Così fa' generalmente, una persona portatore lavoro? Nella maggioranza dei casi cerca di trovare un'occupazione fidando sulle proprie forze. Se questo metodo fallisce, egli va da amici e conoscenti. Se fallisce ancora, va da un'agenzia di collocamento sia pubblica sia a pagamento.

Durante e mesi passati, i padroni hanno mostrato la tendenza di favorire i cittadini occupandoli. Molti stranieri sono stati senza dubbio licenziati per far posto ai cittadini. Uno straniero, specialmente se nuovo venuto, deve perciò affrontare molti ostacoli e ha bisogno di più risorse, coraggio e determinazioni, per trovare lavoro. Vi e' molta verità nel detto che un lavoro più duramente quando e' disoccupato, per trovare qualche cosa mentre si hanno ancora dei risparmi, uno deve cercare di non consumare troppo durante la caccia al lavoro. Il primo passo efficace e di informarsi come lavorano le agenzie di collocamento, dove andare e come sviluppare una certa tecnica.

Non attacca con caparbia al vostro speciale genere di lavoro. In tempi di disoccupazione generale, uno non deve insistere nel cercare lavoro nella propria linea speciale. La disoccupazione non deve essere di mestieri così intensata. Chi onestamente ha fatto sforzi per trovare lavoro nella propria capacità per un tempo ragionevole non deve esitare di cercare lavoro di altro genere. Fra gli ultimi venuti specialmente fra quelli della categoria degli ex colletti bianchi, vi e' spesso l'inclinazione di cercare un impiego di ufficio. Le probabilità sono molto ristrette per tali persone senza esperienza americana ed essi debbono accettare qualunque lavoro, anche se il salario e' meschino ed il lavoro disagevole, e' meglio avere un'occupazione qualsiasi che stare senza far niente. Lavorando, uno ha più opportunità di imparare la vita e le condizioni di questo paese, prepararsi per un impiego migliore.

Non tenete dove siete. Vi e' spesso una tendenza a credere che in altri posti ed in altre città le condizioni siano migliori. Questo può essere vero, ma non e' consigliabile di intraprendere un costoso viaggio per un'altra città fino a che uno non sia assolutamente sicuro che le probabilità di impiegarsi siano migliori.

L'andare in un luogo nuovo pone l'individuo sotto il peso di numerose difficoltà, forse va in un posto, dove ha pochi o nessun amico che possa aiutarlo, dove le condizioni sono sconosciute, dove il sentimento pubblico e' contrario al non residenti o ai forestieri. Se uno ha famiglia, significa spezzare l'integrità e smentare le spese. Dato questo, il Consiglio del Dr. Arthur Woods, "stai dove sei" e' opportuno.

Vi sono circostanze in cui cambiare posto e' preferibile. Certi paesi industriali hanno sofferto più di altri a causa di speculazioni manifatture. Prima di partire, e' consigliabile di scrivere ad amici in quelle città oppure di andare alla Biblioteca più vicina e consultare una copia dell'ultimo Bollettino mensile del Bureau.

Milioni di dollari sono stati prodotti da fiduciose vittime, specialmente stranieri, madri, che hanno mandato l'ultimo dollaro come depositi a ditte di ordini per posta.

ALLEGED SLAYER OF FIVE KILLED
Caught After Two Days Hunt of Countryside.

Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. — Hunted for two days in the bush country near Smoky Lake, 80 miles north of here, George Dworchnick, alleged slayer of five persons on a lonely farm near Smoky Lake, was captured here a short time ago.

For 48 hours provincial police and a posse of neighbor farmers scoured the countryside near the Wainwright home for Dworchnick, who is alleged to have slain four members of that family and a neighbor farmer.

According to information received at Alberta provincial police headquarters here, Dworchnick, who is a farmer, was picked up by Dworchnick, while he was looking near the depot in Vegreville, Alta., 60 miles north of here and only about twenty miles from Smoky Lake.

Recently a man armed with a 12 gauge shotgun entered the farm house at the Wainwright home, shot and killed John Wainwright, his wife, their invalid daughter, 20-year-old Victoria, and a neighbor, Mrs. Anna Hinchuk, mother of Mrs. Wainwright. The aged woman died in a hospital in Smoky Lake several days later.

