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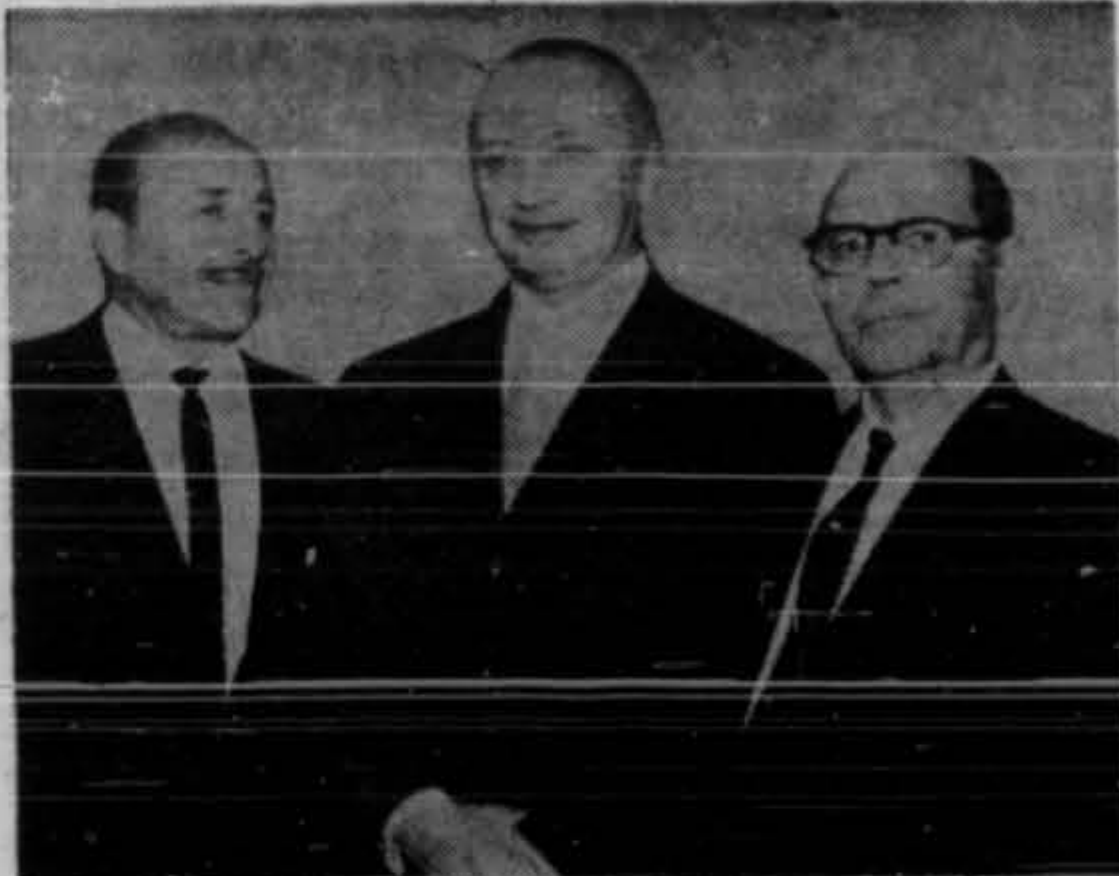

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MAYOR SCHIRO WELCOMES THE CONSUL OF ITALY BARON DI SAN SEVERINO

On August the 29, 1963 a splendid reception and dinner took place at the Fontainebleau Motor Hotel to honor the new Consul General of Italy Baron Ferdinando Quaranta di San Severino.

Promotor of the dinner-party was Mr. George Piazza, an eminent forensic personality in New Orleans and the occasion was enhanced by welcoming ceremonies on the part of the Mayor of the City Hon. Victor H. Schiro to the representative of Italy who took office here just recently.

Among the many guests were professionals and prominent New Orleanians of Italian extraction.

The Mayor, the Consul General and Mr. Piazza were received at the famous Motor Hotel by its Managing-director Mr. Vincent Rizzo.

Honored After Execution

INARAJAN, Guam (NC)—Homage was paid to Father Jesus Baza Duenas, Guam's outstanding hero-martyr of World War II, on the 19th anniversary of his death.

