Then add -ly; but: If the adjective ends in -le, the adverb ends in -ly: If the adjective ends in -e, then add -ly: Not all words ending in -ly are adverbs: adjectives ending in -ly: friendly, silly, lonely, ugly nouns, ending in -ly: ally, bully, Italy, melancholy verbs, ending in -ly: apply, rely, supply There is no adverb for an adjective ending in -ly. To modify verbs: The handball team played badly last Saturday. To modify adjectives: It was an extremely bad match. To modify adverbs: The handball team played extremely badly last Wednesday. To modify quantities: There are quite a lot of people here. To modify sentences: Unfortunately, the flight to Dallas had been cancelled. Adverb types include manner, degree, frequency, time, and place. Use an adjective to describe how someone or something is, and use an adverb to describe the action or way it happens. For verbs like look, smell, and taste, both adjectives and adverbs can be used; however, mind the change in meaning that may occur.
