To access and download photos directly onto devices without an internet connection, Google Drive offers several methods that can be adapted based on the device type. On PCs, users can launch their web browser, open Google Drive, log in if needed, locate the desired picture, and click the three-dotted icon then select "Download." Alternatively, right-clicking the image and selecting "Download" also works. On Android devices, the process involves opening the Google Drive app, navigating to the pictures folder, locating the desired images, tapping on the three-dotted icon, and clicking "Download." For iPhone users, a workaround is to open the app, select the picture, hold down and press it, then click "OK" or use the "Send a Copy" option to save the image. Google accounts may not work properly due to various issues. To resolve the problem, try the following solutions: A poor or unstable internet connection can prevent images from downloading. Restarting your router or switching to mobile cellular data may help. If the issue persists, contact your internet service provider for assistance. Using an incognito mode window will log you out of all Google accounts and disable add-ins and extensions. Clearing cache files can improve user experience, but corrupted files may cause issues with apps or browsers. To clear caches, navigate to Settings > Security and Privacy > Clear browsing data. To save images from Google's Image Search results or from your Google Photos account, follow these steps: First, open a web browser on your computer or mobile device, then go to Google Image Search. Find the image you want to download and click on it. On Android devices, tap the "Download Image" option in the menu that appears. On iPhone or iPad, select "Save Image" from the same menu. Alternatively, if you're using a desktop computer, you can also download multiple images at once. To do this, sign in to your Google account and navigate to the Google Photos website. Click on the "Photos" tab in the sidebar, then click on the three-dot menu next to an individual photo. Select "Download" from the dropdown menu. For mobile devices, use the free Google Photos app to download images. Launch the app and select the image you want to save. Tap the three-dot menu icon in the top-right corner, then choose "Download." If your phone already has the image, it will display a message saying "Delete From Device" instead of "Download." Note that if you want to make a backup of all your photos and videos stored on Google Photos, you can use Google's Takeout service. To do this, launch a web browser on your device, sign in to your account, then navigate to the Google Takeout website. Deselect all services except for "Google Photos," then click "Next Step" to begin the download process. You can make all your photos and videos available locally on your desktop and mobile phones by using Google Takeout to download your Google Photos archive. To do this, follow these steps: First, go to takeout.google.com and sign in to your Google account. Then, click on "Delivery Method" and choose "Send Download Link via Email." Next, select the frequency of export and file type as ZIP, and set the size limit to 2 GB. Finally, click "Create Export" to start the process. Google Takeout will then build a ZIP file containing all your pictures and videos stored in Google Photos. Once the file is ready, you'll receive an email with a link to download it. This way, you can access your content easily and quickly on your devices. You can also download specific albums or photos from Facebook by using a similar process. However, if you're looking to download all your Google Photos, you might need to use this method. It's worth noting that having a backup of your Google Photos library is important, even with the cloud storage option being available. This way, you can view your pictures whenever and wherever you want, without relying on internet connection. If you want to download all your Google Photos at once, skip step #3 and proceed to step #4. If not, keep reading. When clicking 'all photo albums included', a pop-up will appear allowing you to select/deselect specific albums - including entire years - while preserving the album structure in the resulting download folder. Note that you won't be able to preview album contents through Takeout, so it's recommended to cross-reference each folder with Google Photos. After selecting your albums, hit 'OK'. Scroll down and click 'next step', then choose a delivery method for receiving your export via email or transferring directly to another cloud provider like Dropbox or OneDrive. You can also set the maximum download file size and choose between one-off or periodic exports. Once your settings are in place, click 'create export' - this may take anywhere from a few minutes to several hours depending on library size. When your download is ready, you'll receive an email with a link to start downloading. If you prefer to download photos individually, sign up for breaking news and follow these steps: head to Google Photos, open the photo you want to save, click the three dots in the top right corner, and select 'download'. To download several photos at once, hover over images on the web, checkmark them, and click the three vertical dots to compress your chosen shots into a single zip archive. This method allows you to save data by selecting only the shots you really want to keep. Here's a step-by-step guide on how to download albums from Google Photos: 1. Go to the "Albums" tab and click "View all albums" to see your entire collection. 