Floping the scene of the crime, the slayer started down the road, where he met John Dworchnick, a neighbor driving alone in his car. Dworchnick was shot dead, his body being found in the wagon box when the unguarded horses reached the farm yard.

Dworchnick, who has operated a store in Edmonton for about two years, left here recently for Smoky Lake. On reaching the home of his friends there, he is said to have borrowed a 12 gauge shotgun, ostensibly to start on a hunting trip.

It was a 12 gauge shotgun that was used to kill all five victims.

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NEWS REVIEW OF CURRENT EVENTS

Huge Crop Losses Due to Drought Boost Prices and Rouse Government.

By EDWARD W. PICKARD
PROTRACTED drought and exceedingly hot weather brought to the farmers of the United States a mixture of bad news and good news. The administration to the consideration of relief measures beyond those contemplated by the act creating the federal farm board.

Both government and private crop reports led to estimates that the new crop would be damaged to the extent of at least 50,000,000 bushels, and the rains that fell throughout much of the corn belt during the week were said to have come too late to have much influence on the yield since pollination had failed.

Private reports by one of the leading experts of the Middle West indicated that a large part of the crop was beyond any material recovery. In the corn belt, where the situation was said to be worst in the south part of the state, the crop in northern and western Kentucky was said to be entirely ruined, and the condition in Missouri and Iowa was not much better. Throughout the whole drought region, also, pasturage and all fodder crops were burned up to an alarming extent.

On the other hand, these bad crop prospects led to a sensational rise in the prices of grain on the exchanges, and within a few days a very high estimated increase of about \$200,000,000 in the theoretical value of farmers' products. The market in Chicago was wild and corn led in the swift advance, followed by wheat and the other grains. For the first time in five years the public came in on a big sale, and there were heavy buying orders from foreign countries. It was believed there would be a heavy substitution of wheat for corn as feed, and consequently the demand for grain was large. Also the estimates of the crop were so low that the grain was expected to be sold at a profit.

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**KNIFE WINS FOR
WOMAN IN DUEL
AGAINST RIFLE**

Enemy Opens Battle With
Shot, Then Forced to
Flee From Slashes.

St. John, N. H.—"We investigated a report of a fight on the outskirts of New Waterford between Mrs. Gaetz and Mrs. Gardiner, and found Mrs. Gaetz was cut in the jaw."
Thus did the provincial police, stationed in Glace Bay, N. S., sum up one of the fiercest battles between women ever chronicled in the maritime provinces.

Challenged to Duel.
Just how the combat started nobody seems to know. At all events Mrs. Gaetz and Mrs. Gardiner, both residents and neighbors in what are known as the western front barracks of New Waterford, had a controversy. The words preceded a clashing knife, and this was followed by a duelling challenge.

So much heat was displayed in the challenge and acceptance of the duel that the type of weapon was not specified.
The result was that, at the zero hour, Mrs. Gaetz appeared with a sawed-off rifle and Mrs. Gardiner flourished a murderous looking butcher knife. The hour for the beginning of hostilities was 3:30 p. m.

Knife vs. Rifle.
A gallery of about 100 persons witnessed the fray, which started by Mrs. Gaetz trying to shoot her foe. However, Mrs. Gardiner proved to be very

aggressive at close quarters with the awe-inspiring knife. It is quite true that Mrs. Gaetz was cut in the jaw, as the policemen reported in their investigation, and it is also true that as a result of the wounds the chairs looked far less inviting to her than ever before. When she tried to escape from the menacing knife she was slashed some more.

Mrs. Gaetz had no opportunity to retaliate, as her adversary was too active, and before she was carried up completely her friends rushed her to her home and summoned a doctor, who treated the several wounds. Mrs. Gardiner has been duly recognized as the winner of the unusual duel, in which a knife triumphed over rifle and bullets.

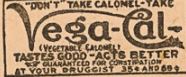
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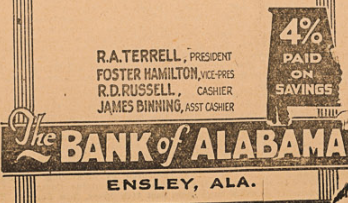
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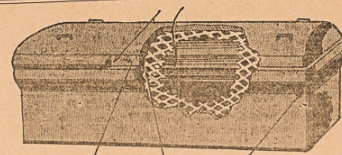
