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## OFFBEAT FURS PLAY UP FUN

The Italians are having fun with fur this year! The offbeat is the upbeat in speaking of imported fur fashions.

Veneziani sets the stage for the novel approach by showing a big flat fur handbag. Then—still with a gay disregard for tradition—she dyes mouton a jonquil yellow and offers it in a fetching short jacket for after-ski wear. For snow bunnies who prefer it, the jacket is available in white.

Emilio shows the new fur shorties too—but in broadtail, lynx, and skunk. Among the most attractive, boutique items to arrive in this country from across the sea is a cuddly hip-length box jacket of dyed Italian lamb. Double-breasted, with a military collar, it comes in gleaming white, soft beige or smoke blue.

Fabiani, too, offers his conversation piece. It is a sleeveless tunic of French rabbit, stenciled in the familiar black and white pattern of the civet cat. The tunic, which buttons down one side and sports a red lining, is perfect for wear over leotards to compliment an elan figure. Like other imported fur fashions, it is moderate in price.

Italian designers—and Signor Fabiani in particular—are quick to note that mink is no longer the end-all dream of the American women who have tossed it aside as the status symbol. This doesn't mean that present owners of minks are tossing their coats and stoles into the missionary barrel! But it does mean that the career girl or homemaker who is choosing a new fur is going to have styling rather than status in mind. And she's going to enjoy the unusual.

Even those who can disregard price tags are going in for the offbeat treatment. Gregoriani is one of the top Italian couture designers who boldly uses colored furs with great success. He lines a formal coat with colored squirrel and uses cuffs of colored fox fur on the sleeves of a pale gold brocade evening ensemble.

In the moderate price brackets, the big newcomer in the fur fashion picture is Italian lamb—a fluffy, flattering fur that dyes beautifully and can even pretend to be Norwegian blue fox. Hattie Carnegie uses it in this disguise in a head-hugging hat she calls "the casque". For casual wear, it comes into its own as white fur collar and cuffs on leather sports coats.

Persian lamb has not been omitted from the array of fur imports. In using this more traditional and more expensive fur, the ingenious Italians are deftly molding it into new silhouettes that turn it from a matronly asset to a youthful caprice. Fabiani's theatre coat offered by a New York department store features the new umbrella look. The persian lamb flows in vertical gores to flare at the hemline—each gore bordered by ribbons of velvet. This luxury fur—import though it is—sells well under one-thousand dollars.

## COMBINED LETTERS

There are two combinations of letters which produce sounds that have no exact parallel in English.

gn—like ny in canyon, but as a single sound, bagno, ogni  
gli—like the li in million, but as a single sound, famiglia, figli  
\*Gli retains its separate sounds in a few words like negligente, anglicismo, etc.

There are other combinations of letters which have sounds that do have an approximate parallel in English; ch and gh always a hard sound in Italian.

(ch—k; gh—g of go) Chi, laghi  
Chi—followed by a, e, o, or u is pronounced like ky  
chiEsa, vEcchio  
qu—always like kw, quanto, quattro  
sc—always like sh when before e or i, scEna, finisci  
sc—always like sh when before a, o, or u, scala, scopa  
sci—followed by a, o, or u has an ah-sound, lascia, lascio.

Italian Cuisina Hints For The Housewife  
From The Talismano Recipes By ADA BONI

### CHICKEN LIVER CANAPE

4 chicken livers	1/2 teaspoon pepper
2 teaspoons chopped parsley	1/2 tablespoon flour
2 tablespoons butter	2 tablespoons stock or water
2 anchovy filets, chopped	2 teaspoons lemon juice
dash of salt	6 slices bread, cut into triangles and fried in butter

Chop livers very fine, mix with parsley and fry in butter for 5 minutes. Add chopped anchovies, salt and pepper and sprinkle with flour. Add stock or water and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Remove from fire, add lemon juice, spread on bread triangles and serve immediately. Serves 4.



### City Signs Airport Pact with Kenner

The New Orleans aviation board has signed a 10-year agreement with the city of Kenner under which Kenner will receive \$12,000 annually for services it provides at Moisant International Airport.

The agreement, signed last night at a banquet at Moisant's International Room by aviation board chairman Scott Wilson and Kenner Mayor Joseph S. Maggiore, is retroactive to 1957.

Wilson presented Maggiore a check for \$36,000 for the years 1957 through 1959. He said the money is primarily for services of Kenner police at the airport.

Attending the banquet were Kenner officials, aviation board members, Acting Mayor Glenn P. Clasen and other New Orleans councilmen, and Jefferson parish officials headed by parish president Charles W. Spencer.
