The William Randolph Hearst Greek Theatre, nestled in Berkeley, California, is an ancient Greek-inspired amphitheater maintained by the University of California. The venue offers two main seating areas: fixed seats and the lawn area. Tickets are sold on a first-come, first-served basis, with prices varying depending on the seating section. The fixed seats provide an excellent view of the stage, while the lawn area offers a more social experience with raised seating for panoramic views. For a comprehensive list of events, refer to the Greek Theatre Berkeley schedule. When it comes to selecting your seat, study the layout beforehand to ensure efficient access. Depending on the concert event, the venue may operate under General Admission or Reserved Seating policies. For General Admission shows, viewers can choose their proximity to the stage and dance up close or watch from a distance. Arrive early to secure a prime spot. To enhance your comfort, bring personal seat cushions or a folded blanket for premium seats in the pit area and lower Sections A-F. For stone bench seating in Sections 1-10, wear flat, comfortable shoes to navigate the stairs. In the Lawn area, bring a small blanket or cushions. Note that large or structured lawn chairs are not permitted. Refer to the FAQ and Venue Rules sections for a comprehensive list of items to bring and leave at home. The theatre's seating arrangement varies depending on the type of show. For certain performances, only seats near the stage are reserved, while others include reservations for the second tier. The lawn area consistently remains general admission. Enjoying the show at The Greek Theatre, but be prepared for somewhat chilly experience. Side seats might pick up outside noise from the street below and nearby railroad. But grab those prime seats in Section 5, 6, C, or D - you'll get unobstructed views of the stage and a comfy spot to enjoy the performance. The venue is wheelchair-accessible; just drop off at North Gate for easy entry. Latecomers will be asked to chill in the lobby until intermission or a suitable pause. For little ones, performances are best suited for kids over 7 years old; check with Ticket Office if unsure. Parents, keep your mini-me's on track - you might get asked to escort them out if they're causing trouble. Important details: The Greek Theatre Box Office is open only on show days, 2 hours prior to the event. Cash or checks won't cut it - use Visa, Amex, Discover, or Mastercard instead. Review your tickets before leaving the window, as all sales are final (no refunds or exchanges). Don't buy from third-party sites; we can't validate or replace those tix.