Bishop Apollinaris W. Baumgartner, O.F.M. Cap., Vicar Apostolic of Guam, presided at the annual Memorial Mass offered for the priest hero by Father Paul Toschik in St. Joseph's Church here. Hundreds from all parts of Guam made a pilgrimage here to honor Father Duenas' memory. Father Tomas Camacho preached the sermon.

Boyish looking Father Duenas was taken prisoner by the Japanese during the World War II occupation of Guam, accused of hiding a U.S. Navy officer and withholding information about movements of American forces.

Father Duenas was tortured but refused to talk with his captors. On July 12, 1944, the priest paid with his life for his loyalty to the United States—he was beheaded by the Japanese.

Resolution For Columbus Day

WASHINGTON (NC)—Columbus Day, Oct. 12, would become a legal public holiday, in the same manner as July 4 and similar days, under terms of a bill introduced in Congress by Rep. James C. Healey of New York.

Rumors of New Congregation

VATICAN CITY (NC)—The Vatican City daily has cautioned journalists against rumors the past month stating that a new Roman congregation was instituted for the governing of religious conditions in Latin America. L'Osservatore Romano said in a published notice that such rumors had been commented upon in an editorial in a Catholic weekly in Colombia.

"Rumors of a congregation for Latin America betray themselves by their origins, to be without foundation," L'Osservatore said.

Successor in Milan Archdiocese

CASTELGANDOLFO (NC)—His Holiness Pope Paul VI has named Auxiliary Bishop Giovanni Colombo of Milan to be his successor as Archbishop of Milan. The 60-year-old prelate, named to an archdiocese which traditionally brings with it the cardinalate, was born at Caronno in the Archdiocese of Milan December 6, 1902. Archbishop Colombo made all his priesthood studies in Milan's diocesan seminaries. He earned a degree in theology at Milan's major seminary and a degree in letters at the Catholic University of the Sacred Heart in Milan.

Air Conditioned Buses Authorized By City Council

Councilmen voted, 6 to 0, to approve a program by New Orleans Public Service Inc. which will cost \$4.2 million.

NOPSI President Clayton L. Nairne said street work leading to the changeover probably will begin after next year's Mardi Gras and is expected to be completed by Oct. 1, 1964.

NOPSI agreed to a last-minute amendment directing the company to resurface the entire Canal roadway from Canal

borne to City Park ave., and provide subsurface drainage where it is needed.

The amendment to require NOPSI's resurfacing of Canal was suggested by Marcus and Councilman Clarence O. Dupuy Jr., author of the ordinance.

The arguments for the NOPS plan far outweigh strong objections based principally on "sentiment and tradition."

SCHIRO AGAINST RAISING TAXES

Mayor Victor H. Schiro asserted Tuesday that he would rely on bond issues, an expanding city economy and "good management" rather than increased taxes to meet the needs of city government outlined in a report to himself and members of the City Council by Chief Administrative Officer Thomas J. Heier Jr.

The mayor expressed the belief that the construction of the sewage treatment facilities could be financed partly through Federal funds and partly "on our present ability to borrow money."

SUGGESTED SOURCES

The major ones and the amounts of estimated additional revenue which each would yield annually were listed as follows: (1) a one per cent tax on all payrolls in the city, \$12 million; (2) doubling the one per cent city sales tax, \$9,500,000; (3) equalization of property assessments on the basis of 50 per cent of actual value instead of the present 25 per cent, \$7,000,000; (4) establishment of a city utilities commission to operate the transit, electric and gas systems now operated by New Orleans Public Service Inc., \$7,000,000; (5) a one dollar per month charge for garbage and trash collection, \$1,500,000; and (6) a room tax on hotels and motels, \$500,000.

Port Pilots Unit Reelects R. E. McNeely

Capt. Richard E. McNeely today was reelected president of the Crescent River Port Pilots Association and Capt. H. H. Murley was formally added to the association board.

The five-member board, meeting in association offices in the Whitney bldg., also reelected Capt. Paul Delesdernier vice-president, and Capt. Richard E. Walton secretary.

