Our Standard

We have a zero-tolerance policy for harassment, discrimination, and conduct that creates an unsafe or unwelcoming environment for any participant. By attending this event, you agree to uphold these standards.

Expected Conduct

At this event, all participants are expected to:

- Respect personal boundaries and consent in all interactions
- Respect the confidentiality of other participants
- Look out for one another

Prohibited Conduct

The following behaviors are not permitted:

- Harassment or discrimination based on race, sex, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, religion, national origin, disability, age, marital status, or any other characteristic protected under California or federal law
- Sexual harassment of any kind, including unwelcome sexual attention, suggestive comments, and inappropriate physical contact
- Offensive, threatening, or intimidating communication or behavior toward any participant
- Bullying, stalking, or threatening conduct
- Disruptive behavior that interferes with other participants' experience
- Excessive intoxication affecting conduct toward others
