SCIENCE IN ITALY

Many people in this and other countries argue blasfemously that while the Italians are a great people in music, painting and sculpture, they are not much in Science. Unlike the Germans, we are told, they lack the scientific temperament. The idea is preposterous, of course, and betrays the ignorance of those who express it. Italy has contributed immensely to the scientific advance of mankind—more than any other single nation. The other day, King Victor Emanuel inaugurated in Florence an exhibition of Italian science which is aimed to remind the world that scientifically the Italians are in the forefront of the nations and are still giving greatly.

Such names as Da Vinci, Galileo, Torricelli, Galvani, Volta, Pacinotti and last but not least Marconi are bywords in the fields of science. The exhibition shows the crude instruments of the Italian pioneers: the first microscope made by Amici, the first designs of the airplane drawn by Leonardo, Torricelli's barometer, the Voltaic pile, Marconi's wireless, and a hundred other inventions, all capitalized by the world at large. As Dr. James J. Walsh says in his famous work on Italy's contribution since the Roman empire, the Italians have given the world more than the world can ever hope to repay. In medicine, surgery, physics, electricity and mechanics, Italian scientists led their colleagues long before the dawn of the scientific age.

It is well for Italy to recall this traditional glory, too often and too readily overlooked. Italian civilization, three thousand years old, has the merit of perfect balance. It covers all fields. To argue that the Italians are merely an artistic people is to be ignorant of the history of science, the roots of which are deep in Italian soil.

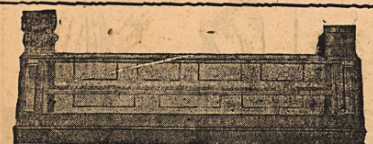

Fred Haney Says Georgian Lacked Cooperation.

With Tyrus Raymond Cobb, greatest of all ballplayers of all time, retired from the game, consensus is that Ty never was temperamentally fitted to be a manager. There is one man who played under him, however, who begs leave to dissent from the prevailing opinion.

He is Fred Haney, who, rescued from Indianapolis during the winter, his fair to "make" the Cardinal infield. Haney contends that the lack of success Cobb had as a pilot of the Detroit Tigers was in no way due to his shortcomings, but to those of some of the players under him. "Cobb was the greatest student of the game and psychologist I ever saw," Haney says. "And, as for playing ability," Haney went on, "any talk of comparing any other star with him is almost ridiculous. Ty could do everything and do everything better than anyone else could do anything. 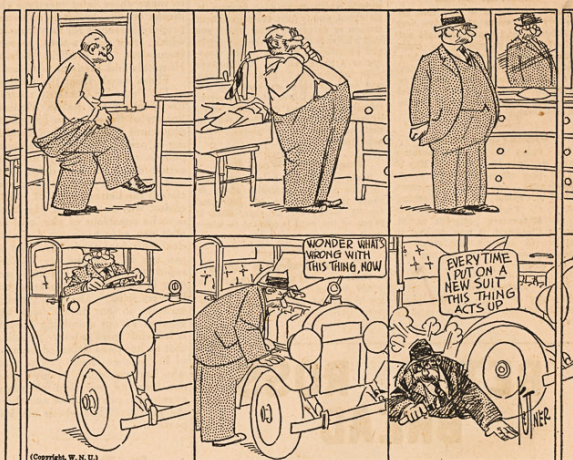
"I guess Hank never did know that I was running until Bob Messel hit a moment later and I scored. Then it was too late. The game was over and we were the world champs."

Record for Cardinals

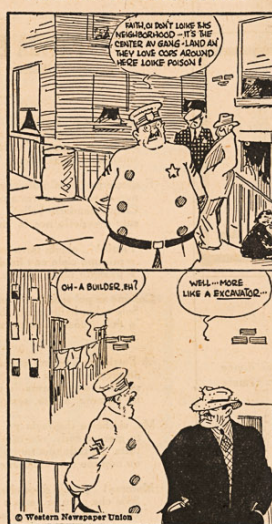
