The typical weight range for a Standard Dachshund depends on their age. They are fully grown by around one year of age, so they shouldn't gain significant weight after this point. Typical weights for Standard Dachshunds by age are: 3-5 months - 6-13 pounds, 6-11 months - 12-25 pounds, and 12 months+ - 16-32 pounds. Feel around your dog's ribcage. You should be able to feel the rib bones underneath their skin and muscle. If you struggle to feel the rib bones, they're probably carrying too much weight. However, it's crucial to recognize that these guidelines are only general recommendations - individual dogs can vary in size. To determine your pet's ideal weight, consult with your veterinarian.
