CANADA

Nove milioni stanziati per
ampliare le attrezzature
del Porto di Toronto

TORONTO, Canada. (A. Varrecchia). — Le attrezzature portuali della città di Toronto subiranno delle radicali innovazioni in seguito allo stanziamento di nove milioni di dollari da parte della Commissione generale sovrintendente al complesso portuale.

Tale miglioria si sono rese necessarie in seguito al grande sviluppo del traffico marittimo, che di giorno in giorno aumenta a vista d'occhio.

La Commissione portuale ha intenzione di comprare anche una potentissima gru della capacità di 350 tonnellate; i lavori prevedono gli ampliamenti dei vecchi magazzini, nonché la costruzione di un nuovo deposito merci per soddisfare il sempre crescente traffico marittimo. I lavori di restauro al vecchio porto comporteranno una spesa di oltre 60 milioni di dollari; i nove milioni di questi giorni fanno parte della spesa preventiva per il gigantesco progetto, che tra l'altro comprende anche la costruzione di una immensa diga all'imboccatura del porto e maggiori facilitazioni ai lavori di dragaggio.

Come è facile arguire le vecchie installazioni portuali non possono più reggere di fronte all'aumentato traffico internazionale, che in questo porto dell'Ontario è abbastanza sviluppato. Inoltre l'apertura del Canale di San Lorenzo ha dato viepiù importanza al porto, che riceve la maggior parte delle navi provenienti d'oltre oceano con i loro carichi di merci destinate alla popolazione del retroterra.

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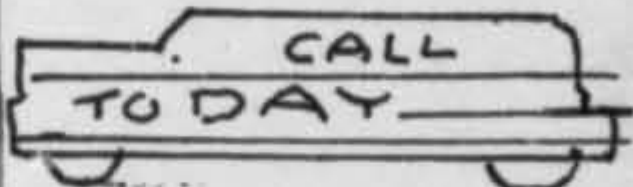
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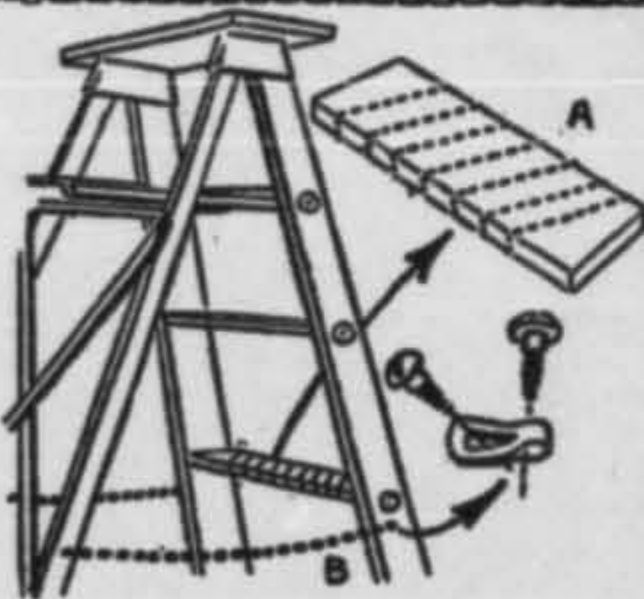
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Stepladder Safety

Slipproof your stepladder against accidents often caused by climbing a ladder with wet feet. Wrap the treads with No. 2/0 zinc-coated steel safety chain, detail A. Groove the edges of treads with a file to hold chain at desired spacing. Screw chains at ends and other points as necessary to the underside of treads. Detail B shows No. 25 sash chain substituted for defective or missing limit hinges. To attach it use screws that almost penetrate the legs at points about half the ladder height, or lower, so chain won't hang beyond the legs when ladder is folded.



Supporting Yard Lights

A hanging barnyard light, detail A, does not require any ground space as does a post. Use No. 65 sash chain or No. 4/0 pattern coil chain. For easy access to the light, an endless chain can be run over pulleys. A weatherproof cable is held onto the chain with S-hooks. In detail B a long arm holding a lamp is supported by No. 3/0 twin-loop, zinc-coated chain. A gooseneck fixture on a wall can be extended farther if coupled to a length of same-size pipe and supported by No. 1/0 twin-loop, zinc-coated chain, detail C.

