The address associated with SpongeBob SquarePants' pineapple house has sparked a conspiracy claim linking it to Jeffrey Epstein's island. One such baseless claim suggests the character's home address is identical to the location of Epstein's privately owned island, where allegations of sex abuse took place. However, this connection has been debunked by Google's own removal of the address as a fake listing. It was revealed that Google Maps is prone to false business listings and scams, with millions of inaccurate addresses appearing on its platform. Epstein's 72-acre private island little st james was located 2 miles off the coast of st thomas in the u.s. virgin islands epstein had stakes in businesses in the area including hyperion air a boat with the letters lsj was used to ferry staff members and supplies to the island. despite making donations to local government officials and schools some said epstein did not have a good reputation in the area u.s. virgin islands attorney general denise george told cbs news that she did not think epstein was an upstanding member of the community it was public knowledge that he was a registered sex offender george said. Epstein's island little st james was reportedly used for his criminal activity as stated by u.s. virgin islands attorney general denise george "it was a place for him to hide his criminal activity" she said. george's office sued epstein's estate ultimately garnering a \$105 million settlement on behalf of the u.s. virgin islands. according to george's lawsuit epstein would fly into st thomas on a private jet and use helicopters from hyperion air to transport young women and underage girls between st thomas and little st james some witnesses reported seeing epstein with preteen girls according to the complaint authorities were stopped at the dock when they tried to enter the island george said "remember he owns a whole island so it wasn't a situation where a child or a young woman would be able to just break away and run down the street to the nearest police station" Jeffrey Epstein, convicted of sex crimes in Florida over a decade ago, has once again found himself at the center of controversy after being charged with trafficking girls as young as 14 in New York. According to a lawsuit, one alleged victim attempted to escape from his island, Little St. James, by swimming. Another victim shared her harrowing experience with CBS News, describing how Epstein brought her to St. Thomas and raped her in his office, trapping her in his bedroom on the island where he had a gun strapped to his bedpost. In 2008, Epstein cut a deal with prosecutors after pleading guilty to two state charges of soliciting prostitution from a minor in Florida. He pleaded guilty to lesser state charges and served 13 months in jail, mostly on work release, and paid settlements to victims. However, the non-prosecution agreement has raised questions about the severity of his sentence. Epstein's private island, Little St. James, has been referred to as "Pedophile Island" due to its history of alleged abuse. The documents released this week do not contain a list of Epstein associates, but flight logs and other documents have revealed the extent of his network. In May, billionaire Stephen Deckoff bought Little St. James and neighboring Great St. James for \$60 million, with plans to develop a luxury resort on the islands.
