Arizona's top colleges include the University of Arizona (ranked 60th in USA, 76th worldwide), Arizona State University (79th USA, 94th world), and Northern Arizona University (546th Forbes best college). The largest institutions by undergraduate enrollment are Arizona State University Tempe and Grand Canyon University. In contrast, Northcentral University and Southwest University of Visual Arts have the smallest student bodies among Arizona colleges. Regarding tuition fees, ASU Polytechnic Campus offers the cheapest in-state options (\$9,545), while the University of Arizona has the highest out-of-state fees (\$28,379). The lowest priced universities in Arizona are Western International University at \$6,000 and American Indian College of the Assemblies of God at \$12,000, while the most expensive is Southwest University of Visual Arts at \$34,541. The most selective colleges are Grand Canyon University with a 41% acceptance rate and Arizona Christian University with a 60%. The oldest universities in Arizona are the University of Arizona and Arizona State University Tempe, both established in 1885. Arizona has over 150 post-secondary education institutions, many of which are ranked among the top in the nation. Top-ranked colleges include Arizona State University, the University of Arizona, Phoenix College, and Northern Arizona University. Mostly colleges and universities in Arizona are located in Phoenix or nearby suburbs like Scottsdale, Glendale, Mesa, and Yuma. Tucson is home to 25 colleges and universities, while Flagstaff has a few more. It's essential to check a college's accreditation status before enrolling, as it ensures the institution meets high education standards. There are two types of accreditation: national and regional. National accrediting agencies have less oversight than regional ones, which can only accredit schools within a specific region. Regional accreditation is considered more reputable than national accreditation. Here's a list of top-ranked Arizona colleges & universities.