I was a "Ham". In vaudeville circles a Ham was one who had obtained only partial success, playing second and third class show places. For years I made a very meager livelihood, then fortunately in my old age I inherited enough money to retire. But an old actor never gives up hope of being successful especially if he has never tasted fame during his whole career.

So you can imagine the interest that formed in me when I read in "BILLBOARD" a theatrical magazine, about a great small animal act in Italy, created by an old Italian known as, "The GREAT GINO". He was offered fabulous sums to bring this act to America, but refused to leave his native land.

I was impressed with the idea that if Gino did not care to come to America, he probably would not mind training some small animals for me, especially because of the fact that I was in a financial position to reward him handsomely for his services.

Ambition is the only known factor that can make an old man feel young, and as I sailed from New York Harbor I was feeling like a school boy.

After reaching Italy and seeing Gino's act, I was more impressed than ever. It was an act of trained cats. Cats are the only animal alive that had never been trained to do tricks before.

I lost no time and visited Gino that same day, and let him know that I would like him to train some cats for me to be shown in America. He answered with one word, NO. I then told him of the great trouble and expense I had gone to in order to be there with him at this time. He answered in a manner that only an Italian is capable of; his very expression displayed how much he would like to help me, but how impossible it was.

It seemed that long ago he, too, had ambitions that had never been fulfilled. He wished to be a great concert pianist, but the highest place he was able to reach in the musical world was to become a teacher. And to make matters worse his music seemed to attract cats. No matter where he would move to, these little animals would gather around his dwelling in droves. Sensing that God forbade him to harm them, they became very much of a pest. They would steal his

food, scratch up his plants to say nothing of keeping him awake at night with their "Meows". One day he saw an add in the paper where a man wanted to buy cats. He lost no time in contacting this person.

The next day the cat buyer was knocking on Gino's front door, but could not make himself heard because of a music lesson that was in progress. So he went around to the back entrance which was open, and to Gino's surprise he was standing right there at the side of the piano. The first words this intruder uttered were, "I will give you two thousand dollars for those cats". At first Gino did not want to accept the money for animals he considered pests but the cat buyer insisted, because with the transaction of payment, he would become legal owner of these little animals. He had his own little van out side, and left with his purchase as quickly as possible.

Next morning he was back calling for Gino to open up. To Gino's dismay, when he opened the door there were all of the cats rushing in. The man shouted, "These cats do not perform — they do not march to music — they do not turn flips, or do any of the other things I saw them doing in your back yard, no matter what tune I play on my piano. The astonished Gino answered, "I did not tell you that these cats were in any way out of the ordinary". By this time the angry visitor had conceived an idea. "Please play the piano", he pleaded. Gino played. The cats started waltzing on their hind legs as though they were people, and with the change of tunes they performed other feats never seen before.

We will be partners, cried the man, we will do an act together. This was the starting of the act I had come so many miles to see. Gino continued talking you can see now why I could not train cats for you. The cats you have seen acting are not trained, but merely responding to my music as any other cats would.

Surprisingly, I was not disappointed. I felt that if Gino could find out his great talent in late life, so could I. Here I am back home perfectly satisfied.

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Morte del Comandante Cosulich

L'armamento italiano è in lotta per la morte del comandante Giuseppe Cosulich. Nato a Lussimpiccolo il 9 agosto 1888, fu indirizzato ancora giovanissimo dal padre alla vita di mare. Conseguì il diploma di capitano di lungo corso, ebbe presto il comando di bastimenti della Cosulich.

Fu successivamente destinato ad agenzie d'oltre mare della Compagnia, e precisamente a Buenos Aires, dove trascorse parecchi anni col fratello maggiore cap. Antonio.

Dopo la Prima Guerra Mondiale venne inviato in Cina per conto dei cantieri di Monfalcone che sotto l'impulso di Oscar Cosulich risorgevano dalle rovine della guerra. Successivamente destinato a New York, resse l'agenzia della Cosulich nel delicato momento in cui entravano in linea le grandi motonavi da passeggeri a cui il nome della Cosulich è ancora oggi legato.