Earlier, in balloting by members of the association, McNeely, Delesdernier, Walton and Capt. Charles Arnoult were reelected to the board and Capt. Murley named to replace Capt. James Edwards.

The pilots, who guide ships between the mouth of the Mississippi River and New Orleans, elect the board and the board elects association officers from its own number.

THE MICHLOUD OPERATIONS IS NOW TWO YEARS OLD

The Marshall Space Flight Center's Michoud Operations, production site of future Saturn space boosters, on the 7 of September marks its second Anniversary.

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration announced on September 7, 1961, selection of the sprawling Michoud Ordnance Plant for fabrication of the first stage rockets that will be used in the United States' manned lunar landing program.

Until that date, the 20-year old plant had seen relatively little use. Designed originally as a shipyard, the plant was used briefly for the manufacture of plywood cargo planes and later, during the Korean conflict, for the manufacturing of tank engines. The facility remained idle from July, 1953, until its selection by NASA.

Today, the Michoud Operations, as it is now named, has been transformed into a bustling, truly space-age industrial complex.

Non sia detto, tuttavia, che non si potrà sfociare in più larga area e ritrovare l'espressione che, senza dubbio, darà un più elevato carattere agli italo-americani rifarsi quindi alla dignità di chi non nega né nasconde la stirpe, anzi dà conferma al divenire storico della vita americana e diviene alla fine consapevole del fatto che, con le distanze tanto ridotte, è la lingua soltanto che rimane da imparare.

dall'Italia: per gustare meglio la canzone popolare o l'aria della grande opera; e poi ancora per sentire la dignità dell'origine e partecipare al prestigio che circonda il nome dell'Italia e di Roma.

I giornali italiani, nel diffondere il superiore appello con motivata insistenza, ricordino che fra un milione di studenti migliaia potrebbero divenire lettori e sostenitori del giornale amico.

L'agonia della lingua italiana negli Stati Uniti non è solo dolorosa, ma è umiliante per le numerose nostre comunità, quando si pensi che molte scuole si chiudono per mancanza di alunni, cioè per colpa esclusivamente nostra che molti bravi maestri si dedicano ad altre attività per mancanza di studenti; che la lingua italiana trocende mentre in America è in continuo progresso lo studio della lingua russa, giapponese e perfino cinese.

So che per tanto male occorrono parecchi rimedi; ma quello sopra suggerito è fondamentale. Mandiamo i nostri figli e i nostri nipoti a studiare la lingua italiana, a riempire le classi disertate.

Il Rev. mo Canonico
Antonio G. Provenzaperiodici e
giornalismo

Il giornale è un mezzo di comunicazione dell'uomo con i propri simili. Ma è un mezzo di comunicare che si basa su una necessità assoluta: che la gente sappia leggere. Ecco perché la storia del giornalismo va di pari passo con la lotta contro l'analfabetismo.

Prima del 1900 i giornali erano dedicati soltanto agli uomini: riportavano, infatti, notizie politiche e commerciali che interessavano poco o nulla le donne, ancora confinate nell'ambito delle proprie famiglie. Ma nel 1904 le donne erano diventate in Inghilterra una forza politica importante, col trionfo delle correnti femministe.

Le prime fabbriche di carta apparvero in Europa verso il 1200. La stampa a caratteri metallici mobili fu inventata da Gutenberg, maestro tipografo tedesco, nel 1441. La nuova tecnica si diffuse e, poco prima della scoperta dell'America (1492) fu usata in tutta l'Europa.

Solo nel 1600 si incominciano, tuttavia, a stampare pubblicazioni periodiche settimanali, e precisamente a Firenze. Fra il 1603 e il 1630 apparvero settimanali stampati ad Anversa, Strassburgo, Basilea, Amsterdam, Parigi, Vienna, Londra.

L'Ottocento vede nascere le prime "agenzie di stampa", centri di raccolta e di smistamento delle notizie, ossia il giornalismo moderno. Nel XX secolo, col progresso della tecnica, nascono le macchine: le "linotype", le "monotype", le "rotative". Il rotocalco e l'offset sono sistemi di stampa sempre più perfezionati, che permettono rapide e forti tirature, ossia di stampare un grandissimo numero di copie nel giro di poche ore.

