The concept of "link posting" is fictional and has nothing to do with real affiliate marketing. While it's true that companies pay individuals to promote their products online through affiliate links, this process involves sending targeted customers to those companies, not just sharing links. The problem lies in Home Profit System's over-simplification of the process and failure to teach you how to actually do affiliate marketing properly, as their goal is solely to take your money. In reality, link posting is a misleading way to make money online, while affiliate marketing involves creating content (like a simple website) with affiliate links to earn commissions.