Con la nota concentrazione armatoriale il comandante passò alla società Italia come capo delle agenzie del gruppo Finmare.

Dopo la Seconda Guerra si ritirò per dedicarsi ad attività d'armatore in proprio e agente marittimo, attraverso la ditta Fratelli Cosulich che già esisteva a Trieste dal 1913.

Egli mise così la sua esperienza a disposizione degli armatori esteri che per primi assicurarono i collegamenti fra l'Italia ed i Paesi d'oltre oceano iniziando quella corrente migratoria che nell'immediato dopoguerra tanto contribuì a sollevare l'Italia dalle penose condizioni in cui si trovava.

E' merito principalmente suo se transatlantici di lusso battenti bandiera estera, armati con equipaggi italiani scelti dalla Cosulich, vantano ancora oggi servizi di bordo che tengono meritatamente alto il prestigio del lavoro italiano. Vanno ricordati, infine, i posti di lavoro che, grazie alla sua attività, migliaia e migliaia di marittimi hanno avuti; e l'apporto della sua esperienza costantemente dato alle Conferenze di traffico cui ha partecipato sino agli ultimi giorni della sua esistenza.

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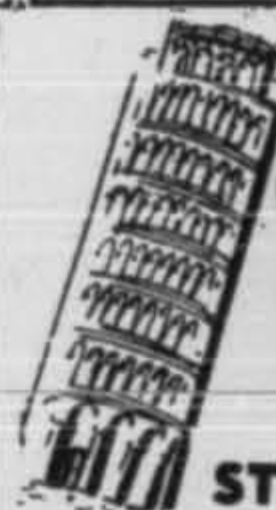
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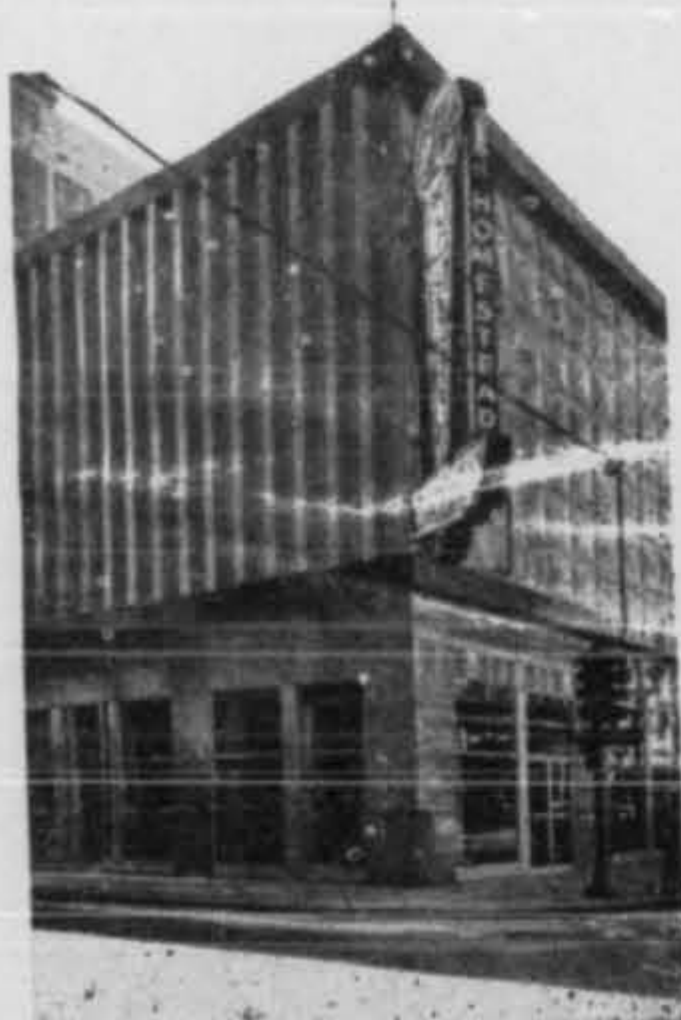
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Ohio Flag in Rome

It was a proud day for the Buckeye State when its flag was hoisted over the Ohio Building of Boys Town of Rome, one of the Boys Towns in Italy promoted by Msgr. John Carroll-Abbing.