Oggi le grandi invenzioni: telegrafo, telefono, radio, teletipografi, telex, fototelegrafia, sono il valido aiuto alla stampa. Ora, una nuova rivoluzione sembra prossima nel settore dell'arte tipografica: è un metodo di stampa realizzato attraverso la fotografia, con una macchina che si usa come una macchina per scrivere e compone fotograficamente caratteri impressi su un disco. Il peso di un chilogrammo del disco sostituirà venti quintali di por-

William S. Coci, who served as Jefferson Parish sheriff from 1956 to 1960, has announced his candidacy for the office again in the Dec. 7 Democratic primary election.

Coci charged that incumbent John G. "Jack" Fitzgerald is an absentee sheriff and all the improvements Coci made in the sheriff's office have been cancelled by the present administration.

He said that while in office from 1956 to 1960 he started and built up the juvenile division, the narcotics squad, a traffic squad and the sheriff's auxiliary.

He added:

"It is my pledge to the citizens of Jefferson Parish that when elected your sheriff, I will see to it that the office and its operations will rate with the best in the country."

Coci is a graduate of Jesuit High School and Tulane University College of Law. He is a practicing attorney in Jefferson Parish and a member of the Jefferson and Louisiana State Bar Association.

War Veteran

A veteran of World War II, he served three years overseas in the European Theater of operations and is a holder of the Bronze Star medal.

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Emile Gennaro President of School Board in Jeff

On August 9, Emile Gennaro was elected head of the Jefferson Parish School Board when Loney Austin nominated Gennaro and called for an end to the fight for control of the school board.

Gennaro was chosen president Vincent J. Glaise was named vice-president and Robert Navarre was elected executive committeeman.

Bert C. LeBlanc was the only member voting against the new officers.

Navarre took the place of Samuel J. McGrew, who the court ruled not legally a board member.

Second Election

The legal dispute arose when the school board called a second election in January naming Gennaro president.

"I now look forward to a period in which the word 'faction' will disappear from our vocabularies here," said Austin.

"I hope this election and Mr. Gennaro's administration will let harmony prevail for the good of the children of Jefferson Parish."

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Hacia un Mundo Pacífico y Seguro

En momentos que escribimos estas líneas, el Presidente John F. Kennedy exhorta al Senado en Washington a que apruebe el flamante tratado antinuclear firmado con Rusia, a fin de reforzar la seguridad de Estados Unidos y acercarse a "un mundo mas pacífico y seguro."

En un extenso mensaje con el que presento oficialmente el pacto al Senado, el Presidente asegura que no se concerta ningún convenio secreto en relacion con el pacto antinuclear y señala diez razones por las cuales el Senado debe aprobar ese acuerdo sin precedente, siendo la principal de ellas la segunda que dice: "Este tratado nos acerca mas a la paz mundial, aunque no la garantiza, y obstaculizara, aunque no pondra fin a la carrera de armamentos nucleares".

El mensaje del Presidente fue el acto final de un día en el que por lo menos 32 naciones se unieron a la Gran Bretaña, Estados Unidos y la Union Sovietica y se adhirió a la prohibición contra pruebas nucleares en la atmosfera, el espacio sideral y bajo el agua. Las pruebas subterráneas no estan prohibidas por el tratado.

El primer país que se adhirió al tratado fue la India, habiendolo firmado

el Embajador Hindu en Moscú, y nos complace notar que, fiel a su política de paz, México fue el primer país de America Latina en suscribir el tratado firmando los embajadores mexicanos en Washington, Londres y Moscú. El Presidente de México, Lic. Lopez Mateos, se ha distinguido durante su administración que esta por terminar, por su colaboración a cualquier esfuerzo encaminado hacia la paz, y recordamos ahora la propuesta que conjuntamente con otros países latinoamericanos hizo en Abril último para la desnuclearización de América Latina, cuya propuesta ha recibido palabras de elogio y estímulo de líderes mundiales.

