Evaristo Acevedo, a renowned Spanish humorist and writer, published his work "Triunfe en sociedad, hablando mal de todo" in Madrid by Editorial Velflex in 1963. After obtaining his official periodista title, Acevedo became a redactor at Pueblo in 1960 with his section "El palo y la vela", a position he held until his retirement in 1980 and received the Medalla al Mérito en el Trabajo. Throughout his life, Acevedo received numerous literary awards and was honored for his work. He wrote approximately 10,000 articles under various pseudonyms (Evaristóteles, Fernando Arrieta, Noé). His writing style was characterized by irony and sharp humor. Here is an example of his wit: "By then [1545] Don Carlos I of Spain and V of Germany reigned, because the destiny of the Spaniards, whether they are producers or emperors, is to have one foot in Spain and another in Germany." Acevedo's notable works include "Los serenos duermen de noche", "Los ancianitos son una lata", "Enciclopedia del despiste nacional", "49 españoles en pijama y 1 en camiseta", and many more. In 1971, he received the Premio Teatro Cómico Español for his work "Celtiberos sin esposar". He also wrote autobiographical works such as "Un humorista en la España de Franco".
