It started with a bowling alley and has added other activities like sports, games, and more over the years. The building was first dedicated in 1955 after being gifted by Dow Chemical Company. Since then, it's been expanded several times, including a major update in 2005 where they renovated the locker rooms and updated plumbing and flooring. In that same year, MCC saw 900,000 member visits, which is about 2,465 people per day participating in activities. A new corporation was formed to help five local recreation centers, including MCC, with guidance and funding. They started a \$5.1 million fundraising campaign to enhance the quality of life for Midlanders, with contributions from local charities and businesses. The funds were used for three projects, mostly to create an outdoor campus at MCC. Prior to 2008, the center focused on indoor activities due to the city's cold climate. However, a \$2.5 million expansion changed that by adding outdoor space. The Midland Community Center underwent significant changes in the late 2000s to expand its offerings. A 12-acre campus was created with a variety of amenities, including an outdoor running track, basketball courts, and a children's play area. Walking and biking trails were also added. To accommodate these new features, George Street was converted into a parking lot entrance. In 2009, the MCC celebrated its 90th year, providing community activities such as sports leagues, fitness classes, and arts programs. The center also received funding from the United Way of Midland County for education, self-sufficiency, and health programs. A food service business, the Crossroads Deli, operated within the facility but has since closed. The Midland Community Center offers various facilities, including the pool, which boasts a clean blue line leading directly to it. The center features Men's, Women's, and Family locker rooms with private bathrooms, showers, and changing areas. It has a good atmosphere and is staffed by courteous lifeguards. Additionally, it includes a Jacuzzi and is designed to be handicap accessible.