A town council was called on that day (Oct. 16) by the boy mayor and his councilors. As he called the meeting to order and stood for opening prayer, three cardinals, three archbishops and a bishop, priests diplomats and governmental representatives of three nations stood with him.

The distinguished delegates at the Boys Town council meeting were Their Eminences Eugene Cardinal Tisserant, Giuseppe Cardinal Mazzardo and Amleto Cardinal Cicognani; Archbishop Edward Hoban of Cleveland, Martin J. O'Connor of the North American College in Rome, and Giuseppe Burzio of the Titular See of Gortina; Auxiliary Bishop Joseph Krol of Cleveland; Irish Ambassador to the Holy See Leo MacCauley, American Embassy Minister Outerbridge Horsey; Prince Marcantonio Pacelli, former Rome Mayor Umberto Tupini and representatives of the Italian government.

The meeting opened with welcome addresses by Boys Town councilmen—or councilboys—in Italian, English and French. Then Theodore Gullia, representing Governor Michael DiSalle of Ohio, and Joseph Cavoli, representing Mayor Anthony Celebrezze of Cleveland, presented flags of the state and the city to the Boys Town council.

Archbishop Hoban then blessed the cornerstone of the building and the eminent guests signed a parchment to be sealed inside the cornerstone to record the event for posterity.

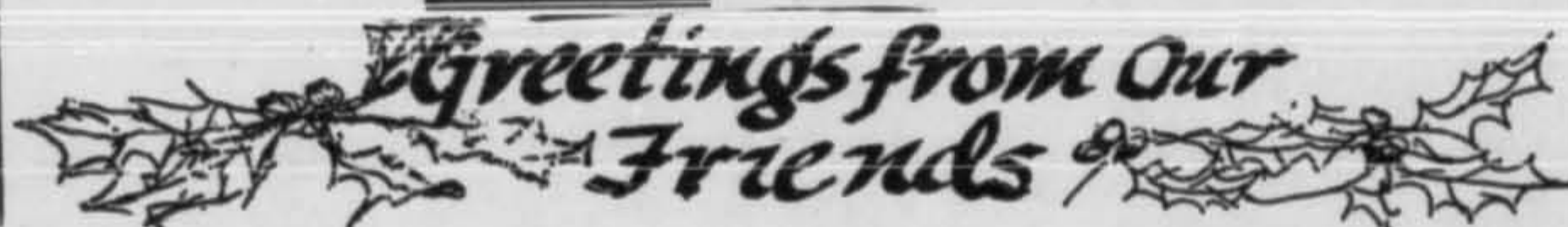
The mayor of Boys Town left his bench to play the clarinet with the Boys Town band. While the band played The Star Spangled Banner, the flag of Ohio was raised aloft. It thus took its place alongside flags of the states of Connecticut, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey and California, each flying over the buildings that their charity had given to needy Italian boys.

New Orleans own Dukes of Dixieland gave out Thursday evening with the finger snappingest, hand clappingest music ever to rock The Roosevelt.

A trombone never bla-bla-d or um-pahed as it does for Freddie, who makes it talk and walk in a splendid "Dear Old Southland." This boy gives the trombone new dimensions.

MUSICAL TREAT

Brother Frankie stars in several numbers with a mean trumpet and shines espec. in a section of "When the Saints Go Marching In." The latter, tired from overwork by everyone, comes as a special musical treat when done by the Dukes.

A jumpy "Muskrat Ramble" makes room for the whole band with Mo Mahoney on drums, Rich Matteson on tuba, Clyde Fuller with the clarinet (a special delight) Clyde Pound on piano, and Frankie and Freddie.

On hand, too, is Jac Anthony Assunto ("Papa Jac"). He adds a little more with a banjo and a trombone of his own.
