button to confirm. On page 25, edit channel names for analogue channels, so their call letters appear on screen when selected. Press the ENTER button after selecting Channel List and Channel. Picture size can be set to "Auto Wide" on 16:9 TVs, allowing users to choose between displaying 4:3 WSS images or not. This feature caters to different European country requirements. Recording a TV program is possible using a Samsung recorder. Go to Tools, enter, and select Recording (device name).
