

IN HONOR OF OUR NATION' WAR DEAD



MEMORIAL DAY May 30

May 30th is Memorial Day, first officially observed in honor of the nation's war dead at Washington, D.C., 95 years ago -- in 1868. Memorial Day, or Decoration Day, began during the Civil War when Southern women in Vicksburg and Columbus, Mississippi, and Charleston, South Carolina, decorated Union as well as Confederate graves. Ethen Major John A. Logan became commander of the postwar Grand Army of the Republic, he issued on May 5, 1868, his famous order "That every post of the Grand Army should hold suitable exercises and decorate the graves of their dead comrades with flowers Let no

ravages of time testify to coming generations that we have forgotten as a people the cost of a free and undivided Republic." May 30th, a time when flowers are at their best, was chosen as the date, and the first Memorial observance was held in Washington. Ambulances carried flowers to Arlington Cemetery from the Botanic Garden, the Treasury grounds, and the President's conservatory and private gardens. General Ulysses S. Grant, Presidential nominee, was in the stands, and General James Garfield, then in Congress but later to become President, gave the oration. (ACNS)

Hibernia Bank Executive, Dies

Philip J. Carroll, vice-president of the Hibernia National Bank of New Orleans, died at 1:15 a. m. today at his home, 5517 Mandeville. He was 55.

Funeral services will be conducted at 9 a. m. tomorrow at the P. J. McMahon and Son Funeral Home, 4800 Canal, followed by a Requiem Mass at the St. Raphael Church.

Interment will be in Greenwood Cemetery.

Mr. Carroll headed Hibernia's consumer credit department.

A native of New Orleans, Mr. Carroll attended St. Vincent's College at Cape Girardeau, Mo.

He entered the banking business in 1925 and joined Hibernia in 1933 as a utility clerk.

Mr. Carroll was manager of the Gentilly branch office from 1946 to 1954 when he was named assistant cashier. He was elected as assistant vice-president in 1956 and on Jan. 9, 1963, was elected a vice-president.

Mr. Carroll was a member of the American Institute of Banking, the Chamber of Commerce of the New Orleans Area, the Greater Gentilly Civic Association and was a president of the Kiwanis Club of Greater Gentilly.

He is survived by his wife, the former Miss Rosemary McEntee; a son, Philip J. Carroll Jr., and a daughter, Mrs. Rosemary Genheimer.

Mr. Carroll also had four grandchildren.

Finds many Interesting Items

After reading an article in the Reader's Digest about fire warning systems, and also "I Smell Smoke" by Paul W. Kearney; I made an appointment and had a very informative meeting with Mr. MARION R. NEYREY of VANGUARD FIRE EQUIPMENT CO., located at 1300 N. Broad Ave., New Orleans.

Perhaps the classic example of fire's stealth occurred in Cleburne, Tex., where a man was awakened by an angry glow reflecting from his ceiling. Looking out, he saw a neighbor's house so completely involved that flames were coming out of every window, so he dashed to the phone and gave the alarm. Next morn'g, when the embers had cooled somewhat, the firemen found three blackened metal beds in the cellar where they had dropped when the ground floor gave way. On each bed were the earthly remains of two bodies, lying in exactly the position in which they had slept. Burned beyond recognition, they were not even dislodged by the drop into the cellar".



Coméntase aquí que Nikita Krushchev necesita tener a Fidel Castro unos días a su lado para hacer comprender al fogoso dictador cubano que pasó ya la época en que era "el niño consentido" de la Unión Soviética. Halagadoras Exploraciones

MANAGUA. — Concluyendo con el actual movimiento de integración económica centroamericana, que como consecuencia inmediata ha traído la instalación de varias importantes industrias en Nicaragua, se ha desatado aquí una fiebre de exploraciones petroleras, por parte de empresas norteamericanas.

En este momento, están en tramitación varias solicitudes de permiso de exploración en la Oficina de Recursos Naturales del Ministerio de Economía.

Una de las empresas, la Pure Oil Company, que ya trabaja en Honduras, ha encontrado indicaciones muy halagadoras, según se sabe, en el vecino país, propiamente en el antiguo territorio en litigio, y desea estar preparada para el caso de encontrar allí petróleo, unir las dos zonas bajo un mismo impulso empresarial.

Un funcionario de la oficina de Recursos Naturales dijo que "el petróleo que la Pure busca en Honduras, puede que haya quedado de este lado del río Coco", es decir, en territorio nicaraguense.

Una segunda compañía desea explorar sobre la mar-

Por su parte, el director de la Oficina de Recursos Naturales, doctor Pablo Antonio López, dijo que "la situación es de grandes esperanzas para Nicaragua, y de gran porvenir para la Costa Atlántica, particularmente para la zona de Puerto Cabezas" (la ciudad nicaraguense más cercana a la zona supuestamente petrolífera de Honduras).

La Ley de Recursos Naturales, de relativa reciente formación y promulgación, ha afectado a concesionarios de otros tiempos, como la Waterfront Oil Company, que gastó en exploraciones inútiles, 77 años anteriores, varios millones de dólares. Un recurso de amparo que esta firma elevó ante la Corte Suprema está siendo activado ahora por sus abogados, con motivo de las últimas evidencias de que existe petróleo en Nicaragua, "y en cantidades explotables comercialmente", según expresión del profesor californiano arriba citado.

INAUGURAN REFINERIA EN EL SALVADOR

SAN SALVADOR, abril 25.- (UPI).—La primera refinería de El Salvador, "Rasa" (refinería de Aranjula, S. A.), usando petróleo crudo venezolano, ha comenzado a funcionar y puesto su producto a la venta al amparo de una ley de impuestos provisional mientras se promulga una ley permanente.

A pesar de los habituales requisitos legales de que el 50 por

ciento de una empresa debe ser de propiedad salvadoreña para poder gozar de los beneficios de la ley de fomento industrial, en casos que implican grandes inversiones de capital se hacen excepciones. Una de éstas se ha concedido a la Rasa, a la que el Ministerio de Economía sólo exige un cinco por ciento de capital salvadoreño.