2. Select an individual album, then click the three dots in the top right corner and select "Download all". This method is useful for saving similar images, such as those taken at the same location. Alternatively, you can also download individual photos or multiple photos from Google Photos. To do so: 1. Open the Google Photos app on your device. 2. Select the photo you want to download. 3. Tap the three dots in the top right corner and select "Download" or use the share icon to send it to another app. For a more organized approach, consider grouping your photos into specific albums or collections before downloading. This will make it easier to access and manage your downloaded media. Additionally, you can also download an entire album at once by following these steps: 1. Open the Google Photos app on your device. 2. Select the album you want to download. 3. Tap the three dots in the top right corner and select "Download all" or use the share icon to send it to another app. Remember to ensure you have enough storage space on your device, a stable internet connection, and necessary permissions before downloading photos from Google Photos. To download multiple photos from Google Photos, follow these steps: Step 1: Open Google Photos on your computer (Windows or Mac) and sign in to your account if needed. Step 2: Hover over the photos you want to download and click the tick mark in the top left corner of any photo. Then, select all the photos you want to download. Step 3: Click the three-dot icon in the top right corner and choose Download from the drop-down menu. Step 4: The Google Photos app will zip the photos into a single file, which will automatically download to your folder. You'll need to unzip the file to access the downloaded photos. Note that it may take some time depending on the size and quantity of the images. Alternatively, you can follow these steps for Android devices: Step 1: Open Google Photos on your Android device and long-press on an image to select it. Step 2: Tap on all the images you want to download from the bottom sheet. Then, choose Share. Step 3: Under 'Share to App,' tap Save to and select a folder where you want to save the photos. Note that this option is not available on most Android devices without an external file manager app installed. You can compare ES File Explorer Pro vs. Solid Explorer to get the best option. To save photos from Google Photos, follow these steps: after saving them on your device, they'll be downloaded and stored in your preferred location. If you don't want to download multiple pics but rather an album from Google Photos, keep reading. Downloading albums is a straightforward process. First, go to Google Photos from your web browser on your Windows or Mac computer. If not signed in, sign in to your Google account. Navigate to the Albums options from the left pane and click on the album you want to download. Once on the album page, click the three-dot icon in the top right corner and choose Download all from the dropdown menu. This will compress the album into a zipped folder and automatically download it to your downloads folder. If you don't have access to your desktop, there's no direct way to download an album using the Google Photos app on mobile, but there's a workaround that we'll discuss in the next section. You may want to download all your photos and videos from Google Photos for offline access or backup purposes. Let's begin with the steps: go to Google Takeout from your web browser on your Windows or Mac computer. If not signed in, sign in to your Google account. Click on Deselect all and then scroll down to find Google Photos and select it. On the next page, select the delivery method, frequency, file type & size, and click Create export. Google Takeout will build a zip file of all your photos and videos stored in Google Photos. Once ready, you'll get an email notification from which you can download the file and store it locally on your computer. If using Android or iOS device, go to Google Dashboard and navigate to 'Data & privacy' option. Scroll down and tap 'Content saved from Google services.' In the next screen, scroll down under 'Recently used Google services,' tap Download, then in Google Takeout, choose All photo albums included and select the albums you want. Tap OK and Next step. On the next section, choose Create export. Depending on the export size, this may take some time, even hours. Google will send a notification email once the album is ready, and you can click on the link sent to your email ID to download it locally on your device. The photos downloaded from Google Photos are in a zipped folder. Downloading Photos from Google Photos: What You Need to Know When it comes to downloading photos from Google Photos, the quality options largely depend on how the images were originally uploaded and stored. If you choose the original quality setting during upload, Google Photos will preserve the format and quality of the image. ### Can I Download Photos in RAW Format? Yes, you can download photos from Google Photos in their original RAW format if they were uploaded that way. However, it's worth noting that Google Photos has limitations on handling RAW files, which might cause them to be converted to JPEG for certain operations like editing or sharing. ### Is There a Limit to the Number of Photos I Can Download? As long as you have sufficient storage space and a stable internet connection, there is no limit to the number of photos you can download from Google Photos. Nevertheless, some factors such as the photo format and your account settings might affect the speed and quality of the downloads.