Según los últimos despachos de prensa, cerca de la tercera parte de las naciones del mundo se han adherido al acuerdo nuclear limitado y, según los comentarios de los científicos, líderes políticos, militares y periodistas que hemos escuchado que no dejan de enfatizar el hecho de que siempre hay que ver con mucha cautela y recelo al Señor Kruschchev, empero hay que tomar en cuenta su tenaz oposición y significativo temor por que tanto los alemanes como los chinos obtengan armas nucleares.

Cuba, Origen Común de los Actos Violentos

El Presidente de Colombia Dice que se Extienden en América

SAN CRISTOBAL, Venezuela. --El Presidente de Colombia, Guillermo Leon Valencia, declaró que la violencia política en Latinoamérica, tiene el denominador común de ser inspirada y organizada desde Cuba.

El mandatario habló en una entrevista de prensa poco antes de poner fin a una visita de 24 horas al Presidente de Venezuela, don Rómulo Betancourt.

Dijo Valencia que espera que el peligro de la subversión comunista llegará a un punto en el que requerirá de una acción defensiva unida de los gobiernos latinoamericanos.

Calificó a la organización venezolana conocida como FALN de grupo criptocomunista.

La FALN realiza la mayor parte de sus actividades en Venezuela, pero recientemente ha operado también en Colombia.

Añadió que el arresto del ex dictador Gustavo Rojas Pinilla y de sus cómplices, como consecuencia de una conjura descubierta ayer, es una "retención y no una detención".

Explicó que la diferencia está en que la retención es sólo una medida preventiva, en tanto que la detención lo es por un delito ya cometido.

Negó que la conjura fuera grave e indicó que las fuerzas armadas han repudiado a Rojas Pinilla. Elogió la política de Betancourt de negarse a reconocer a los gobiernos militares que asumen el poder por la fuerza, y dijo que eso es una contribución a la democracia en Latinoamérica.

Aclaró que Colombia no ha podido seguir tal política, porque a veces la opinión del Presidente no ha conseguido superar consideraciones técnicas y económicas.

Indicó Valencia que el Mercado Común es un gran ideal y esperanza para el Continente, pero no fácil de lograr. Dijo que Colombia y otros países tienen industrias que crecen sobre la base de tarifas proteccionistas y que los negociadores tendrán que garantizar precios de competencia para los productos de cada país ante el Mercado Común.

Calificó a la Alianza Para el Progreso de "uno de los más grandes y más nobles documentos en la historia reciente". Dijo que "es o una injusticia o una incompreensión atacar a la Alianza".

HONDURAS SE ADHIERE AL TRATADO ANTINUCLEAR LIMITADO

Pobre fin de la que fue Musa de Rubén Darío

En un segundo comunicado el Canciller hondureño ROBERTO PERDOMO PAREDES promete continuar el apoyo moral de Honduras a Guatemala en la disputa de Guatemala con la Gran Bretaña sobre la Colonia Británica de Belize. La Gran Bretaña ha ignorado la reclamación de que el territorio de Belize pertenece a Guatemala y como hace mas de un siglo ha estado bajo el dominio de Gran Bretaña, esta tiene la intención de concederle su independencia, en un futuro cercano.

MADRID, agosto. (A.F.P.)—Los restos de Francisca Sánchez, compañera y musa del gran poeta Rubén Darío, recibieron sepultura ayer en el cementerio marplatense de la Almudena. La dama murió el martes pasado en Madrid, en una humilde sala del hospital de San Juan de Dios, a los 88 años de edad.

Hace dos meses, la musa de Darío, que llevaba una pobre ancianidad en la capital de España y que había donado al Estado español todo el archivo del gran poeta iberoamericano, recibió un regalo de 500 dólares (6,250 pesos) enviado por el Presidente de Nicaragua. Tuvo un hijo durante sus 16 años de matrimonio con Darío, pero este hijo murió en Managua.

Bolivia Luchará por Tener Salida al mar

"Bolivia no renunciará a su salida al Pacífico por el hecho de que Argentina le haya prometido un puerto libre en su territorio", afirmó hoy el embajador boliviano en Lima, Alvaro Pérez del Castillo.
